*Fixed Light at San Francisco River.*

INFORMATION has been received at this Office, that since the 1st day of February, 1867, a light has been established from a lighthouse at the mouth of the River San Francisco, near Maceio.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 69 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles.

The lighthouse is built on the northern point of the river, and its position, as given, is in lat. 10° 27' S., and long. 36° 21½' West of Greenwich.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 16.)—JAVA ISLAND.

*Fixed Light at Entrance of River Pekalongan.*

THE Netherlands Government has given notice, that since the 27th day of September, 1866, a light has been exhibited from a lighthouse erected at the entrance of the River Pekalongan, on the north coast of Java.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 26 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

The light is placed at the west entrance of the river, and its approximate position is in lat.
