THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Bucharest the translation, as follows, of a communication received by him from the Prefect of Police, regarding the Passport system in Wallachia:-

### Bucharest, April 20, 1867 (o.s.)

Monsieur le Consul-General,

THE Minister of the Interior, by his note No. 8211, has communicated to the undersigned the decision which the Council of Ministers took at its sitting of the 14th instant, with respect to the re-establishment of all the former regulations concerning the visa of passports, which had been previously suppressed by a decision of the Council of Ministers on the 22nd March, 1866; and the Minister at the same time orders that measures be taken to execute the formalities connected with passports and patents of protection in the capital, with the only exception that the passports of French subjects will be countersigned without the payment of the tax.

The undersigned having, in consequence, issued orders to the Captains at the gates of the city, and to the Commissaries of Police, has the honour to communicate the above-named decision of the Government to the Honourable Consulate-General, requesting that it may be made known to those under its jurisdiction, in order that they may con-

form to the regulations.
