**T**HE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland having been transmitted by the Right Honourable George, Earl of Haddington, Her Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:—

*May it please your Majesty,*

THE gracious letter of your Majesty to the Moderator, Ministers, and Elders of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, on this the recurrence of its Annual Meeting, has been received by us with the strongest feelings of gratitude and respect.

The assurance of your Majesty's desire to uphold the Church of Scotland in all its rights and privileges, connected, as that assurance is, with the expression of your Majesty's deep interest in the peace and welfare of your Majesty's subjects in that part of your dominions, cannot be otherwise than in the highest degree gratifying to us.

In reliance on the guidance and blessing of Almighty God, it shall be our earnest endeavour to conduct all our deliberations so as to promote the important interests intrusted to our care, and to continue to deserve the gratifying testimony to the wisdom and moderation of former Assemblies which your Majesty has been graciously pleased to afford.

The appointment of the Right Honourable the Earl of Haddington as representative of the person of your Majesty in this Assembly, is one entirely satisfactory to the Assembly both from the personal character of that nobleman, and from the claims of many of his distinguished ancestors to the attachments of the Church for services rendered to her, and sufferings endured for her sake.

Your Majesty's gift of two thousand pounds for promoting the spiritual benefit of the inhabitants of the Highlands and Islands of Scotland we receive with heartfelt gratitude, and it shall be our anxious endeavour to expend it in the way best fitted to promote the important objects for which it is bestowed.

That the favour of the Lord Almighty, the God and Father of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, may encompass your Majesty as with a shield, that He may bless abundantly the Prince and Princess of Wales, and all the members of the Royal Family, that your Majesty may be comforted and blessed abundantly in your children, and children's children, and that, after a long and honoured reign your Majesty may receive the crown of life that fadeth not away, is the sincere prayer of,

*May it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most loyal, and most obedient subjects, the Ministers and Elders met in the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.*

The Queen has been pleased to appoint Viscount Monck to be Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada, on and after the first day of July, 1867, under the provisions of the Act 30 of Victoria, cap. 3, for the Union of Canada, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick, and the Government thereof, and for purposes connected therewith.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to grant and alter certain duties of customs and inland revenue, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to amend an Act of the twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth years of Her present Majesty,

chapter sixty-one, for providing a further sum towards defraying the expenses of constructing fortifications for the protection of the Royal Arsenal and Dockyards and the ports of Dover and Portland, and of creating a central arsenal.

An Act to provide for the conversion of twenty-four million pounds sterling of the national debt into terminable annuities.

An Act to further continue the Act of the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one, intituled "An Act to empower the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland to apprehend and detain for a limited time such persons as he or they shall suspect of conspiring against Her Majesty's Person and Government."

An Act to amend the Petty Sessions Act (Ireland), 1851, as to the backing of warrants.

An Act to authorize the inclosure of certain lands in pursuance of a report of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under "The Local Government Act, 1858," relating to the districts of Gainsborough, Farsley, Bideford, Canterbury, Chepping Wycombe, Worthing, and Wednesfield; and for other purposes relative to certain districts under that Act.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under "The Land Drainage Act, 1861."

An Act for better supplying with water the parish of Paignton, in the county of Devon.

An Act for the union of the prisons of the county of Worcester and of the city and county of the city of Worcester; and for other purposes.

An Act for authorising the South Shields Gas Company to extend their works and increase their capital; and for other purposes.
