WHEREAS by an Order bearing date the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, reciting certain provisions of the Act passed in the Session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," duly continued by subsequent Acts, and that the same had been amended and explained by an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter fifteen intituled "An Act to amend the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and seven, to prevent the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and the prevalence of a contagious or infectious disorder known as Variola Ovina, or Sheep Pox, among sheep in some parts of England, which had recently spread therein by sheep imported from Belgium, and that divers Orders had been made by the Lords of the Council from time to time in relation to Variola Ovina or Sheep Pox, it was ordered that all sheep brought to Great Britain from Antwerp, or any other port in Belgium, and landed in any town or place in Great Britain, should, within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, be taken to some market held with the licence of the Privy Council for the sale of animals intended for immediate slaughter, if there should be any such market within such town or place, and if a market should be held there, within the said period of four days; but if there should be no such market within such town or place, or if no market should be held there within the said period of four days, then all such sheep should be slaughtered in such town or place within the said period of four days:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order should be rescinded:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do hereby order, that from and after this twelfth day of this present month of June the said Order shall be revoked and rescinded, and become null and of no effect:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to an act commenced under the said Order and not yet completed, nor to any offence committed in contravention thereof and not yet punished.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Königsberg, reporting that the harbour dues for all vessels visiting the port of Pillau are reduced to four silbergroschen per last for all ships entering, and four silbergroschen per last for all ships departing from Pillau with cargoes, and to two silbergroschen per last in and out for all ships in ballast, from 15th May last; and one half of these rates for regular traders.

Likewise the Königsberg town dues, such as stream and bulwark money, River Pregel Mouth money, and bridge money, are reduced to half of the former rates from 15th of May of this year.

Should not these particulars furnished by the applicant agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore, it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 14th day of June, 1867.
