PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at a Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, reciting certain provisions of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, which has been continued by divers Acts, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, and the appearance and prevalence of a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated the "Cattle Plague," amongst cattle in England and Wales, and sundry other matters, the said Lords did in exercise of the powers given by the said Act so continued as aforesaid, make divers rules and regulations to prevent the spreading of the said disorder, which disorder still continues to prevail in certain parts of England:

And whereas provisions are contained in the said Order of the Privy Council to regulate the movement of cattle on any highway, and such movement without a licence as therein described is prohibited, except for a distance not exceeding five hundred yards, from one part of the same farm to the other:

And whereas the holding of markets for the sale of cattle is prohibited by the said Order until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, except in the case of a market held with the licence of the Privy Council for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter, which term hath, by an Order of the said Council, been extended from the said first day of June until the said Lords of the Council shall otherwise direct:

And whereas there is a market held in a place known as the Cattle Fair Ground, situate in the Denby Dale Road, in the parish of Wakefield, in the borough of Wakefield, in the West Riding of the county of York, for the sale of cattle, and the holding thereof has been licensed by the Lords of the said Council, by instrument bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, for the sale of cattle intended for immediate slaughter, so long as the said above-mentioned Orders shall remain in force, or until the revocation of the said licence, as therein provided, subject to all the conditions, provisions, and regulations in the said first-mentioned Order contained applicable to such market:

And whereas it is provided by the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, that in the case of cattle brought to any market other than the Metropolitan Cattle Market, they shall in no case be taken beyond such limits as may be described in the licence of the Privy Council allowing such market, and under such conditions with respect to their movement within such limits as may be imposed by such licence:

And whereas in the said licence for the holding of the above-mentioned market, it is provided that no cattle brought into the said market shall be taken alive beyond the municipal limits of the

said borough, and further, that no market shall be held for the sale of sheep, lambs, goats, or swine, within the said limits, except for the purpose of slaughter, and all sheep, lambs, goats, or swine, brought into any market within such limits for sale, shall be slaughtered within such limits within four days after their exposure in the market:

And whereas it is expedient that certain other regulations should be made in this behalf:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order, that notwithstanding such provisions in the said licence, and all similar provisions in the said Order, cattle sold in the said market until the thirty-first day of July next, if the said licence shall so long continue in force, may be moved to any slaughter-house within twenty miles of the said market in the boroughs of Doncaster and Dewsbury, in the parishes of Batley, Bingley, Otley, Penistone, and Selby, in the township of Bramley, and in the chapelry of Holmfirth, all in the West Riding aforesaid, to be there slaughtered under such regulations as the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York shall, from time to time, make and issue in regard to the movement, as well as the places, times, and manner of slaughtering of such cattle:

Every such regulation shall be published by the Local Authority making it in some newspaper circulating in the borough of Wakefield, and by a notice affixed in some conspicuous place in the said market.

Provided, that if any cattle shall be moved for a distance exceeding five miles in a direct line from such market, the cattle shall be moved by railway only from the market to their ultimate destination, or to within one mile thereof; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall allow the cattle to be kept alive for more than six days after exposure in the said market, nor to be moved for a distance exceeding twenty miles from the said market.

This Order shall be construed in like manner as the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and every person who shall contravene it, or any regulation of the Local Authority made under it, shall be guilty of an offence, and be subject to the like penalty as in the case of a contravention of any regulation in the said mentioned Order:

And the Lords of the said Council hereby further direct that the Local Authority of the borough of Wakefield, shall cause this Order to be published in some newspaper circulating in the said borough.

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order, that notwithstanding such provisions in the said licence, and all similar provisions in the said Order, cattle sold in the said market until the thirty-first day of July next, if the said

licence shall so long continue in force, may be moved to any slaughter-house in the borough of Doncaster, in the parishes of Mexbrough, Penistone, Rawmarsh, and Wath-upon-Dearne, and in the townships of Barnsley and Greasborough, all in the West Riding aforesaid, to be there slaughtered under such regulations as the Local Authority for the West Riding of the county of York shall, from time to time, make and issue in regard to the movement, as well as the places, times, and manner of slaughtering of such cattle.

Every such regulation shall be published by the Local Authority making it in some newspaper circulating in the said Riding, and by a notice affixed in some conspicuous place in the said market.

Provided, that if any cattle shall be moved for a distance exceeding five miles in a direct line from such market, the cattle shall be moved by railway only from the market to their ultimate destination, or to within one mile thereof; and provided also, that nothing herein contained shall allow the cattle to be kept alive for more than six days after exposure in the said market.

This Order shall be construed in like manner as the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and every person who shall contravene it, or any regulation of the Local Authority made under it, shall be guilty of an offence, and be subject to the like penalty as in the case of a contravention of any regulation in the said mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the date at which the provisions of such Order were to come

into operation should be postponed until the twenty-fifth day of June instant:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the aforesaid Order of the twenty-seventh day of May, shall come into operation and be in force from and after the twenty-fifth day of June instant.
