AT the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 28th day of June, 1867.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and other animals," and from time to time continued until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the session of the twenty-eighth and twenty ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and nineteen, it is (amongst other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places

as they might designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," has lately appeared and now prevails amongst cattle in England, and has also prevailed among sheep in many parts of England:

And whereas divers Orders have been made by the Lords of the said Council in relation to the Cattle Plague, which were consolidated and amended by an Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, which Order has been altered and extended by subsequent Orders:

And whereas by the said Order of the Privy Council, it was ordered that no market, fair, auction, exhibition, or sale of cattle should be held until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, subject to exception as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six is mentioned; and whereas such exception was made in respect of markets licensed according to the provisions therein contained: and by the said Order the said Lords did, in exercise of the powers given by the said Act so continued as aforesaid, make divers rules and regulations, and did, among other things, order, that until the said first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in England should be marked, by clipping the hair off the end of the tail; and that no such cattle should be removed alive from such town or place, except by sea, and that the town or place in such regulation mentioned should, according to circumstances, be the area of any borough or such other limits as might be defined by the Privy Council in respect of such borough:

And whereas such Order hath, by a subsequent Order bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, been

amended and continued until the Lords of the said Council should thereafter otherwise order :

And whereas by another Order of the said Council, bearing date the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the holding of markets with the licence of the Lords of the said Council, for the sale of animals, otherwise than for immediate slaughter, at any port or other place in England or Wales into which animals may be imported from any country not part of the United Kingdom was authorized: but it was provided that in ports or places in which licences to hold such markets as aforesaid should be granted, no cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, except the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, should be landed, except at some part of such port or place to be defined in some Order or Orders of the Lords of the Council, nor until some such Order or Orders shall have been so made, and that they should not be moved from such part of such port or place, except to the nearest shed or slaughter-house in such port or place, which should have been duly licensed by the Lords of Her Majesty's Council for the reception or slaughter of foreign cattle, and it was ordered that they should be there slaughtered within four days from the day of landing, both days inclusive :

And whereas it is expedient that provisions should be made to enable sales of animals intended for immediate slaughter to take place from time to time within the part of any port or place so defined as aforesaid, under such restrictions as the said Lords of the Council shall deem requisite :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby order, that from and after the twenty-ninth day of June instant, the Lords of the said Council may, upon application from the Local Authority of the district in which the part of such port or place so defined as aforesaid is situate, license the holding of any sale or sales of animals intended for immediate slaughter at any place or places within such defined part, during such time and under such restrictions or conditions as to the said Council shall seem expedient or necessary: and thenceforth animals may be sold for immediate slaughter at such place or places, anything in the Orders of the said Council to the contrary notwithstanding.

The said Lords do further order, that animals exposed for sale at any such sale shall be slaughtered within six days from the date of the holding of such sale (if sold) by or by the order of the purchaser, or (if not sold) by or by the order of the owner, importer, or consignee, and such animals shall in no instance be kept alive beyond that time or be taken alive out of the part of such port or place so defined as aforesaid, and within which such sale shall have been so licensed to be held :

The words herein contained shall be construed as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and all the provisions therein contained relative to the offences for the contravention thereof, and the penalty for the same, and the provisions of the said Order in regard to the powers of officers employed under that Order and all other provisions of that Order, and the subsequent Orders altering the same now in force and not inconsistent with anything herein contained, shall, in respect of every matter to which they may be applicable, apply to the regulations contained in this Order and the enforcing of the same.

**W**HEREAS by an Order of the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, reciting certain provisions of the Act of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, which has been continued by divers Acts, and lastly by an Act of the last session of Parliament, until the first day of August next, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, and the appearance and prevalence of a contagious and infectious disorder, generally designated the "Cattle Plague," amongst cattle in England and Wales, and sundry other matters, the said Lords did, in exercise of the powers given by the said Act so continued as aforesaid, make divers rules and regulations, and did, among other things, order that until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in England should be marked, by clipping the hair off the end of the tail; and that no such cattle should be removed alive from such town or place, except by sea, and that town or place in such regulation should, according to circumstances, be the area of any borough or such other limits as may be defined by the Privy Council in respect of such borough :

And whereas such Order hath, by a subsequent Order, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, been continued and amended until the Lords of the said Council should thereafter otherwise order :

And whereas cattle are brought by sea from places out of the United Kingdom into the borough of Liverpool, in the county of Lancaster, but it is expedient that certain limits should be prescribed within the said borough, into which such cattle may be brought :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby define the limits of the said borough into and within which cattle may be brought by sea from places out of the United Kingdom as follows; that is to say :—

All that space within the said borough which is bounded by the following line, namely, a line commencing on the north at the west end of that part of the dock properly called Battery-street, proceeding eastwards along the north side of the said street, the north sides of Bankfield-street and Bankhall-street, to the west side of the Southport Railway, thence northwards along the said railway to the point at which it crosses the borough boundary, thence eastwards along the borough boundary to the east side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence westwards along the east side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the junction of its dock branch, thence along the east and south sides of the said dock branch railway, to the west side of Regent-road, and

thence northwards along the west side of Regent-road to Bankfield-street. Also all that space within the limits of the estate of the Mersey Docks and Harbour Board comprising the Huskisson Dock and its quays, the Huskisson branch dock and its quays, the Sandon Basin, and the pier heads between the Sandon Basin and the Canada Dock, and the bridges between the pier head and Battery-street aforesaid, and all the gates or outlets between the dock property and Regent-road, within the above-described limits:

All cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom, so landed at the port of Liverpool, in the said borough, shall be slaughtered within such limits and not elsewhere; and no cattle brought within such limits shall be removed therefrom alive:

And the said Lords do further order, that all the regulations of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, now in force, and not inconsistent herewith, shall apply to this Order; and any contravention of any provision herein contained shall be deemed to be an offence within the operation of the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and be punishable as therein provided:

And further, that the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the said borough of Liverpool shall publish this Order by causing a copy thereof to be advertised in some newspaper circulating in the said borough, and by causing a copy thereof to be affixed in some conspicuous place of the port aforesaid.

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order of the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, should be rescinded:

Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Council do hereby order that from and after this twenty-eighth day of this present month of June, the said Order of the nineteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, shall be revoked and rescinded, and become null and of no effect:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to an act commenced under the said Order and not yet completed, nor to any offence committed in contravention thereof and not yet punished.

**L**ORD STANLEY, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Sir Harry Parkes, K.C.B., Her Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Japan, the following Notification respecting the opening of the cities of Yedo and Osaka, the port of Hiogo, and another port on the west coast of Japan:—

#### NOTIFICATION.

THE undersigned, Her Britannic Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Japan, hereby makes known, for the information of Her Majesty's subjects, that he has received formal notice from the Japanese Government that they are fully prepared to open to British subjects on the first day of January next, in the manner stipulated in the 3rd Article of the Treaty of Yedo, the cities of Yedo and Osaka, the port of Hiogo, and another port on the west coast of Japan. Arrangements are consequently in progress for determining the places which may be occupied by British subjects at the said cities and ports for purposes of residence and trade, and due notice will be given as soon as these and other necessary arrangements for the execution of the provisions of the said treaty, in respect to the said cities and ports, shall be completed.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Athens two notes from the Greek Minister for Foreign Affairs, of which the following are translations:—

(Translation.)

SIR, *Athens, June 24, 1867.*  
I HAVE the honour to inform you that vessels arriving from Manfredonia, Barletta, Molfetta, and Bari (continental Italy), as well as those arriving from Liguria, Palma, Licata, and Girgenti (Sicily), and those arriving from Tunis,

have just been subjected to a quarantine of eleven days, on account of the appearance of cholera in those countries.

I have further the honour to inform you that, for the same reason, ships arriving from Brindisi and Otranto, and from the coast of Italy, from Manfredonia to Ancona, as well as ships arriving from the coasts of Sicily, which are not mentioned above, have been subjected to a quarantine of observation of five days, with the exception of arrivals from Messina, which continue to have free pratique.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the regulation of the duties of postage," power is given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, from time to time, by Warrant under their hands, to alter and fix any of the rates of British postage, payable by law on the transmission by the post of foreign or colonial letters or newspapers, or of any other printed papers, and to subject the same to rates of postage as therein mentioned.

And whereas further powers are given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eleventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act for giving further facilities for the transmission of letters by post, and for the regulating the duties of postage thereon, and for other purposes relating to the Post Office."

And whereas certain powers are also given to the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury by another Act of Parliament, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the stamp duties on newspapers, and to provide for the transmission by post of printed periodical publications."

And whereas it is expedient to reduce the British postage now payable upon certain letters and newspapers transmitted by the post from Brazil, Buenos Ayres, and Monte Video to any port in Portugal, and for that purpose to make certain regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

Now we, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers reserved to us, in and by the said hereinbefore recited Acts, and every of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, under the hands of two of us the said Commissioners (by the authority of the Statute in that case made and provided), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. On every letter not exceeding half an ounce in weight, posted in Brazil, Buenos Ayres, or Monte Video, addressed to any place in Portugal, and transmitted by British packet boat from Brazil, Buenos Ayres, or Monte Video, to any port in Portugal, without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rate of British postage now payable thereon, a rate of British postage of eight pence.

2. Every letter so transmitted as hereinbefore-mentioned, if exceeding half an ounce in weight, shall be subject to the several further and additional and progressive rates of postage hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:

On every such letter, if exceeding half an ounce and not exceeding one ounce in weight, two rates of postage;

And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce and not exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce in weight, three rates of postage;

And on every such letter, if exceeding one ounce and the half of another ounce, and not exceeding two ounces in weight, four rates of postage;

And for every additional half of an ounce in weight of any such letter above the weight of two ounces, there shall be charged and taken one additional rate of postage; and every fractional part of such additional half of an ounce in weight shall be charged as an additional half of an ounce in weight; and each progressive and additional rate, chargeable under this clause, shall be estimated and charged at the sum which any such letter would be charged with under this Warrant, if not exceeding one half of an ounce in weight.

3. Nothing herein contained shall be construed in anywise to annul, prejudice, or affect any of the exemptions and privileges granted by or under the said hereinbefore-recited Acts, or either of them, or by or under any other Acts of Parliament relating to the Post Office.

4. On every packet consisting of a printed newspaper, not exceeding four ounces in weight, posted in Brazil, Buenos Ayres, or Monte Video, addressed to any place in Portugal, and transmitted by British packet boat from Brazil, Buenos Ayres, or Monte Video, to any port in Portugal, without passing through the United Kingdom, there shall be charged and taken, in lieu of any rates of British postage now payable thereon, a rate of British postage of one penny, and on every such packet exceeding four ounces in weight, there shall be charged and taken a rate of British postage of two pence.

5. For the purposes of this Warrant, every printed newspaper transmitted by the post under the provisions of this Warrant, shall be deemed and considered a packet, and shall be charged and chargeable with a rate or rates of postage according to the weight thereof, as hereinbefore mentioned, notwithstanding two or more newspapers shall be inclosed and transmitted in one and the same cover, wrapper, envelope, or bundle, and form only one parcel or bundle of newspapers; and every printed supplement or additional sheet to any newspaper shall, for the purpose of charging the postage under this Warrant, be deemed a distinct newspaper, unless sent in the same cover or together with the newspaper to which it is a supplement or addition.

6. Every packet which shall be transmitted by the post under the 4th clause of this Warrant shall be so transmitted in conformity with and under and subject to the several regulations, orders, directions, and conditions hereinafter contained; that is to say:—

Every such packet shall be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides;

No such packet shall contain any written letter, or any communication in the nature of a letter, closed or open, nor any enclosure sealed or otherwise closed against inspection, nor any communication of the nature of a letter written in or upon any such packet or the cover thereof;

No such packet which in length shall exceed two feet (British), or in breadth or depth one foot (British), shall be forwarded by the post under the provisions of this Warrant, unless under the special authority of the Postmaster-General;

There shall be no word or communication printed on any newspaper after the publication thereof, or upon any cover thereof, nor any writing or marks upon any such newspaper, or upon any cover thereof, other than and except the name and address of the person to whom the same is sent; but the name or title of such newspaper, and the name and address of the publisher, news-vendor, or agent by whom the same is sent, may be printed on the cover thereof;

There shall be no paper or thing enclosed in or with any newspaper.

7. If any packet be posted or be transmitted by the post under this Warrant, which shall be otherwise than in conformity with the conditions and regulations hereinbefore established in relation thereto, the same shall and may be detained and opened, and shall be returned or given up to the sender thereof.

8. The term "weight," used in this Warrant, shall mean British weight; and the several other terms and expressions used in this Warrant shall be construed to have the like meaning in all respects as they would have had if inserted in the said Act passed in the fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty.

9. The Commissioners for the time being of Her Majesty's Treasury may, by Warrant under their hands, or the hands of any two of them, at any time hereafter, alter, repeal, or revoke any of the rates of postage hereby fixed or altered, or any of the orders, directions, regulations, and conditions hereby made, and may make and establish any new or other rates, orders, directions, regulations, and conditions in lieu thereof, and from time to time appoint at what time the rates which may be payable are to be paid.

10. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.
