WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of the eleventh and twelfth years of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter one hundred and seven, intituled "An Act to prevent until the "first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, and to the end of the then session "of Parliament, the spreading of contagious or "infectious disorders among sheep, cattle, and "other animals," and from time to time continued until the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the end of the then next session of Parliament, by divers subsequent Acts, and lastly by an Act passed in the session of the twenty-eighth and twenty ninth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, chapter one hundred and nineteen, it is (amongst other things) enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, from time to time to make such Orders and Regulations as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the removal to or from such parts or places

as they might designate in such Order or Orders, of sheep, cattle, horses, swine, or other animals, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate infection, and to make any other Orders or Regulations for the purpose of giving effect to the provisions of the said Act, and again to revoke, alter, or vary any such Orders or Regulations; and that all provisions for any of the purposes aforesaid in any such Order or Orders contained shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the said Act:

And whereas a contagious or infectious disorder, generally designated as the "Cattle Plague," has lately appeared and now prevails amongst cattle in England, and has also prevailed among sheep in many parts of England:

And whereas divers Orders have been made by the Lords of the said Council in relation to the Cattle Plague, which were consolidated and amended by an Order bearing date the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, which Order has been altered and extended by subsequent Orders:

And whereas by the said Order of the Privy Council, it was ordered that no market, fair, auction, exhibition, or sale of cattle should be held until the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, subject to exception as in the said Order of the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six is mentioned; and whereas such exception was made in respect of markets licensed according to the provisions therein contained: and by the said Order the said Lords did, in exercise of the powers given by the said Act so continued as aforesaid, make divers rules and regulations, and did, among other things, order, that until the said first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, all cattle brought by sea from any place out of the United Kingdom into any town or place in England should be marked, by clipping the hair off the end of the tail; and that no such cattle should be removed alive from such town or place, except by sea, and that the town or place in such regulation mentioned should, according to circumstances, be the area of any borough or such other limits as might be defined by the Privy Council in respect of such borough:

And whereas such Order hath, by a subsequent Order bearing date the twenty-sixth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, been
