

His Imperial Majesty was, in like manner, invested with the Collar ; Garter then delivered to the Marquess of Bath the Hat and Feathers, which were presented by His Lordship to the Emperor, and His Lordship immediately after delivered the Star of the Order to His Imperial Majesty.

The ceremony of the Investiture being completed, the Plenipotentiaries, with their respective Suites, making their reverences, withdrew from the Imperial presence.

In the afternoon a splendid Banquet was given by His Imperial Majesty, at Schönbrunn Palace, at which the Plenipotentiaries and their Suites, the Ministers of State, the Grand Officers of the Court, as also Lord Bloomfield, G.C.B., Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Court of Vienna, and the Secretaries of the Embassy. His Imperial Majesty appeared wearing the Star of the Order.

In a circle, after the Banquet, the Plenipotentiaries and their Suites took leave of His Imperial Majesty.
