WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the vicarage of Potter Heigham, in the county of Norfolk, and in the diocese of Norwich, one capital sum of one hundred and twenty-one pounds nineteen shillings and five pence, such capital sum to be applied by us in discharging the amount payable to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation and maintenance of the poor clergy, under a subsisting mortgage of the said vicarage of Potter Heigham, which was effected by a deed, bearing date the ninth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, for the purpose of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said vicarage of Potter Heigham.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction of two hundred and fifty pounds sterling, which we have received in favour of the perpetual curacy of Saint Paul, Silloth, otherwise Causeway Head, in the county of Cumberland, and in the diocese of Carlisle, in respect whereof we have agreed to pay to the incumbent of the same benefice, and to his successors a yearly sum of eight pounds six shillings and eight pence; and in consideration of a further benefaction of certain tithe commutation rent charges, amounting to fifty-six pounds six shillings and eleven pence, which has been permanently secured to the said perpetual curacy, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Saint Paul, Silloth, otherwise Causeway Head, and to his successors, to meet such benefactions, one yearly sum or stipend of fifty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the yearly sum or stipend so payable out of our common fund as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
