Board of Trade, Whitehall, September 4, 1867.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Spanish Royal Decree, dated the 22nd August, authorizing the importation of foreign wheat and flour into the ports of Spain from Santa Cruz to the mouths of the Guadiana, and also into the Balearic Islands for a period of four months, at the following rates of duty:—

For every hectolitre of wheat imported in Spanish bottoms 50 milerimos; and for the same quantity imported in foreign bottoms 400 milerimos; and

For every 100 kilogrammes or metrical quintal of flour imported in Spanish bottoms 100 milerimos; and for the same quantity imported in foreign bottoms 800 milerimos.
