AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of October, 1867.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS one of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's vessels, called the "Tasmanian," has lately arrived, from the West Indies, in the Southampton Water, in the county of Hants, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the West Indies, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel, and attacked several persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas several persons who were on board the "Tasmanian," on her arrival, being all the persons on board the said ship who were known to be or suspected of being affected by the said disease, have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "Menelaus," lying at the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order,—

1. That the said vessel, called the "Tasmanian," shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid, until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "Tasmanian," not ordered to be removed to the "Menelaus," shall be removed to the ship called the "Parana," or the ship called the "Æolus," unless ordered to remain on board the "Tasmanian," by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine, at Southampton.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "Menelaus" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "Parana," or the "Æolus," and who shall have been on board the "Tasmanian," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "Parana," or the "Æolus," until the said

Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, and The Metropolitan Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the parts of the Port of London within which foreign cattle may be landed, as:—

- (1.) Thames Haven, which is hereinafter referred to as landing-place No. (1.) and for this purpose shall be defined to be as follows (that is to say):—

All that space in the parish of Fobbing, in the county of Essex, the property of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company, at the Thames Haven station of that Company, lying between the River Thames and a line commencing at a point on the River Thames at the south-western corner of the property of the said Railway Company, near the Thames Haven station, and running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of six hundred and ten yards along the fence or boundary between the

property of the Railway Company and lands of Mr. Samuel Sharp, thence in a north-easterly direction along the eastern side of the carriage-road across the Thames Haven Branch of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway, to the northern fence of the railway, thence in a south-easterly direction along the fence or boundary between the property of the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway Company and lands of Mr. Samuel Sharp, to the River Thames, at a point two hundred and eighty yards to the eastward of the new pier at Thames Haven, which space is coloured green on the plan thereof deposited at the Privy Council Office, copies whereof are deposited at the Offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, and of the Metropolitan Board of Works.

- (2.) The landing-place which is commonly called Odams's Wharf, and which is hereinafter referred to as landing-place No. (2.) and for this purpose shall be defined to be as follows (that is to say):—

All that space on the Plaistow Marshes, near the Victoria Docks, in the parish of West Ham and county of Essex, bounded on the north-eastern side, for a distance of two hundred yards or thereabouts, by the old line of tramway or railway from London to North Woolwich, on the south-western side, for a distance of two hundred yards or thereabouts, by the River Thames, on the north-western side by premises used as a sugar bakery, in the occupation of Mr. James Duncan, and on the south-eastern side by the wall forming the north-western boundary of the premises in the occupation of the London Wharfing and Warehousing Company, which space is coloured pink on the plan thereof deposited at the Privy Council Office, copies whereof are deposited at the Offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, and of the Metropolitan Board of Works.

- (3.) The Victoria Docks, which is hereinafter referred to as landing-place No. (3.) and for this purpose shall be defined to be as follows (that is to say):—

All that space situated at the Victoria Docks, in the parish of West Ham, in the county of Essex, bounded on a portion of its south-western side by the River Thames, and on all other sides and parts by a line commencing on the River Thames at the North-west Pier of the Entrance Lock of the Victoria Docks, and running in an easterly and northerly direction along the boundary fence of the Victoria Docks, to the extreme north-western corner of the Dock property, near the Tidal Basin Station of the North Woolwich Railway, thence eastwards for a distance of three hundred and seven yards along a continuation of the said boundary fence, to the north-western corner of the Tobacco Warehouse, thence in a southerly direction by a straight line along the western wall of the Tobacco Warehouse, and along the eastern wall of the Tidal Basin, and by a continuation of the same straight line to the fence forming the southern boundary of the Dock premises, thence in a westerly direction along the last-mentioned fence to

the River Thames, at the South-east Pier of the Entrance Lock of the Victoria Docks, which space is coloured green on the plan thereof deposited at the Privy Council Office, copies whereof are deposited at the Offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Essex, and of the Metropolitan Board of Works.

And the Lords of the Council do hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. The cattle landed at the landing-place No. (1.), when removed therefrom, shall be removed by the following route, namely:

By the London, Tilbury, and Southend Railway to Forest Gate, near Stratford, thence by the Great Eastern Railway to the Metropolis;

And the cattle landed at the landing-place No. (2.), when removed therefrom, shall be removed by the following route, namely:

Along a siding of the North Woolwich Railway, which is part of the Great Eastern Railway, to the Barking-road Station, thence by the Great Eastern Railway to the Metropolis;

And the cattle landed at the landing-place No. (3.), when removed therefrom, shall be removed by the following route, namely:

Along sidings running direct on to the North Woolwich Railway, which is part of the Great Eastern Railway, to the Barking-road Station, thence by the Great Eastern Railway to the Metropolis;

2. All foreign cattle so conveyed by railway, shall be brought along the said railways without stopping, and shall be discharged, from the trucks in which they have been conveyed, at a station or place within one thousand yards of the Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, and shall be driven immediately, upon being so discharged, to such market, or to the lairs belonging thereto, or to such other lairs as may be licensed by the Privy Council for the reception of such cattle.

3. All cattle within the limits of the several landing-places before-mentioned, shall be deemed to be foreign cattle, and shall be in all respects subject to the provisions of this Order in relation thereto.

4. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and all regulations relative to the landing of foreign cattle within the Port of London in force at the date of this Order shall remain in force until this Order takes effect.

WHEREAS the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council did, by a licence bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, license

the Port of Southampton, in the town and county of the town of Southampton, for the landing of foreign cattle under the provisions of Her Majesty's Order in Council, dated at Windsor the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and did also by a licence, likewise bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, license certain pens and sheds belonging to the Southampton Dock Company, situated at the said port, for the reception of such cattle, in conformity with the terms of the said Order :

And whereas the Lords of Her Majesty's Privy Council did, by an Order also bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, make and prescribe certain regulations with respect to the time and place at and to which, and the conditions upon which, foreign cattle landed under the provisions of the said Order in Council of the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, might be removed from such pens and sheds :

And whereas it is now deemed expedient that the two licences before mentioned, and the said Order of Council bearing date the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, should be revoked :

Now, therefore, the Lords of the Council do hereby revoke the said licences and the said Order of Council of the twenty-third day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, provided that nothing herein contained shall affect any act depending upon the said licences and Order commenced and not now concluded or the prosecution of any offence against the said Order not now punished.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the parts of the Port of Southampton, in the town and county of that name, within which foreign cattle may be landed, as follows, that is to say :—

- (1.) All that space in the borough of Southampton, on the property of the Southampton Dock Company, lying between the River Itchen and a line commencing at a point on the said river at the north-eastern corner of the property of the said Dock Company, and running in a westerly and south-westerly direction along the boundary of the Dock Company's property to the north-western corner of the Dock Company's emigration dépôt, thence along the western side of the buildings of the emigration dépôt, to the western corner of those buildings, thence in a straight line due south to the wall of the open dock at a point twenty yards to the east of the eastern corner of the building

called the Export Warehouse, thence eastward along the northern wall, and southward along the eastern wall, of the open dock to the dock entrance, thence along the northern wall of the dock entrance to the said River Itchen, all which space is coloured purple on the plan of Southampton Docks, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Southampton ; which said part of the said port is hereinafter referred to as No. (1.)

- (2.) All that space on the property of the Southampton Dock Company, lying between the dock wall forming the southern side of the close dock, and a line commencing at the south-eastern corner of the close dock, and running southward in continuation of the eastern wall of the close dock for a distance of seventy-two yards, thence in a westerly direction along the northern side of, and five yards from, the centre of the line of railway which connects the Dock Company's coal sheds with the coal store, and passing thirty-three yards to the south-west of the south-western corner of the licensed shed to the said dock wall at the south-western corner of the close dock, all which space is coloured yellow upon the said plan and copy deposited as aforesaid ; which said part of the said port is hereinafter referred to as No. (2.)

And prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the defined part of the port No. (1.) shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part No. (1.) shall not be removed therefrom alive.

3. All foreign cattle landed within the defined part of the said port No. (2.) shall be landed in strict conformity with such regulations as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs with the sanction of the Lords of the Council from time to time prescribe for that purpose, and be placed in pens, sheds, or other receptacles properly prepared for their reception by the consignees or other persons, and approved for that purpose by the said Commissioners, and shall be kept therein at the sole expense of the owner or consignee, subject to the supervision and control of the said Commissioners, and in accordance with any regulations made by them, for such period not exceeding twenty-eight days, as may be from time to time prescribed by the Lords of the Council, in respect of the country or place from which any such cattle may be imported, and if any such cattle have been so landed and kept as aforesaid, then the same may be moved to any place out of the limits of the last-mentioned defined part of the said port with the licences required, and in the manner prescribed by The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, or any other Order of the Lords of the Council, under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts ; provided always that no licence shall be granted for the

removal of any such cattle from beyond those limits, except upon production to the person granting such licence of a certificate of an Officer of Customs at the said port, certifying that they are then healthy and free from the Cattle Plague.

4. All cattle within the said defined part of the port No. (2.) shall be subject to the same regulations as foreign cattle landed within such part of the port, and shall not be removed out of the same except after undergoing quarantine in the same manner, and upon production of a certificate of the same description, as is hereinbefore prescribed with respect to foreign cattle.

All that space in the town of Cowes, in the Isle of Wight, lying between the River Medina and a line drawn from the said river in a south-westerly direction along the north-western boundary of the Medina Brewery and across the road or street to the north-western corner of the public-house, called the Duke of York, in York-street, thence in a southerly direction two hundred feet along the eastern side of York-street, thence eastward in a straight line to the said River Medina at the most southerly point of the river frontage of the Medina Commercial Tavern Wharf, which space is coloured green on the plan of part of the port of Cowes, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Hampshire ; and do prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

All that space in the parish of Aldrington, in the county of Sussex, bounded on the north by the cliff forming the northern boundary of Wish Wharf, on the south by the Aldrington Basin, on the east by a straight line running due south from the north-east corner of the Adur Hotel to the Aldrington Basin, and on the west by a line running due north from the south-west corner of the North Landing Wharf at Aldrington, to the aforementioned cliff, which space is edged green on the plan of the landing wharf, Aldrington, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Sussex :

Also all that space in the parish of Southwick, in the county of Sussex, bounded on the north by the cliff forming the northern boundary of Nicholson's Wharf, on the south by the east arm of New Shoreham Harbour, on the east by a straight line running due north from the eastern end of the Quay Wall of Nicholson's Wharf to the cliff forming the northern boundary of that wharf, and on the west by a straight line running due north from the western end of the Quay Wall of Nicholson's Wharf to the said cliff, which last mentioned space is coloured green on the plan of part of the parish of Southwick, also deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Sussex ; and do prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

All that space in the town of Penryn lying between the south-western side of the Commercial-road and the Penryn River, from the Budock Creek to the northern end of Gluvias-street; also the space occupied by the lairs in the occupation of Mr. John Gray, and the lairs and slaughter-house in the occupation of Mr. Dawe, adjoining Commercial-road, on the south-western side of that road, between Budock Creek and Gluvias-street; which spaces are coloured pink on the plan of part of the town of Penryn, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Falmouth; and do prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

All that space in the Port of Dover lying between the sea and a line commencing at the North Pier-head, and running in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the North Pier, and along the north-eastern and northern sides of the groyne forming a portion of the eastern side of Dover Harbour, to the north-western point of the said groyne, thence in a westerly direction across the harbour to a point on the cross wall six yards to the north of the north side of the Clock-house, thence continuing westward across the basin to the south-eastern corner of the building lately used as the Royal Ship Hotel, thence continuing westward along the southern end of the said building, and across Strond-street to the western side thereof, thence in a southerly direction along the western side of Strond-street, to its junction with Hawkesbury-street, thence westward along the northern side of Hawkesbury-

street, to its junction with Oxenden-street, thence in a southerly direction across Hawkesbury-street and along the eastern side of Oxenden-street, to its junction with Great-street, thence eastward to the south-western corner of Council House-street, and along the southern side of Council House-street, to its junction with Clarence-place, thence in a south-easterly direction along the western side of Clarence-place, to the north-eastern corner of Beach-street, thence in an easterly direction passing fifteen yards to the north of the north side of the Lord Warden Hotel, to the South Pier-head, all which space is coloured green on the plan of part of the town and port of Dover deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Dover; and do prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

All that space at the West Hartlepool Docks, in the county of Durham, lying between the German Ocean and a line commencing at the sea at a point two hundred yards to the south of the south-western extremity of the No. 3 Graving Dock, and running northward in a straight line for a distance of three hundred and twenty yards to a point fifty yards to the south-east of the south-eastern corner of the Coal Dock, thence westward by a line parallel to the southern wall of the Coal Dock, and thirty yards from it, and by a continuation of the same line westward, passing the northern end of Victoria-terrace to a point at the corner of a building thirty yards south-west of the south-eastern corner of the No. 2 Warehouse, thence in a southerly direction along the eastern side of No. 3 Warehouse, and by a continuation of the same line, to a point twenty-five yards south of the southern end of the No. 3 Warehouse, thence in a westerly direction for a distance of about four hundred and fifty yards along the northern side of

the railway from Hartlepool to West Hartlepool, thence northward along the eastern side of the same railway for a distance of about five hundred yards, thence eastward along the southern side of the said railway to the point where the railway crosses the road from the Gas Works to the north end of the West Harbour, thence continuing in an easterly direction along the southern side of buildings abutting on the said road, to the sea at the northern end of the West Harbour at West Hartlepool, all which space is edged with green on the plan of part of the town of West Hartlepool, deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Durham; and do prescribe as follows:—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

All that space situate in Sandgate, within the borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, lying between the River Tyne and a line drawn due north from a point on the north bank of the River Tyne, at the eastern end of the Rotterdam Wharf, across the north shore to the wall forming the southern boundary of the property of the North-Eastern Railway Company, thence westward along the said boundary wall to the road called "Wide Open," thence northward for a distance of twenty yards along the wall forming the western boundary of the said Railway Company's property, thence eastward for a distance of twenty-five yards along the northern boundary of the property of the said Railway Company, thence in a straight line in a northerly direction, passing the west end of the row of houses near the railway terminus, to the northern side of St. Ann's-street, thence westward along the northern side of St. Ann's-street to the northern end of the Swirle Tenements, thence in a southerly direction in a

straight line along the east side of the Swirle Tenements, and, by a continuation of the same straight line, across the Corporation Warehouses and the Public Quay to the River Tyne, which space is edged brown on the plan of part of the town of Newcastle-upon-Tyne deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne; and do prescribe as follows:—

1.
