Fixed Light at Burriana.

THE Spanish Government has given notice, that from the 30th day of September, 1867, a light will be exhibited on the beach (Garó) of Burriana, in the Gulf of Valencia.

New Rock in Kúrusima Strait.

NOTICE is hereby given, that a rock has been discovered (by H.M.S. "Perseus" striking on it), in the Kúrusima Strait, leading from the Misimi-nada to the Bingo-nada of the inland sea, and, as it lies in the fairway of ships, is of much importance.

The rock, which is named the Perseus Rock, is about 20 feet in circumference, and has only 7 feet on it at low-water springs; it lies E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., a third of a mile from the north point of Kosima, with the following bearings;—

Kosima, north extreme,	W. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.
" south-east extreme,	S.W. by S.
Masima, west extreme,	S. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.
" north extreme,	S.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ S.

Within a circumference of a quarter of a cable from the centre of the rock there are from 5 to 7 fathoms water, and between it and Kosima, no soundings were obtained under 20 fathoms, thus leaving a clear passage of 2 cables width.

Between half ebb and low water the position of this danger is indicated by a strong ripple.
