NEW EAGLEY MILLS AND ESTATE—ORDER DIS-MISSING PETITION FOR SEPARATION FROM THE DISTRICT OF THE ASTLEY BRIDGE LOCAL

And whereas after investigation into the subject matter of the appeals aforesaid, by Arnold

the purpose, and report made by him to me thereon, and after full consideration of such appeals and report, I do, hereby, and under the powers conferred on me by the aforesaid Sanitary Act, 1866, order and direct that the said Appeal under the 49th Section of the Sanitary Act aforesaid be dismissed, and the said Appeal is hereby dismissed accordingly; and I do further order and direct that from and after the date of this present order, the Seaford Special Drainage District recently formed under the provisions of the said Act by the vestry of the parish of Seaford, in the county of Sussex, as the sewer authority for such parish, shall be modified so as to comprise the following boundaries, the references to the plan hereinafter described being to the plan which accompanies Mr. Arnold Taylor's report to me on the subject, bearing date the 27th day of September, 1867, the new district so modified to be styled the town district of Seaford, under the aforesaid Act. The boundary of the said district commences at the point A at the south-west corner of the plan of Seaford parish hereinbefore described (such point A being considered to be fixed at low water mark of lowest spring tides); and extends thence in a north-easterly direction along the boundary line separating the parish of Seaford from the parish of Blatchington, to the point B, thence it passes in a southerly direction along the easterly boundary-fence of the property numbered 41 on the Tithe Map of the parish of Seaford, and along the southerly boundary - fence of the property numbered 40 on such Tithe Map to the point C, thence in a southerly direction along the easterly boundary-fence of the property numbered 65 on such Tithe Map to the point D, thence along the fence separating the properties numbered 65, 64, 155, 146, and 145 from the property numbered 66, all on such Tithe Map, to the point E, thence in a southerly and easterly direction along the fence separating the properties numbered 145 and 135 from the property numbered 67, all on such Tithe Map, to the point F, thence in a southerly direction including the buildings and appurtenances on the properties numbered 133 and 134 on such Tithe Map, and passing along the fence which separates these two last named properties, as well as those numbered 137 and 138 from the property numbered 129, all on such Tithe Map, to the point G, thence in a straight line described southwards to the point H, which is taken to be fixed at low water mark of lowest spring tides, and from thence in a westerly direction along the line of low water mark to the starting point A, so completing the boundary of the proposed Town District of Seaford, which is further indicated by the dark green line on the said plan of the parish of Seaford.

ARTICLE I.—That so much of the said Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled "An Act to prevent the hold-"ing of Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, "and for regulating the appointment of Vestry "Clerks," as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said parish of Rother-field.

ARTICLE II.—That the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said parish shall, unless the Poor Law Board otherwise direct, pay to the officer for the time being appointed to the said office of vestry clerk for the said parish, under the authority of the Statutes in such behalf and this Order, for the performance of the duties of such office, a salary of twenty pounds per annum.

ARTICLE III.—That the salary of such vestry clerk shall be payable up to the day on which he ceases to hold such office, and no longer, and shall be paid by quarterly payments at the several quarters ending at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day, with a proportionate sum to be paid to his executors or administrators, in case he shall die while holding such office.

ARTICLE IV.—That every person appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk in the said parish shall give to the Guardians of the Poor of the Uckfield Union, in the county of Sussex, a bond, in the penal sum of twenty-five pounds, in the names of himself and two sufficient sureties, conditioned for the due and faithful performance of the duties of the office; and every such officer shall give immediate notice to the said Guardians of the death, insolvency, or bankruptcy of either of such sureties, and shall, when required by the said Guardians, produce a certificate, signed by two householders, that his sureties are alive and believed by them to be solvent, and shall supply a fresh surety in the place of any such surety who may die or become bankrupt or insolvent.

Provided that the Guardians may, if they think fit, take the security of any Society or Company expressly authorized by Statute to guarantee or secure the faithful discharge of the duties of any

Poor Law Officer.

ARTICLE V.—That the Auditor of the District comprising the said Union shall, in the statement required by the General Order of the Poor Law Board, dated the fourteenth day of January last, to be transmitted to them, of the securities of the officers of the said Union, include the name of the Vestry Clerk for the time being, appointed under the authority hereof (together with the particulars in the said General Order required), and shall report thereon to the Board of Guardians of the said Union, in like manner as therein set forth with reference to the securities of other officers.
