WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, it was amongst other things enacted "That it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, His heirs and successors, by His or their Order in Council, or for the Lords or others of His or their Privy Council, or any two or more of them, by their Order, from time to time, as often as they might see reason to apprehend that the yellow fever or other highly infectious distemper prevailed on the Continent of America or in the West Indies, to require that every vessel coming from or having touched at any port or place on the Continent of America or in the West Indies, should come to an anchor at certain places to be appointed, from time to time, by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs (who were thereby authorized to make such appointment), for the purpose of having the state of health of the crew of such vessel ascertained before such vessel should be permitted to enter the port whereto she should be bound, or any other port of the United Kingdom; but that such vessel should not be deemed liable to quarantine unless it should be afterwards specially ordered under that restraint:"

And whereas there is reason to apprehend that the yellow fever prevails in the West Indies, and in parts of the Continent of America, and it is expedient to put into operation the above-recited provision of the said Act:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council do hereby order and direct that from and after the twenty-sixth of October instant, every vessel coming from or having touched at any Port or Place lying between longitude 52 and 100 degrees west of Greenwich, and between 4 and 32 degrees north latitude, shall come to an anchor at such place

or places as may from time to time be appointed by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, for the purpose of having the state of the health of the crew of such vessel ascertained before such vessel shall be permitted to enter the port whereto she shall be bound, or any other port of the United Kingdom, and shall remain at such place or places until the state of health of such crew shall have been ascertained, pursuant to the said recited provision, and thereafter to be subject to such lawful direction as may be made in that behalf by or under the direction of the said Lords.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS no case of Cattle Plague has been reported to the Privy Council as having occurred in Great Britain beyond the limits of the Metropolis since the twenty-fourth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven:

Now, therefore, the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and

words in this Order shall be construed as words in The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867.

2. Article twenty-five of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, shall be read and have effect as if the following words were omitted therefrom, namely:—"if the cattle are not affected with Cattle Plague, and have been on those premises in possession of the owner or occupier thereof not less than twenty-eight days immediately before the sale."

3. Articles twenty-seven to thirty-seven, inclusive, and Article thirty-nine of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, shall cease to operate, and cattle may be moved as if those Articles had not been inserted in that Order.

4. Every licence granted by the Privy Council for the holding of a market, exhibition, or sale, before the commencement of this Order, and in force at the commencement thereof, shall continue in force thereafter, as if this Order had not been made, subject to revocation by the Privy Council, and as if the conditions, provisions, and regulations applicable, under this Order, to such market, exhibition, or sale, had been referred to in such licence, instead of the conditions, provisions, and regulations of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867.

5. Nothing in this Order shall extend to the Metropolis or affect the operation or construction of The Metropolitan Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, any of the aforesaid Articles of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867.

THE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the part of the Port of Grimsby, in the parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, within which foreign cattle may be landed, as follows:—

All that space at the Great Grimsby (Royal) Docks, in the borough of Grimsby, lying between the Quay Wall forming the south-eastern boundary of the water of the Royal Dock, and a line commencing on the said Quay Wall at the northern corner of the "Transit Shed No. 4," and running straight in a south-easterly direction for a distance of one hundred and twenty-five yards at right angles to the Quay Wall, passing two hundred and seven yards to the north-east of the north-eastern fence of the Cattle Pens, to the boundary fence on the north-western side of the Fish Dock road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the said boundary fence for a distance of two hundred and eighty-three yards; thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction, passing parallel to and eight yards to the south-west of the south-western wall of the slaughter-house and sheds for foreign cattle,

to the quay wall of the Royal Dock at a point two hundred and eighty-three yards to the south-west of the northern corner of the Transit Shed No. 4; all which space is coloured green on the plan of part of Great Grimsby Docks, deposited at the Privy Council office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Grimsby;

And prescribe as follows:—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

THE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Consul at Pará, a Despatch, of which the following is a translation :—

British Consulate,  
Pará, September 8, 1867.

I HAVE the honour to inform your Lordship that the act of opening the navigation of the River Amazon to the merchant shipping of all nations was yesterday solemnly performed by the President of this Province, the Admiral de Lamare, who proceeded for that purpose, on board a Brazilian frigate, to the mouth of the Amazon, accompanied by all the principal functionaries, foreign consuls, and inhabitants of this city.

The ceremony was attended with great pomp,

and public festivities on a large scale are being held in honour of the event.

The non-arrival of any foreign man-of-war on this occasion has been much regretted by the Brazilian authorities and inhabitants of Pará.
