AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 29th day of *October*, 1867.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS one of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company's vessels, called the "*Atrato*," has lately arrived, from the West Indies, and has been directed to proceed to, and remain under quarantine at, the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight, and during and in the course of her voyage from the West Indies, the Yellow Fever, being a dangerous and infectious disease, appeared on board the said vessel, and attacked several persons on board thereof, and the said vessel arrived under alarming and suspicious circumstances; and whereas several persons who were on board the "*Atrato*," on her arrival, being all the persons on board the said ship who were known to be or suspected of being affected by the said disease, have since been ordered to be removed to the Quarantine Lazarette or Hulk called the "*Menelaus*," lying at the Motherbank, off the Isle of Wight:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the disposition of the other persons remaining on board the said ship:

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, in exercise of the powers vested in them, do hereby order, —

1. That the said vessel, called the "*Atrato*," shall remain and continue at the Motherbank aforesaid, until the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

2. That the persons now on board the said vessel called the "*Atrato*," not ordered to be removed to the "*Menelaus*," shall be removed to the ship called the "*Parana*," or the ship called the "*Æolus*," unless ordered to remain on board the "*Atrato*," by the Medical Superintendent of Quarantine at Southampton.

3. That all persons so removed on board the "*Menelaus*" Quarantine Hulk, or who shall hereafter be removed on board the said Hulk, or on board the "*Parana*," or the "*Æolus*," and who shall have been on board the "*Atrato*," shall be kept and detained on board the said Hulk, or the "*Parana*," or the "*Æolus*," until the said Lords of the Council, or any two or more of them, shall make further order.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

North Riding of Yorkshire, to Wit.

Michaelmas Sessions, 1867.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden for the North Riding of the county of York, at Northallerton, in the said Riding, on Tuesday in the first week after the 11th day of October, to wit, the 15th day of October, in the thirty-first year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, and in the year of our Lord 1867, before the Right Honourable Alan, Earl Cathcart (Chairman), The Right Honourable Thomas, Earl of Zetland, The Right Honourable William Henry, Lord Bolton, The Right Honourable Charles John, Lord Teignmouth, and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen, assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen, in the said Riding, and also to hear and determine divers felonies, trespasses, and other misdemeanors, committed in the same Riding.

Dewsbury Extension.

To extend and alter Boundaries of Municipal Borough and District of Dewsbury; Waterworks Extension; Power to raise Money, levy Rates, &c.; Repeal and Amendment of Acts; and other purposes.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session for leave to bring in a Bill to repeal, alter, amend, and extend all or some of the powers and provisions of "The Dewsbury, Batley, and Heckmondwike Waterworks Act, 1856" (herein called the Act of 1856); "The Dewsbury, Batley, and Heckmondwike Waterworks Amendment Act, 1861" (herein called the Act of 1861); and the Dewsbury, Batley, and Heckmondwike Waterworks Amendment Act, 1867" (herein called the Act of 1867); "The Public Health Act, 1848;" and the Order in Council dated the 23rd day of October, 1851, applying the said Public Health Act to the township of Dewsbury; "The Local Government Act, 1858;" "The Local Government Act (1858) Amendment Act, 1861;" "The Sanitary Act, 1866;" or of some or one of those Acts, or the Acts therein recited, or incorporated therein, and to grant further and other powers in lieu thereof and in addition thereto, and to alter and repeal all or any of the provisions of the said Acts, or any of them, which it may be necessary to alter or repeal for the purposes of the said Bill, and to make other provisions in lieu of the powers and provisions so repealed, altered, or amended, and in such Bill so to be applied for, powers and provisions will be inserted for effecting or authorising all or some of the several objects and purposes following, that is to say:

To extend to the new or extended portions of the said borough and district all the powers and provisions which under the charter incorporating the said borough, and the several Acts relating to Municipal Corporations in England and Wales, or under "The Public Health Act, 1848," "The Local Government Act, 1858," "The Local Government Act (1858) Amendment Act, 1861," "The Sanitary Act, 1866," or under the Act of 1856; the Act of 1861, or the Act of 1867, or any of them, or any other Acts now in force within the said borough, can be exercised within the said borough and district by the mayor, aldermen, and burgesses of the said borough (herein called the Corporation), or by the Local Board of Health of the said district (herein called the Local Board), or which are or might be applicable to the said borough, and to exempt the lands to be so added to the said borough and district, and all the houses, buildings, and works therein from all contribution to the rates levied within the West Riding of the county of York, for the support of the county police, and from all other county rates (save and except such as are now leviable within the existing borough), and to alter such county rates accordingly, and also from the payment of highway rates and other rates to the several townships of Batley, Heckmondwike, Southill, Mirfield, and Thornhill respectively, and from the liability to repair any turnpike or highway, or to contribute to the maintenance thereof, or to any other parochial or township purpose, beyond the limits of such extended borough and district.

5. To repeal, alter, amend, and extend all or some of the powers and provisions of the Act of 1856, the Act of 1861, and the Act of 1867, and to enact other provisions in lieu thereof.

6. To enact and give effect to the existing bye-laws made or adopted by the Corporation or the Local Board under the authority and for the purposes of the Local Government Act, 1858.

7. To authorize the Corporation and Local Board to raise by borrowing and re-borrowing at interest on mortgage of their waterworks and the income thereof, and of the public water rate, such monies for the purposes of the waterworks as are authorized to be borrowed for those purposes under the Act of 1856, the Act of 1861, and the Act of 1867, and to confer on the Corporation and Local Board other powers to borrow and re-borrow sums of money for the purposes aforesaid, and the payment of the interest for the same, and for providing a sinking fund to pay off the principal thereof.

8.
