

Station deposited at the Privy Council Office, copies whereof are deposited at the offices of the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Middlesex and of the Metropolitan Board of Works :

And do hereby prescribe as follows :—

1. The cattle landed within the said defined part, when removed therefrom, shall be removed therefrom by railway only, and by the following route, namely :—along a siding of the North London Railway to the main line thereof, and thence along the North London Railway, by way of Bow and Hackney.

2. All foreign cattle so conveyed by railway, shall be brought along the said railway without stopping, and shall be discharged from the trucks in which they have been conveyed at the Maiden-lane Cattle Station, near to the Metropolitan Cattle Market, at Islington, and shall be driven immediately, upon being so discharged, to such market, or to the lairs belonging thereto, or to such other lairs as may be licensed by the Privy Council for the reception of such cattle.

3. All cattle within the limits of the said defined part shall be deemed to be foreign cattle, and shall be in all respects subject to the provisions of this Order in relation thereto.

WHEREAS a part of the Port of Hartlepool, in the county of Durham, has been defined by an Order of the Privy Council, bearing date the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, as a part of that port within which foreign cattle may be landed, and in such order it is provided that all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part, and it is advisable to make provision for the re-shipment of such cattle for the purpose of their being conveyed to certain other ports and places in England :

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby order as follows :—

1. From and after the ninth day of this present month of November, notwithstanding anything in the said Order, foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the Port of Hartlepool may, under such regulations as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs from time to time prescribe, be re-shipped therefrom and conveyed by sea direct to the Port of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, North Shields, Sunderland, or Middlesborough.

2. Provided that all cattle so re-shipped shall continue to be deemed foreign cattle.
