THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act to apply the sum of two million pounds out of the Consolidated Fund to the service of the year ending the 31st day of March, 1868.

An Act to grant to Her Majesty additional rates of income tax.

An Act to amend the law relating to sales of reversions.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under "The Drainage and Improvement of Lands (Ireland) Act, 1863," and the Acts amending the same.

An Act for the amendment of "The Metropolitan Streets Act, 1867."

An Act to forbid the issue of writs for members to serve in this present Parliament for the boroughs of Totnes, Reigate, Great Yarmouth, and Lancaster.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a translation of the Declaration signed on 26th November, 1867, by Her Majesty's Minister at Florence and the Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs, relative to the legal status of Joint Stock Companies, the provisions of which are as follows:

That Joint Stock Companies and other Associations, commercial, industrial, and financial, constituted and authorized in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, may freely exercise in the dominions of the other all

their rights, including that of appearing before Tribunals whether for the purpose of bringing an action or for defending the same, in conformity, however, with the laws and customs in force in the said countries:

That these dispositions shall be applicable as well to Companies and Associations constituted and authorized previously to the signature of this present declaration as to those which may subsequently be so constituted and authorized.

That the present declaration made without limit as to duration may be revoked by either party giving a year's previous notice, and that such modifications may by common consent be introduced into it as experience may shew to be desirable.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Minister at Rio de Janeiro, the following translation of a Decree issued by the Brazilian Government, bearing date 23rd October, 1867, respecting the dues payable by vessels entering the Custom-house docks at that port:—

(Translation.)

ART. 1. The stay of vessels at the Custom-house dock of Rio de Janeiro shall be charged for as follows:—

1. The vessels and lighters which shall make fast to the key of the dock, on its outside, shall pay for such space of key occupied, per metre—

Of effective discharge, per diem	...	800
On days in which no discharge is effected	...	400

2. Such vessels as moor inside shall pay, on the same basis—

For each day of effective discharge	...	15000
For each day in which no discharge is effected	...	500

3. The vessels which remain in dock without being moored to the key, shall pay, per ton of measurement—

For each working day	500
For each holiday	100

Sec. 1. The day on which discharge commences shall be considered complete.

Sec. 2. The extent of key occupied by vessels shall be that comprised between two horizontal (lines) perpendicular to the parapet or top surface of the key, and drawn to touch the stern-post and bow of the ship.

Sec. 3. The measuring and gauging of ships pertains to the Stereometer of the Custom-house and to his assistants.

ART. 2. The registry of the movement in the dock is incumbent on the "Guarda-mor."

Sec. 1. A note signed by the "Guarda-mor," or by one of his assistants, shall be extracted from the register of which this Article treats, and which should state—

1st. Whether the discharge was effected on the outside or inside of the dock; and in this case, whether or not the vessel was hauled to the key.

2nd. How many days the vessel's discharge occupied, or how many days she remained in dock.

In case of her having effected her unloading outside the key and of the dock, this should be expressly stated in the note.

Sec. 2. On view of the note of which the preceding paragraph treats, and on the occasion of clearing the vessel, and payment of proper dues, the dock dues shall be calculated, which amount shall be mentioned in the note of clearance for sea.

Sec. 3. The payment being realized, the same shall be entered in the register, giving the number of the note of dispatch, the month, year, and amount paid.

ART. 3. The duties which Article 1 treats of are independent of anchorage and other dues established by the laws in actual force.

ART. 4. The vessel shall not obtain her clearance papers unless the dock dues shall have been paid; and in case of their not having been incurred, it shall be so expressly stated in the clearance for sea, and in the confrontation of the discharge of cargo.

ART. 5. The captains of the ships or consignees of same are responsible for the dock dues, not only as concerns the ships, but the lighters and boats in which the discharge may have been effected.

ART. 6. The labour of discharging merchandize in the Custom-house dock of Rio de Janeiro shall be paid for as follows:—

1st. For landing each package, weight not exceeding 50 kilograms, 40rs. shall be recovered.

2nd. For every 10 or fraction of 10 kilograms exceeding 50, 20rs.

Sec. 1. The gross weight of each package shall be verified at the time of landing, by means of proper scales; this duty being incumbent on the Portage department, whose employés shall set down in their notes the weight found.

Sec. 2. At the time of dispatching the merchandize, and when the notes are taken to the warehouse to be formally entered in the books of that department, the respective book-keeper (fiel) should state whether the packages were landed in the dock, and what the gross weight of each, in conformity with the notes received from the Porters' department, and which shall have been transcribed in the proper books.

Should the landing of the goods not have taken place in the dock, the same should be expressly declared in the notes of the dispatch.

Sec. 3. At sight of these declarations, the calculation for impost shall be proceeded with, which amount shall be mentioned in the note of the dispatch, to be paid conjointly with the proper duties.

ART. 7. The owners or consignees of the merchandize are responsible for the duties mentioned in the preceding Article.

ART. 8. For landing in the Custom-house of portmanteaux, trunks, boxes, and other packages of passengers' luggage, shall be recovered—

1st. For all such as weigh more than 5 kilograms	1\$000
2nd. For 5 kilograms, or less	\$100

Sec. 1. Bags, hat-boxes, baskets, and like luggage, containing articles of daily use of the passengers shall be exempt from this duty.

Sec. 2. In the act of examining the packages, the respective gross weight shall be verified, and the calculation of the amount owed shall be forthwith proceeded with, the amount being included in the note of the dispatch of the articles subject to duties, when there are any such, or simply mentioned in the note, in order that payment be realized.

ART. 9. The owners of the packages of luggage which may be discharged in the dock are responsible for the payment of the tax thereon for landing.

ART. 10. The present Decree shall be put in execution at the Custom-house of Rio de Janeiro on 1st January, 1868, forwards.
