**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, defining limits within the borough of Liverpool, into and within which foreign cattle might be brought: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the part of the Port of Liverpool, in the county of Lancashire, within which foreign cattle may be landed, as follows:—

All that space in the borough of Liverpool bounded on the western side by the River Mersey, and on all other sides by a line commencing on the eastern bank of the said river, at the south-western corner of the fort situate near the west end of that part of the dock property called Battery-street, and running eastward and northward along the southern and eastern boundary of the said fort to the north-eastern corner thereof,

thence eastward along the northern side of Battery-street to the western side of Regent-road, thence in a south-easterly direction to the north-west corner of Bankfield-street, thence eastward along the northern sides of Bankfield-street and Bank Hall-street, crossing Derby-road and the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, to the western side of the Liverpool, Crosby, and Southport Railway, thence northward along the western fence of the said railway to the point at which it crosses the borough boundary, thence eastward along the borough boundary to the south-eastern side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, thence continuing in a south-westerly direction across the said canal and along the south-eastern side of the dock branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the western side of Great Howard-street, thence westward along the southern side of the high level branch railway across Fulton-street and Regent-road to the western side of Regent-road, thence northward for a distance of five hundred and ninety-five yards along the western side of Regent-road to the wall or fence forming the boundary between the Sandon Graving Docks and the Huskisson Branch Dock, thence westward along the said wall or fence to the north-western corner thereof, thence southward for a distance of two hundred and fifteen yards along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the Sandon Graving Docks, thence westward straight to the north-eastern corner of the Sandon Basin, thence southward and westward along the eastern and southern sides of the water of the Sandon Basin to the River Mersey; all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of Liverpool deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Liverpool;

And do hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said

period of four days, then all such foreign cattle shall be slaughtered within that defined part within the said period of four days.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Lisbon, transmitting a Decree of the 27th ultimo, abolishing the duties on cereals imported into Portugal until the end of June, 1868, the provisions of which are as follows:—

ART. I. The importation by land or by sea, free of all import duties whatsoever, of all foreign cereals, in the form of grain, flour, or baked bread is permitted until the end of June, 1868, but they will nevertheless continue subject to the consumption duties payable by national produce of the like nature.

ART. II. National or foreign vessels, importing a full cargo of cereals, are exempt from tonnage dues.

Sole paragraph—Where there is not a full cargo, the vessels shall only be exempt from tonnage dues in proportion to the amount of cereals imported by them.

ART. III. The provisions of the two preceding Articles are also applicable to vegetables.

ART. IV. All laws to the contrary are revoked.

**SANITARY ACT, 1866.—SEWAGE UTILIZATION ACT, 1867.**

**SOUTHBOROUGH.—ORDER FORMING A SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICT.**

WHEREAS a Memorial has been presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State from inhabitants of parts of the Ecclesiastical District of Southborough, in the county of Kent, under and in pursuance of the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and of the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, such parts of the said Ecclesiastical District being beyond the boundaries of the district of the Tunbridge Wells Local Board, praying that portions of such Ecclesiastical District should be constituted into a Special Drainage District, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts; and whereas due investigation has been made into the circumstances of the case, and into the prayer of such petition, by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and he has duly reported to me thereon:

Now, therefore, I, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State as aforesaid, do hereby, under the authority conferred upon me by the said Acts, order and direct that, from and after the date of this present Order, such portions of the Ecclesiastical District of Southborough aforesaid, in the county of Kent, as are not comprised within the boundaries of the Local Board District of Tunbridge Wells, shall, for the purposes of the Acts hereinbefore recited, be constituted a Special Drainage District, under the title of "The Southborough Special Drainage District."

**SANITARY ACT, 1866.—SEWAGE UTILIZATION ACT, 1867.**

**PRESTON-NEXT-FAVERSHAM.**

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Sanitary Act, 1866, a Special Drainage District to be styled the Brents Special Drainage District, has been formed by the vestry of the parish of Preston-next-Faversham, in the county of Kent, and consisting of certain specified portions of such parish; and whereas, under the said Act, an appeal has been duly made to me as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and signed by owners and ratepayers of such parish, praying me to annul the said district, or to modify the boundaries thereof, as to me might seem just; and whereas, after investigation into the subject matter of the appeal aforesaid held by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for the purpose, and report thereon made by him, and after full consideration of the said appeal and report:

I do, hereby, under the powers conferred on me by the Sanitary Act, 1866, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, direct that from and after the date of this present Order, the formation of the said Brents Special Drainage District be annulled, and that a District to be styled the Special Drainage District of North Preston-next-Faversham, be formed in lieu thereof, to consist of all that portion of the parish of Preston-next-Faversham aforesaid, which lies on the north side of Faversham Creek.

## SCALE OF MEDICINES AND MEDICAL STORES FOR MERCHANT SHIPS.

WHEREAS by paragraph 1 of the 4th Section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1867," it is, amongst other things, enacted that "the Board of Trade shall from time to time issue and cause to be published scales of medicines and medical stores suitable for different ships and voyages."

AND WHEREAS by paragraph 2 of the said Section, it is further enacted, amongst other things, that "the owners of every ship navigating between the United Kingdom and any place out of the same shall provide and cause to be kept on board such ship a supply of medicines and medical stores in accordance with the scale appropriate to such ship."

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said Act, the following scale of medicines and medical stores is hereby issued and published for the information and guidance of the owners and masters of every ship navigating as aforesaid.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 82.)—MEDITERRANEAN—LIPARI ISLANDS.

*Light at the Foot of Monte Rosa—Lipari Island.*

THE Italian Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of December, 1867, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected at the foot of Monte Rosa, east side of Lipari Island.

The light is a *fixed red* light, visible through an arc of 100 degrees, or between the bearings W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  S. and N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., elevated 115 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of four miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

The lighthouse is rectangular, and 20 feet high; its position is in lat.  $38^{\circ} 28' 41''$  N., long.  $14^{\circ} 57' 30''$  East of Greenwich.

This light is intended as a guide to Casa Bianca anchorage.

#### ADRIATIC.

##### *Alteration of Harbour Light at Fiume.*

The Austrian Government has given notice, that the following alteration will shortly take place in the harbour light at Fiume, Gulf of Quarnero.

Instead of the present harbour light, a light will be exhibited from the extremity of the mole, now in the course of construction.

The light is a *fixed* light, showing *white* between the bearings of North to West, and *red* between the bearings North to East, elevated 26 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of seven miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses.

The light is exhibited from an iron column, 25 feet high, and its position is in lat.  $45^{\circ} 19\frac{1}{2}'$  N., long.  $14^{\circ} 26'$  East of Greenwich.

During very stormy weather the light will not be exhibited.

##### *Reported Danger on South-west Coast.*

NOTICE is hereby given, that a sunken rock has been reported, by a coral fisher, as lying in the track of vessels between the Island of St. Antioch and Toro, south-west coast of Sardinia.

The shoal is about 30 yards in extent, and is a ridge of sand or rock with 17 feet water on it. It is said to lie about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles from the extreme point (Point Sperone) of the Island of St. Antioch, and N. by W.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. 5 miles from Toro Islet.

As this reported danger lies directly in the track of vessels passing within Toro, and the position being only approximate, mariners are cautioned in using that passage.

The position of this danger will, at a favourable opportunity, be examined and further information given.
