**A**T the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 10th day of *December, 1867*.

By the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby revoke their Order bearing date the twenty-eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, defining limits within the borough of Liverpool, into and within which foreign cattle might be brought: Provided that nothing herein shall be deemed to invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the said Order before the date of this revocation, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the said Order.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the part of the Port of Liverpool, in the county of Lancashire, within which foreign cattle may be landed, as follows:—

All that space in the borough of Liverpool bounded on the western side by the River Mersey, and on all other sides by a line commencing on the eastern bank of the said river, at the south-western corner of the fort situate near the west end of that part of the dock property called Battery-street, and running eastward and northward along the southern and eastern boundary of the said fort to the north-eastern corner thereof,

thence eastward along the northern side of Battery-street to the western side of Regent-road, thence in a south-easterly direction to the north-west corner of Bankfield-street, thence eastward along the northern sides of Bankfield-street and Bank Hall-street, crossing Derby-road and the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, to the western side of the Liverpool, Crosby, and Southport Railway, thence northward along the western fence of the said railway to the point at which it crosses the borough boundary, thence eastward along the borough boundary to the south-eastern side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction along the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the Leeds and Liverpool Canal, thence continuing in a south-westerly direction across the said canal and along the south-eastern side of the dock branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to the western side of Great Howard-street, thence westward along the southern side of the high level branch railway across Fulton-street and Regent-road to the western side of Regent-road, thence northward for a distance of five hundred and ninety-five yards along the western side of Regent-road to the wall or fence forming the boundary between the Sandon Graving Docks and the Huskisson Branch Dock, thence westward along the said wall or fence to the north-western corner thereof, thence southward for a distance of two hundred and fifteen yards along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the Sandon Graving Docks, thence westward straight to the north-eastern corner of the Sandon Basin, thence southward and westward along the eastern and southern sides of the water of the Sandon Basin to the River Mersey; all which space is coloured pink on the plan of part of Liverpool deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Liverpool;

And do hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. All foreign cattle landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within four days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing, unless they are taken to a licensed market or sale within that defined part within such four days, and they shall be so taken if a market or sale is held there within the said period of four days, but if there is no such licensed market or sale within that defined part, or if no such market or sale is held there within the said
