THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Stettin, reporting that the following reductions in shipping dues have been made since the 1st November last:—

I. Sea Dues:—for all vessels entering or leaving the harbour of Swinemünde:

per normal last (about 1½ register tons).

II. River Dues:—the river dues for vessels navigating the Swine, the Peene, the Devenow, and the Haff, consequently for all vessels proceeding from Swinemünde to Stettin, and from Stettin to Swinemünde, which amounted to 1 groschen per last for vessels with cargoes, and $\frac{1}{2}$ groschen per last for vessels in ballast, have been abolished.

The present rate of 4 groschen per last, would be about 26s. 8d. per 100 tons register.

All vessels above 40 last burden have also to pay for port charges at Stettin, 9 pfennig per last, about 5s. per 100 tons register.

BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

Spurn Point.—Order of Prohibition against Removal of Shingle.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the 54 Geo. III., cap. 159, that "in order to prevent damage being done to the shores or banks of the ports, harbours, or havens in this kingdom, no person or persons shall take any ballast or shingle from the shores or banks or any portion of the shores or banks of any port, harbour, or haven of this kingdom, from which the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the United Kingdom for the time being shall find it necessary, for the protection of such port, harbour, or haven, or the works thereof, by Order under their hands, or the hands of any three of them, or the hands of his or their Secretary, and published in the London Gazette, shall prohibit the taking or removing of such shingle or ballast, upon pain of forfeiting for every such offence the sum of ten pounds:"

And whereas it is further enacted by "The Harbours Transfer Act, 1862" (25 and 26 Victoria, cap. 69), "that from and after the 31st day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, sections fourteen and sixteen of the Act of the fifty-fourth year of King George the Third (chapter one hundred and fifty-nine), 'for the better regulation of the several ports, harbours, roadsteads, sounds, channels, bays, and navigable rivers in the United Kingdom, and of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, arsenals, wharfs, moorings, and stores thereon, and for repealing several Acts passed for that purpose,' and all provisions in the said Act contained relative thereto, shall be read and construed as if the Board of Trade were named in the said sections instead of the Admiralty:"

And whereas the Board of Trade have found it necessary, for the protection of the harbour or haven of the River Humber, and of the shores and banks thereof, and of the works thereof, to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shore or bank hereinafter specified:

Now the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order under the hand of their Secretary prohibit all persons from taking or removing any description of shingle or ballast from the shore or banks or from any portion of the shore or banks at Spurn Point, from the Low Lighthouse southward to the extreme of the point at low water, and northward two and a half statute miles on both sides of the Spurn Point.

(No. 89.)—SOUTH AMERICA—EAST COAST.

Shoal near Monte Video.

INFORMATION has been received of the existence of a rocky patch, with seven feet at low water, off the dangerous line of coast between Brava and Buceo Points, east of Monte Video, already described in the South American Pilot.

From the part of the shoal where the English

merchant ship *Forest King* grounded the following bearings were obtained :—

Pipas Rocks	N.E.;
Flores Lighthouse	E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S.; and
Luz Rocks	N.W.;

which would place the danger $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles from the land, and six miles from Flores lighthouse.

As this part of the approaches to Monte Video is known to be doubtful ground, mariners are warned not to make free with the land in the neighbourhood.

Liverpool Tramways and the Corporation of Liverpool and other Public Bodies in the Suburbs.

(Power to Corporation and such other Public Bodies to construct (if need be) the Tramways proposed by Liverpool Tramway Company (Limited); application of their funds to such purposes and power to borrow, &c.)

WHEREAS advertisements appeared in the London Gazette of the 13th November last, and in newspapers published in the borough of Liverpool in November last (and *inter alia* in the Daily Courier of the 16th, 23rd, and 30th November last), of an intended application to Parliament in the next ensuing session for an Act to confer upon the Liverpool Tramway Company (Limited) powers to make certain street tramways in the borough and the suburbs thereof described in such advertisements, and in certain plans and sections intended to be deposited, and which have been deposited, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Lancaster, at his office, at Preston, on or before the 30th day of November last:
