"And whereas, by a deed bearing date on or about the seventeenth day of September, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and being under the hand and seal of the Reverend Richard Orme Assheton, the rector or incumbent

of the rectory of the parish of Bilton aforesaid, and also the patron of the same rectory, and being under the common seal of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England (which deed is intended to be enrolled in your Majesty's High Court of Chancery at Westminster), the said Richard Orme Assheton did give, grant, and convey unto us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, and to our successors, in aid of the endowment of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, and of the maintenance of the minister thereof for the time being, certain pieces or parcels of land situate in the parish of Bilton aforesaid, and containing in the whole nine acres two roods and twenty-five perches, or thereabouts, and also certain tithe commutation rents-charge, amounting in the aggregate to the sum of eighty pounds nine shillings and one penny yearly, arising and issuing out of or from certain lands situate in the said parish of Bilton.

"And whereas the said pieces or parcels of land, and tithe commutation rents-charge, have been so given, granted, and conveyed as aforesaid, upon the understanding, that we should make, and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-named Act, to the minister for the time being of the said district, when duly licensed, in accordance with the provisions of the herein secondly-named Act, a grant of fifty pounds per annum, and, upon the further understanding, that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said district, and of the nomination of the minister thereof, should be assigned in the manner herein-after mentioned.

"And whereas we have agreed to make the said grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid, by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that all that part of the said parish of Bilton, which is described in the schedule hereunder written; all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication, in the London Gazette, of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of New Bilton.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted, and of the nomination of the minister thereof, shall, without any assurance in the law, other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to, and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may, from time to time, be exercised by the said Richard Orme Assheton, his heirs, and assigns, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose, that the said pieces or parcels of land, and the said tithe commutation rents-charge, so given, granted, and conveyed to us and our successors as aforesaid, and all our estate and interest therein, shall, without any conveyance or assurance in the law, other than this scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the

same, become, and be transferred to, and become absolutely vested in, the minister of the district so recommended to be constituted, so soon as one shall be appointed and licensed, in accordance with the provisions of the herein secondly-named Act, and in his successors ministers of the same district.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of New Bilton, being :—

"All that part of the parish of Bilton, in the county of Warwick, and in the diocese of Worcester, which is situate to the north of an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the parish of Newbold-upon-Avon, in the said county and diocese, from the parish of Bilton aforesaid, at the point where Lawford Brook, otherwise called Sowbrook, is joined by a certain stream flowing from Mr. Line's pond, such point of junction being at a distance of eleven chains, or thereabouts, to the south of the bridge, which carries the line of the Rugby and Leamington Branch Railway over Lawford Brook aforesaid; and extending thence, south-eastward, for a distance of twenty-nine chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said Lawford Brook, to the centre of the bridge which carries Clay Pit-lane, over the same brook; and extending thence, northward, for a distance of fourteen chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said lane, to a point opposite to a boundary stone, inscribed 'N. And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same, and every part thereof, shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order

shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that portion of the said parish of Saint Mary and Saint Germain, Selby, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portion, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint James, situate at Selby as aforesaid; and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint James, Selby.'

And whereas the Local Board of Health for the District of Chatham-Extra, in the county of Kent, have, under the provisions of the said recited Act passed in the Session of Parliament held in the

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England, beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," it is enacted that, in case it appears to Her Majesty in Council, upon the representation of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial-ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of one of such Secretaries of State, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial-ground or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require), that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial-grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time, as circumstances may require; provided always, that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please Her Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representa-

tion, one month before such representation is so considered; provided also, that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial-ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes herein-after mentioned, ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representations, has made representations stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that interments in the same should be discontinued with the modifications hereinafter specified:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by Her Order in Council of the fourth day of November last, to give notice of such representations, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, on the eighteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that no new burial-ground shall be opened in any of the undermentioned parishes without the previous approval of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials in the said parishes shall be discontinued (except as is herein otherwise directed), as follows; viz.:-

**EAST DEREHAM.**—Forthwith wholly in the parish church and Baptist and Independent Chapels, and after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, in the churchyard, except in such vaults and walled graves as may be constructed in now unoccupied ground, and in now existing vaults and walled graves which are free from water, and in which each coffin shall be entombed, that is, enclosed in stonework or brickwork properly cemented, and that in the meantime burial shall be discontinued in vaults and graves which are not free from water. Also interment in the Baptist and Independent burial-grounds to be forthwith discontinued, except in now existing vaults and walled graves in which each coffin shall be entombed, and except in earthen graves not less than five feet deep, which can be opened without the disturbance of remains or exposure of coffins.

**MELTON MOWBRAY.**—Forthwith wholly in the parish church; and that in the new burial-ground, and in the Independent and Wesleyan Burial-grounds, the Regulations for New Burial-grounds be observed, with the exception of No. 3.

**LIVERPOOL.**—Forthwith wholly in the church and churchyard of St. Thomas, except in the vaults belonging to Miss Leathers and to Mr. Edward Parry, in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal and separately entombed, that is, enclosed by brickwork or masonry properly cemented.

**LLANGUICK, NEATH.**—Forthwith wholly in the Panteg, Caer Salem, and Zoar Chapels, at Ystalyfera, and after the thirtieth of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the burial-grounds of those chapels, except in now existing walled graves which are free from water, each coffin buried in which shall be separately enclosed by stonework properly cemented.

**PENDLETON, ECCLES.**—Forthwith wholly in the church of St. Thomas, and in St. Thomas' Churchyard, and in Brindleheath-lane Burial-ground, Pendleton (except in vaults and walled graves in which each coffin shall be embedded in charcoal and separately entombed in an air-tight manner, and in family graves which can be opened to the depth of five feet without the exposure of remains), one body only to be buried in a grave at a time, and no grave to be opened within fourteen years, unless to bury another member of the same family.

JOHN RICKETT, A.B., of Her Majesty's ship "Clio."

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 24th May, 1866, whilst Her Majesty's ship "Clio" was lying at anchor off the Ajia-bampo, on the coast of Mexico, a boy named Thomas (or Tom) Walton, belonging to her, fell into the sea from a stage outside the ship. He was unable to swim, and was sinking the third time, when JOHN RICKETT jumped into the water, brought him to the surface, got him to the ship's cable, and there supported him for ten or fifteen minutes, when the ship's boat reached them.

A man named Card assisted to hold the boy up from overhead.

There was a heavy sea on at the time, and the port was known to be infested with sharks, and just as the ship's boat came up, RICKETT, who was at the time still suffering from the effects of an attack of coast fever, and was in consequence very weak, relaxed his hold of the cable, and himself dropped into the water, from which he was picked up just in time to save his life. Both were insensible when taken into the boat.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to confer the decoration of "The Albert Medal of the First Class" on:—

A. T. SHUTTLEWORTH, Esq., Deputy Conservator of Forests at Alibagh.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the decoration has been conferred:—

On the 22nd July, 1866, the "Berwickshire" ran on Chawool Kadoo Reef. Mr. SHUTTLEWORTH went to her assistance in a fisherman's canoe, and, after two days' exertions, succeeded in landing six men in one of the ship's boats. Mr. SHUTTLEWORTH again proceeded to the ship with the fishermen in another boat in so dangerous a sea that some of the "Berwickshire's" seamen, who had landed, and the coolies of Colaba, to whom a large reward was offered, declined to take a message to her. After rowing for three hours, the boat having twice filled to the thwarts, he reached the vessel, and informed the captain of her true position, and remained on board to give assistance.

On the 1st August, 1866, the "Die Vernon" ran on the Chawool Kadoo Reef, near Alibagh. Mr. SHUTTLEWORTH put off in a boat with ten native fishermen, and by his coolness was the means of averting a greater loss of life than that which unhappily took place. The boat was dashed against the vessel's side and capsized, throwing all her crew into the water, and, while endeavouring to save some of these, Mr. SHUTTLEWORTH was washed overboard. He, however, regained the vessel, and was for two hours lashed in the mizen rigging. He refused to forsake the captain and carpenter who were helpless, and eventually succeeded in saving the captain. The carpenter was washed away and drowned.

On the 18th July, 1867, the ship "Terzah" was wrecked about south-east of Kennery. Mr.

SHUTTLEWORTH put off in a life-boat manned by fishermen, and succeeded in bringing off the captain and thirteen men out of a crew of thirty-one. Eight others came on shore on pieces of wreck. This service was rendered by Mr. SHUTTLEWORTH and his crew at great peril of their lives. The sea was breaking very heavily all round the ship and washing over her.
