Leghanse, March 10. The Great Duke is very well recovered of his late illinefs, and has given Audience to an Envoy from the Baffa of Tunis, who arrived here about the beginning of this Month: But the Bufineis be is fent lupon is not yet publickly known. The court will remove from hence in two or three days to Florences. By a Velfel arrived from the Levant, we have an account, that the Turks make, great Peparations for the approaching Campagne; and that they feem refolved to turn their greateft Force againft the Venetians.

Danzzick, March 16. They write from Poland, that the breaking up of the Diet, which was iffembled at Grodno, without coming to a Determination in any of the matters that were propored to them, has greatly difappointed the meafures the King had formed for a vigorous Profecution of the War againft the Turks; but that it Was hoped things would be managed with a better temper in the Convocation appointed to be beld at Warfate, and fach Refolutions taken there, as may obviate the Inconveniencies the publelk Affars may orberwife fuffer tom this ill fucccefs of the Diet. That Prince 7 ames, the King's eldert Son, was gone to Lemberg, upon the Advice that came from the Frontiers, that the Tartars were not only preparing to put a Convoy of Provifions into Caminiec, but that they bad likewife a delign to, make a great Incurfon into the Province of Volbinia; for which purpote they wese drawing together in very conflderablo numbers.
Madrid, March 14. The Count de Coiderrt, Envoy Extraordinary from the Emperor, is anrivel here to nequaint his Catholick Majelty with the Coronation of the King of Hungary. We bauc an account from Carteveray thre a Velfel of Bartary was lately calt awsy on the Comf

Vienna, March 2n. The Officers that had leave to come hither to make thajr Preparations for the Campagne, are molt of them returned to their Commands, with Direetions to have their Troops in a readinefs to march upon the firt Orders they fhall recejue for that purpore. The Re. giments that are commanded towards Effecke will embark at Peft, and fo pafs down the Danube, while the Horfe marches by Land. A Captain is arrived here from Effecke, who reports, that there was a very good Gariw
 Teqct: That reveray 1 uks, who deferted from itha Fis alis, were daily taken by the Imperial Parties, and that upon their Examination they all declared, That the Gagifon of Alba" Regalis fuffered very much through the farcity of Provifions, but that the Baffa endeavoured to encourage them with the Affurances, ef a fpeedy relief; and fhewed, on all occafions, a Refolution to tanke a vigorous defence Befides the Regiment of $1500 \mathrm{Men}_{j}$ which the Elector of Saxony is to Flift the Emperor with this Campagne, the Duke of Meckenburgh has agreed to fend a Regiment of 1000 , and 2000 Men are expected from the Elector of Cologne, hnad yoo from the Lindgrave of He/fe.
Hienna, March 25. The Dale of Larrain is expected here in few days, for; according to the talt advice we had from Infpruck; his Highnefs will part uom thence to morrow, intending, after a very thort fux at this Court; to continue bis Journey to Hungary. They write fiom Iranjilvan.a, that all Differences are adjufted between the Imperialits and the States of that Countrey; and that the former live in avery gcod Cortependence with Pince alaj and his Sabjectse We bave Advice from Conftatinapie, by the way of Belgride, that thlngs continued there in inuch diforder; and that the Faction which endeavoured to depole the new Sultan, and to ret upthe Son of $\overline{M a-}$ bomet IV. became every day more powefful.

Cologne, March 28. The Elector of Colaghe jecovers daily, and bis Phyfitians give us great hopes that be will now very quick be perfectly well. The 1500 Men , whieh his Electoral Highnefs is to fend to the Afiftance of the Emperor, are ordered to be drawnout of the Gaifons of Ronn, Rbanberg, and fome other places, and will begin their march about the middle of the next Month. The lait Letters front lingary tola us, the Baff of Alba Regils was fo far front hewing any 'Inclinątion to capitulate, that me bad declared, uifon the Summon's that whs fem him by the Imperiallte, That he and the whole Garion were refolved to defend the place to tic laftextremitys and thate they donbted not to conviice thofe that thould attack them, that they were not in fo Hiacondition as was giventout. The fame Advices add, That General Caraffí had ordeted thrce Regianenis of Horfe to march towards Cronftadt, to join with the Hofpodars of Valachia and Moldavia, in cale they perfifted in their refolution of putting themelves under the Emperor's Protection and declaring againft the Turks: and that General Caraffa was marching himfelf with a ftrong Detachehent towards Effeck, to obferve the Enemies niotions $r$ who are drawing together on that fide.

Hague, April 2v: The States-General have named the Heer Van Duyvenvocrden, and the Heet Van Amer ngen, to go and meet and Complement, 'on their part, the Eleetor of Saxony, who is coming hither; "and they will part from hence on Monday or Tuefdity next: The Sieur Dief, Envoy Extraordipary from the Elector of Erandenburgh, has had a Conference with the Deputies of this State upon the Subject of his laft Memorial. Prince Waldecke began his Journey yefterday; for Cuylenburgh, from whence, after baving difpatched fome private Affairs, he intends to go to his Government of Maefrichtry to give the neceflary Orders about the new Fortifications that are making theie; for the carrying on of which, the Countrey thereabouts is to fuinim gooo Crowns a year, till they have paifed the Sum of 90000 Crowns, which, in the mean time, is taken up at Intereft, that the faid Fortifications may: be finifhed out of hand.

Bruffels, Aprit 2. Our Governor-General, upon the Notice be recejved by the laft Poit trom Holland, that the Elector of Saxony was expected in few days at the Hague, and that from thence he intended to come hither; has given Orders to have things prepared for his reception aid Entertainment, which is defired to be at Tervete ret We have an account front Leege, that the Elector of Colosne, who is now perfectly recovered, had fent to the Chapter of lige; to let then know, that he had fome Matters topropofe to them, and therefore tequired thenf to repair to Bonne prefently after Eafter; But that they had, on pretence of the Seafon, endeavoured to exCufe themelves from this Journey; Which, it was believed, wouid hinder the Cardinal Coadjutor's going to Litge fo foon as he béfore intended. : We are likewife ifformed, that noft of the Canons make a difficulty to declare in fayour of the Cardinal for the Coadjutorthiy of Liege, till they have an Affurance, that the Pope will confrom his Eminence in that of Cologne, which as ger there appears at Rome no great dipepfition to. They write from Germany, that the Treaty of alliance lately concluded between the Crown of France and the Huufe of LinenGurgh is ratified, and the inatifications exchanged.

Pari, April 3. The King has been thefe sor 4 days at Marlh, from whence hereturned this Evening to Were
faills.
