Proposed Abandonment.

NOTICE is hereby given, that in pursuance of "The Abandonment of Railways Act, 1850," and "The Railway Companies Act, 1867," the Cowes and Newport Railway Company have made application in writing to the Board of Trade, setting forth that the said Cowes and Newport Railway Company are desirous that the railways and works by "The Cowes and Newport Railway Act, 1864," authorised to be made, and therein described as:—

No. 1. An extension railway, commencing from and out of the Cowes and Newport Railway, at a point about one hundred and seventy-eight yards from the door leading from the platform of the Newport Station of the said railway into the booking office of the said station, measured along the Cowes and Newport Railway in a northerly direction, and terminating by a junction with the authorised railway of the Isle of Wight Railway Company, in a field numbered on the plans (deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Southampton, in respect of "The Isle of Wight Railways Extensions Act, 1863") 65; in the parish of Whippingham.
