Board of Trade, Whitehall, January 9, 1868.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Caracas, enclosing translation of a Decree issued by General Falcon, imposing an additional duty of 20 per cent. on goods imported into the Venezuelan Ports, of which the following are the articles:—

ART. 1. An extraordinary contribution of a 20 per cent. additional on the sum total of the import duties accruing in the Custom-houses of the

Republic, will be collected for the space of one year.

ART. 2. This contribution will commence to be collected at La Guaira and Puerto Cabello on the 15th of December next with respect to vessels from the West India Islands, the United States, and other countries of North America; and on the 15th January, 1868, with respect to vessels despatched from Europe and other places; at the other Custom-houses on the 31st of December of this year and the 31st of January of 1868, according to the places the vessels cleared from, in the order established for La Guaira and Puerto Cabello.

Sole §. Excepting:

1. Flour, which will continue to be subject to the same duty now paid.
2. Articles which the Tariff declares free.

ART. 3. The additional 20 per cent. is to be paid in cash if not exceeding \$300, and at two months credit if exceeding that amount.

ART. 4. The proceeds of this contribution are to be wholly applied to the requirements of the budget, to the expences of next Congress, and to the arrangement of the internal debt, and will be exclusively at the disposal of the Minister of Finance who by means of agents will collect the said contribution applying it expressly to the objects stated in this Article.

ART. 5. The said 20 per cent. now established will be deducted from the import duties in the course of the two following years to that in which this contribution is to be in force, at the rate of 10 per cent. in each year. They will commence to count from the dates on which the contribution begins to be collected in conformity with what is stipulated in Article 2.

ART. 6. The necessary measures for the due collection and scrupulous inversion of the impost hereby decreed will be issued separately.
