VICTORIA, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, to Our right trusty and right well-beloved cousin Edward James, Earl of Powis; Our right trusty and right well-beloved cousin Edwin Richard Windham, Earl of Dunraven and Mount Earl, Knight of Our Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick; The Right Reverend Father in God Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillor Samuel, Bishop of Meath; Our right trusty and well-beloved Robert, Baron Clonbrock; Our right trusty and well-beloved Councillor Michael Morris, Fourth Justice of Our Court of Common Pleas, in that part of Our said United Kingdom called Ireland; Our trusty and well-beloved Sir Robert Kane, Knight; Our trusty and well-beloved William Brooke, Esquire, one of the Masters of Our High Court of Chancery, in that part of Our said United Kingdom called Ireland; Our trusty and well-beloved David Wilson, Doctor in Divinity; Our trusty and well-beloved Benjamin Morgan Cowie, Bachelor in Divinity, one of Our Inspectors of Schools; Our trusty and well-beloved James Arthur Dease, Esquire; Our trusty and well-beloved James Gibson, Esquire; Our trusty and well-beloved Scott Nasmyth Stokes, Esquire, one of Our Inspectors of Schools; Our trusty and well-beloved William Kirby Sullivan, Esquire, Professor of Chemistry in the Royal College of Science for Ireland; and Our trusty and well-beloved Lawrence Waldron, Esquire, greeting:

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should issue to inquire into the nature and extent of the instruction afforded by the several Institutions established in Ireland, and maintained either in whole or in part from the Public Funds, or by Private Individuals, Voluntary Societies or Subscribers, or Religious Orders, for the purpose of Elementary or Primary Education; to enquire also into the practical working of the system of National Education in Ireland; to ascertain whether any and what Rules now in force in the Schools under the management of the Commissioners of National Education in Ireland may be altered or repealed with advantage to the Public; and whether any and what Regulations may be established in their stead with respect to

such Schools, and to Report as to the measures which can be adopted for extending more generally to Our People in Ireland the benefits of such education.

Now, know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed you, and by these Presents authorize and appoint you the said Edward James, Earl of Powis, Edwin Richard Windham, Earl of Dunraven and Mount Earl, Samuel, Bishop of Meath, Robert, Baron Clonbrock, Michael Morris, Sir Robert Kane, William Brooke, David Wilson, Benjamin Morgan Cowie, James Arthur Dease, James Gibson, Scott Nasmyth Stokes, William Kirby Sullivan, and Lawrence Waldron, to be Our Commissioners, to inquire into the nature, character, and extent of the instruction afforded by the several institutions now existing in Ireland, and maintained in whole or in part by the Public Funds, by Private Individuals, or by Voluntary Societies or Subscribers, or Religious Orders, for the purpose of Elementary or Primary Education, and especially to inquire into the constitution and practical working of the Board of National Education in Ireland, and also to inquire and report how far the said National Board has fulfilled the objects for which it was established, and the causes or reasons why certain Societies and Patrons have been unwilling to place their Schools in connection with its system, and also to inquire and report concerning that part of the said National System which relates to Model Schools, how far the same is capable of any and what improvement, and also to inquire and report as to the deficiency which is alleged to exist of Trained Teachers in the class of schools called non-vested, and how such deficiency, if such shall appear, may be best supplied, and also how far the Rules of the said National Board with regard to Religious Teaching could with safety be modified, so as to extend more widely the benefits of the system. And further to inquire and report whether any beneficial change could be effected in reference to the salaries and mode of payment of Teachers employed in National Schools, and also whether any improvement can be effected in the constitution of the Board with the view to a more satisfactory administration of its affairs.

And for the better enabling you to carry these Our Royal intentions into effect, We, do, by these presents, give and grant to you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to call

before you, or any three or more of you, such persons as you shall judge necessary by whom you may be the better informed of the truth in the premises.

And We do further, by these presents, give and grant to you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to inquire of the premises and every part thereof by all lawful ways and means whatsoever, within all parts of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Ireland.

And We do further, by these presents, give and grant unto you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority, where the same shall appear requisite, to administer an oath or oaths to any person whatsoever to be examined before you, or any three or more of you, touching or concerning the premises.

And We do further, by these presents, give and grant to you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to cause all persons to bring and to produce upon oath before you, or any three or more of you, all and singular records, books, papers, and other writings, touching the premises, which shall be in the custody of them or any of them.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you, or any three or more of you, upon inquiry into the premises, do certify to us from time to time, under your hands and seals, your several proceedings as the same shall be completed, and do, within the space of fourteen calendar months after the date of these presents, or sooner if the same can reasonably be, certify unto Us, in like manner, the whole of your proceedings under and by virtue of these presents, together with what you shall find touching or concerning the premises upon such inquiry as aforesaid.

And We further will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We hereby command all and singular the Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, Officers, Ministers, and all other Our loving subjects whatsoever, as well within liberties as without, that they be assistant to you and each of you in the execution of these presents.

And for your assistance in the due execution of this Our Commission, We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved George Augustus Chichester May, Esquire, one of Our Counsel learned in the Law, and David Basil Dunne, Esquire, to be Secretaries to this Our Commission, and to attend you whose services and assistance We require you to use from time to time as occasion shall require.

In witness whereof, we have caused these Our letters to be made patent.

resident at Hamburg, inclosing copy of an Ordinance of the King of Prussia, dated December 30, 1867, applying, from the date of its publication, the Tariff and Regulations of the Zollverein to the Duchy of Lauenburg.

SECTION I.

The Laws and Ordinances hereunto appended, viz.:—

SECTION II.

The Law published in the Collection of Laws of the Confederation (No. 6, page 41), concerning the levy of the duty on salt, comes into force on the same day.

SECTION III.

No duty will be levied henceforth on goods in transit through the Duchy of Lauenburg.

SECTION IV.

All enactments contrary to the present Ordinance are hereby abolished. Until further notice, this Ordinance shall have no application to the Feudal Estate of Stintenberg, which is separated from the other parts of the Duchy by the Schall Lake.

No personal application can receive attention.

ST. HELEN'S (ISLE OF WIGHT).—ORDER DIVIDING PARTS OF PARISH INTO SPECIAL DRAINAGE DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS a Petition has been duly presented to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, under the provisions of the Sewage Utilization Act, 1867, and the Sanitary Act, 1866, signed by ratepayers of parts of the parish of St. Helen's, in the Isle of Wight, not included in the district of the Ryde Local Board of Health, praying for the settlement of the boundaries of Special Drainage Districts for the purposes of the Acts aforesaid:

And whereas, in pursuance of such Acts, and of the said Petition, I have directed inquiry to be made into the circumstances of the case, and report has been made thereon by Arnold Taylor, Esq., the Inspector appointed by me for such purpose:

Now, therefore, I, having taken the said circumstances and report into consideration, do hereby, under the authority conferred on me by the aforesaid Acts, order and direct that from and after the date hereof, all that part of the parish of St. Helen's, in the Isle of Wight, which is not under the jurisdiction or within the district of the Ryde Local Board of Health, and as hereinafter described, shall be divided, for the purposes of such Acts, into four Special Drainage Districts, to be styled respectively the Special Drainage District of St. John's; the Special Drainage District of Spring Vale; the Special Drainage District of Sea View; and the Special Drainage District of St. Helen's; and that the boundaries of such districts be as are hereinafter described; viz.:—

No. 1. That the boundaries of the St. John's Special Drainage District shall consist of all that portion of the parish of St. Helen's that is not under the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health of Ryde, and that lies west of the Bridle-road, which commences on the sea shore at the north-east corner of the Apley estate, at its junction with the boundary line of the town of Ryde, under the Ryde Improvement Act, 1854, and also west of the High-road, leading to Brading, until such High-road reaches the boundary line which divides the parish of St. Helen's from the parish of Brading, at West Ridge Cross, such Special Drainage District being bounded on the north by the sea, and on the south by the parish.

No. 2. That the Spring Vale Special Drainage District consist of all that part of the parish of St. Helen's, which lies to the eastward of the easterly boundary line of the St. John's Special Drainage District, and westward of a line commencing on the sea shore at the Saltern Marsh Sluice, and passing thence, southerly, along and excluding the trench which runs on the east side of the properties numbered 284, 285, 286, 289, 297, 353, 321, 325, and 324, on the tithe map of St.

Helen's parish, until it reaches the boundary line which separates the parish of St. Helen's from the parish of Brading, at the south side of such last named property, such Special Drainage District of Spring Vale being bounded on the north by the sea, and on the south by the parish of Brading.

No. 3. That the Sea View Special Drainage District consist of all that part of St. Helen's parish which lies to the eastward of the easterly boundary line of the Spring Vale Special Drainage District, and westward of a line commencing on the sea shore at a point where the watercourse divides the Priory and the Sea Grove Estates, and passing thence, southerly, along and including such watercourse, to the north-west corner of the property numbered 467 on the tithe map of St. Helen's parish, and thence, southwardly, along the western boundary fences of such last numbered property, and of the property numbered 468 on such tithe map, to a point opposite the south corner of St. Helen's Churchyard, and thence, southwardly, including such churchyard, to the boundary line which separates the parish of St. Helen's from the parish of Brading, such Special Drainage District of Sea View being bounded on the north by the sea, and on the south by the parish of Brading.

No. 4. That the St. Helen's Special Drainage District consist of the remainder of the parish of St. Helen's which has not been otherwise set out and described.
