THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Rio de Janeiro, a translation of a Decree, dated 27th November, 1867, of the Brazilian Government, which continues till the end of December, 1868, the disposition of the Decree of 27th March, 1867, which permitted foreign vessels to carry on the coasting trade in that country between ports at which there were Custom-houses.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Rio de Janeiro, the annexed translation of a Decree of the Brazilian Government, dated 20th November, 1867, establishing a new copper coinage:—

ART. 1. For the substitution of the copper coin which is at present in circulation, coin shall be struck, containing 95 parts of copper, 4 of tin, and 1 of zinc.

ART. 2. The new coin shall have the following value, weight, and diameter:—

Value in Reis.	Weight in Grammas.	Diameter in Millimeters.
20	7	25
10	3.5	20

ART. 3. The difference in weight allowed shall be more or less of 2 cents in such coin, and of 1 cent for the copper, and half a cent for each one of the other metals in the composition of the alloy.

ART. 4. The coin of which Art. 2 treats shall have the likeness of the Emperor on the face with the date of the coinage on the edge below; for inscription, the same as that on the silver coin, in conformity with Art. 3 of Decree, No 3966 of 30th September of the current year;

on the reverse the Imperial Crown over the arms of the Empire, and on one side the figures which represent the respective value, on the other, the word *Reis* abbreviated.

Sole Paragraph.—The rim of said coin shall be smooth.

ART. 5. In conformity with Art. 3, the new coin shall be given and received in payment to the amount of 200 Rs., which is the value of the smallest silver coin; and this in conformity with Art. 3 before-mentioned of Law No. 1083 of 22nd August, 1860.

ART. 6. The Minister of Finance putting in execution Sections 3, 4, and 5 of the afore-mentioned 3rd Art. of Law, No. 1083, shall definitively regulate by instructions, the form and conditions of the substitution of the copper coin which is in actual circulation, as well as the time at which the coin shall cease to be legal currency.

ART. 7. The dispositions to the contrary are revoked.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Mexico, inclosing copy and translation of a Mexican Decree, dated 28th November, 1867, which introduces certain changes into the standard of money at present in use in the Republic, based on the exclusive adoption of the decimal system of coinage.

The dollar is retained as the unit of currency in the Republic, and is subdivided into centavos, the centavo to be of copper. The silver coinage is to consist of pieces of the value of 1 dollar, 25 centavos, 10 centavos, and 5 centavos, respectively. The gold coinage is to consist of pieces of the value of 20 dollars, 10 dollars, 5 dollars, 2½ dollars, and 1 dollar, respectively.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Sovereign Lady the Queen, holden at the town of Hertford, in and for the county of Hertford, on Monday, the 30th day of December, 1867, and continued from thence to and holden by adjournment at the same place, in and for the same county, on Tuesday, the 31st day of December, in the year aforesaid.

Whereas the Earl Cowper, the Lord Dacre, Baron Dimsdale, Foster Alleyne McGeachey, Esq., William Robert Baker, Esq., Lieutenant-Colonel R. Hindley Wilkinson, and Lionel Ames, Esq., five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said county, did, by writing under their hands, dated the 27th day of November, 1867, require the Clerk of the Peace of the said county, to add to or send with the notice required by law, to be given of the holding of the then next and now present Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace for the said county, a notice in the form marked A in the schedule to the Act 25 and 26 Vic., cap. 61, "for the better management of highways in England" (or as near thereto as circumstances would admit), that at such Court of General or Quarter Sessions a proposal would be made to the Justices then and there assembled to divide the said county, or such parts thereof as are included in the parishes or places therein and hereinafter mentioned into the highway districts, therein and also hereinafter mentioned or specified. And whereas the said Justices did also require the Clerk of the Peace to send by post in a prepaid letter notices in the form aforesaid to the churchwardens or overseers of each and every of the parishes in the said requisition mentioned. And whereas upon due proof of the publication of the statutable notice in that behalf required by the said Act in the Herts Guardian and Herts Mercury Newspapers of the 21st and 28th December, 1867, and of the sending of a notice in the form aforesaid to the churchwardens and overseers of every parish mentioned in the said notice, this Court hath entertained the proposal for dividing the said county or such parts thereof as are included in the parishes or places hereinafter mentioned into the Highway Districts hereinafter mentioned or specified; Now, therefore, this Court doth in pursuance of the powers vested in it in that behalf provisionally order that the said county or such parts thereof as are included in the parishes or places hereinafter mentioned shall be divided into the several Highway Districts for the more convenient management of Highways, hereinafter mentioned or specified, that is to say:—

First. That the parishes or places and parts of parishes or places mentioned or referred to in the first schedule hereunder written (save and except as therein excepted) shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of Highways, and that such District shall be known by the name of "The Hitchin Highway District."

Secondly. That the several parishes or places and parts of parishes or places mentioned in the second schedule hereunder written shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of Highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Buntingford Highway District."

Thirdly. That the several parishes or places and parts of parishes or places mentioned in the third schedule hereunder written shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management

of Highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Hatfield Highway District."

Fourthly. That the several parishes or places and parts of parishes or places mentioned in the fourth schedule hereunder written (save and except as therein excepted) shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of Highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Hertford Highway District."

Fifthly. That the several parishes or places, and parts of parishes or places, mentioned in the fifth schedule hereunder written (save and except as therein excepted), shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Hadham Highway District."

Sixthly. That the several parishes or places, and parts of parishes and places, mentioned in the sixth schedule hereunder written, shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Hemel Hempstead Highway District."

Seventhly. That the several parishes or places, and parts of parishes or places, mentioned in the seventh schedule hereunder written (save and except as therein excepted), shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The St. Alban's Highway District."

Eighthly. That the several parishes or places, and parts of parishes or places, mentioned in the eighth schedule hereunder written (save and except as therein excepted), shall be a Highway District for the more convenient management of highways, and that such district shall be known by the name of "The Watford Highway District."

This Court doth except out of this Provisional Order such of the parishes and places, and such parts of the parishes and places, hereinafter mentioned, as are by the said Act directed not to be included in any highway district formed in pursuance thereof.

And further, this Court doth provisionally order that one waywarden shall be elected for each of the said several parishes or places, and parts of parishes or places, mentioned in the said several schedules hereunder written.

And this Court doth order and appoint that the confirmation of this Provisional Order by a Final Order will be taken into consideration of the Court of General or Quarter Sessions of the Peace to be holden for the said county, by adjournment, on Tuesday, the 7th day of April next.
