WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant and convey to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Waldershare, with the perpetual curacy of Whitfield annexed, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same benefice, all those tithe commutation rentcharges, with their appurtenances, which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and are now vested in us, to have and to hold the said tithe commutation rent charges, with their appurtenances, to the use of the said Incumbent, and his successors, for ever: Provided always, that the said tithe commutation rent charges, with their appurtenances, so granted and conveyed by us as aforesaid, shall be and be held to be in lieu of and in substitution for the yearly sums or stipends amounting together to seventy pounds, heretofore payable by us to the Incumbent of the same benefice in respect of property which formerly belonged to the Archbishoprick of Canterbury, and shall also be charged and chargeable at all times for ever hereafter in exoneration of all other property, wher soever or whatsoever, which formerly belonged to the said Archbishoprick, with the liability to repair and maintain the chancel of the parish church of Waldershare: and provided also that the Incumbent for the time being of the same benefice shall be entitled to receive from us, or on our account, the net amount of the rents, profits and proceeds of the said tithe commutation rent charges, with their appurtenances, as from the first day of October, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our common seal this sixteenth day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
