WITH reference to the notice inserted in the London Gazette of Friday last, stating that a despatch had been received at this department through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Washington, and in which it was announced that the Bill for the suspension during the present year of the internal tax on cotton had been passed by the American Senate, the Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received a further despatch from Washington, reporting that the announcement was premature, as the Bill has not yet passed through all its stages.

## OFFICIAL NOTICE.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1867," as follows ; viz. :--
