

chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and of the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury, both in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the eleventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, and published in the London Gazette on the twenty-fifth day of October, in the same year, a part of the parish of Dewsbury, in the said county and diocese, was assigned as a district chapelry to the church of the Holy Trinity, situate at Batley Carr, in the same parish, and such district chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, has, under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, since become a new parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of your Majesty in Council, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and published in the London Gazette on the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, certain contiguous portions of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and of the said parish of Dewsbury, were assigned as a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Mark, situate in the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and such consolidated chapelry is called 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury.'

"And whereas it has been proposed to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury, should be respectively altered in manner and from the date hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, as such Bishop, and also as patron, in right of his See, of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury, and with the consent of the Right Honourable Edward Geoffrey, Earl of Derby, First Lord of your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of your Majesty as the patron in right of the crown of the vicarage of the parish of Dewsbury aforesaid, and with the consent of the Reverend Arthur Drummond Wilkins, Clerk, the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said parish of Dewsbury, and as such vicar or incumbent, the patron of the perpetual curacy of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and with the consent of the Reverend Samuel Vaughan, Clerk, the incumbent of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that, in our opinion, it would be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and of the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury, should without any proceeding or any assurance in the law other than this representation, and any duly gazetted Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, be respectively altered so as to dis sever from the said new parish, and annex to the said consolidated chapelry, all that part of the said new parish of the

Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green, provided that such alteration, severance, and annexation, shall take effect upon and from the day of the date of the avoidance which shall next hereafter take place in the incumbency of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, and not sooner.

"And we humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration; and to make such Order in respect thereto, as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The territory proposed to be annexed to the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury (sometime part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, and of the parish of Dewsbury, in the same county and diocese), being:—

"All that part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, which is bounded on the south-east, and on the greater part of the south-west, by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury aforesaid, and on all other sides, that is to say, on the remaining part of the south-west, on the north, and on the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry from the said new parish, at the junction of that part of the Wakefield and Halifax turnpike-road which is called Maulkroyd-lane with the footpath leading to Upper Boothroyd; and extending thence, northward, for a distance of one chain, or thereabouts, diagonally across the said turnpike-road, to a boundary stone inscribed 'D. St. M. C. C., 1867,' and placed on the north-eastern side of the bridge or culvert which carries the same turnpike-road over a certain dyke or watercourse which flows past the northern side of the Cottage of Content into the Batley Carr Beck; and extending thence, first south-eastward, and then eastward, along the middle of the said dyke or watercourse, to its junction near the Dewsbury Gas Works with Batley Carr Beck aforesaid; and continuing thence, first eastward, and then north-eastward, along the middle of the said beck, to a point in the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries the Dewsbury and Gomersal turnpike-road over the same beck; and extending thence, southward, for a distance of five chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the last-named turnpike-road, as far as a point upon the boundary which divides the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Batley Carr, from the consolidated chapelry of Saint Mark, Dewsbury, as aforesaid, opposite to the eastern end of Carlton-street."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Ripon.
