PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's appro-

bation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

The State apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at two o'clock.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

Greeting:

Whereas We have thought it expedient, for divers good causes and considerations, that a Commission should forthwith issue for the purpose of enquiring into the constitution and practice of Courts-Martial in Our Army, and the present system of punishment for military offences. Now know ye, that We reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, discretion, and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these presents authorize and appoint you, the said John Wilson Patten, Spencer Compton Cavendish, commonly called Marquess of Hartington, Charles, Viscount Eversley, Jonathan Peel, John Robert Mowbray, Thomas Emerson Headlam, Russell Gurney, Sir James Yorke Scarlett, Sir Alfred Hastings Horsford, Henry Eyre, and Samuel Whitbread, or any three or more of you, to be Our Commissioners for making the enquiry aforesaid. And We do hereby authorize and empower you Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, to obtain information thereupon by the examination of all persons most competent by reason of their knowledge, habits, or experience, to afford it; and also by calling for all documents, papers, and records which may appear to you, or any three or

more of you, calculated to assist your researches, and to promote the formation of a sound judgment on the subject. And We do hereby require and command you, or any three or more of you, to report to us, under your hands and seals, with all convenient speed, your opinions in what respects the administration of Criminal Justice in the Army admits of improvement, either as regards the constitution or the practice of Courts-Martial, and what changes or modifications it may be desirable to make in the punishments now applicable to offences committed by the soldier, without danger to the paramount consideration of maintaining discipline and effectually repressing crime in the ranks of the British Army throughout all the various contingencies of military service to which Our troops are necessarily liable. And We will and command, and by these presents ordain, that this, Our Commission, shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Mayors, Bailiffs, Constables, Officers, Ministers, and all other Our loving subjects whatsoever, as well within liberties as without, that they be assistant to you and each of you in the execution of these presents. And for your assistance in the due execution of these presents We have made choice of Our trusty and well beloved John Lloyd Wharton, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose service and assistance we require you to use from time to time as occasion shall require. In witness whereof we have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received, from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Madrid, inclosing a Decree of the Spanish Government, dated 1st March, by which the exportation by sea or land of wheat, maize, barley, rye, flour, rice, and potatoes is prohibited in the Peninsula and Balearic Islands. This prohibition does not refer to the coasting trade carried on between the ports of the peninsula.

By Art. III. of this Decree ships already laden with the articles above mentioned, and those which are on the point of being laden in Spanish ports upon the publication of this Decree, are allowed to take their cargoes freely out of the Kingdom.
