## PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing

Rooms, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Rooms, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

THIS day the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of London, some Members of the Court of Aldermen, the Sheriffs, some Members of the Court of Common Council, the Recorder, the Town Clerk, the Remembrancer, the Keeper and the Deputy Keeper of the Guildhall, waited upon Her Majesty with the following Address, which was handed to Her Majesty:—

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty,

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London, in Common Council assembled, desire to offer to your Majesty the expression of our affectionate loyalty to your Majesty's throne and person, and attachment to the institutions under which we have the happiness to live.

We have learned, with feelings of indignation and sorrow, that attempts have been made, by certain desperate men, to interfere with the due course of law, and that in the prosecution of their wicked designs the lives of some of your Majesty's innocent subjects have been sacrificed.

We cannot but feel that it is the first duty of the Government, assisted by the ardent enthusiasm of a loyal and order loving people in the exercise of the constitutional authority with which they are armed, to protect by all lawful means the lives and property of your Majesty's peaceable subjects, and to maintain the authority of the law.

We desire to assure your Majesty that the citizens of London will be ever ready to support

the constituted authorities of this country in their endeavours to uphold the law, and to preserve order within this realm, and to suppress all disloyal conspiracies of bodies of men who, under the name of Fenians, are bonded together for revolutionary purposes.

"I feel confident that in My endeavours to maintain the authority of the law, and to repress such crimes, I shall never fail to receive your cordial support."
