The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the seventh year of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the better government of Her Majesty's subjects resorting to "China," it is (amongst other things) enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by any Order or Orders made with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, to ordain, for the government of Her Majesty's subjects being within the dominions of the Emperor of China, or being within any ship or vessel at a distance of not more than one hundred miles from the coast of China, any law or ordinance which to Her Majesty may seem meet, as fully and effectually as any such law or ordinance could be made by Her Majesty in Council for the government of Her Majesty's subjects being within the Island of Hong Kong :

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, by Order in Council of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, to ordain (amongst other things), that when a British subject, being after the commencement of that Order in Hong Kong, should be charged with having committed any such crime or offence as therein mentioned within a British vessel at a distance of not more than one hundred miles from the coast of China, or within a Chinese or Japanese vessel at such a distance as aforesaid, or within a vessel not lawfully entitled to claim the protection of the Flag of any State at such a distance as aforesaid, the Supreme Court at Hong Kong should have and might exercise authority and jurisdiction with respect to the crime or offence as fully as if it had been committed in Hong Kong, and that, save as expressly provided by the said Order, all jurisdiction, power, and authority of the Supreme Court of Hong Kong exercisable in relation to British subjects resident in

or resorting to China or Japan should absolutely cease :

And whereas it has seemed to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to be expedient to extend the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Hong Kong in respect to matters arising in the neighbourhood of the colony of Hong Kong :

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said recited Act, or otherwise, vested in Her, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. In addition to the powers now vested in the said Supreme Court of Hong Kong, the said Supreme Court may have jurisdiction over and take cognizance of all crimes and offences committed by British subjects at any place on land being within six miles of any part of the colony of Hong Kong, and not being on the mainland of China, and of and over all disputes and differences between British subjects being in any such place within such limit as aforesaid ; and the said Court shall and may deal with, try, hear, and determine all such cases as fully and effectually as if such crimes or offences had been committed, or such disputes or differences had arisen by or between British subjects within the said colony of Hong Kong.

2. The said Order in Council of the ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, shall, except so far as it is affected by this Order in Council, remain in full force and effect.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Buckingham and Chandos, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a certain part of Governor's-street in Gibraltar should be widened, and whereas the Sanitary Commissioners of Gibraltar have entered into a certain agreement upon the terms hereinafter mentioned with one Henry Thornton as Attorney and Agent for, and acting on behalf of, Henry Blanckley Harrington Rogers, late Captain of Her Majesty's 11th Regiment of Foot, Esquire, commonly called Colonel Rogers and others, as the owners of a piece or parcel of land situate on the east side of Governor's-street aforesaid, and bounded on the north by other premises of, and belonging to, or reputed to belong to, the said Henry Blanckley Harrington Rogers and others, and on the east by premises of, and belonging to, or reputed to belong to, one Teresa Dagnino, and on the south by premises of, and belonging to, or reputed to belong to, one Joseph Imossi, and delineated or drawn on a map or plan thereof in the schedule to this Order in Council, part of which said piece or parcel of land is marked A 1 thereon, and part whereof is marked A 2 and coloured brown, and other part whereof is marked A 3 and coloured blue thereon for the absolute purchase of the said part thereof A 2, and for the price or sum of one thousand and forty-four

dollars, for the purpose of being dedicated to the public as and becoming part of Governor's-street, which said agreement is conditional upon their obtaining the powers and authorities hereby granted to and vested in them, and upon the purchase by Her Majesty and dedication as a public highway of the part of the said piece of land marked A 3 and coloured blue as aforesaid.

1. It is therefore hereby ordered by Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that this Order in Council shall take effect and come into operation forthwith.

2. In citing this Order in Council in other Orders in Council, in local Ordinances, in Acts of Parliament, and in all legal instruments and proceedings made, done, or taken in pursuance of this Order in Council, it shall be sufficient to use the words "The Order in Council for Widening Governor's-street, Gibraltar, 1868."

3. The said part of the said piece or parcel of land, which is so marked A 3 on the said map or plan when and so soon as the same shall have been purchased by Her Majesty, is, by this Order in Council, ordered and declared to be without any conveyance thereof by Her Majesty, and without other title than this Order in Council vested in the said Commissioners, and to be thenceforth deemed and taken to all intents and purposes to be part of Governor's-street, and part of the public highway there vested in the said Commissioners, under and by virtue of the Sanitary Order in Council, Gibraltar, 1865; and shall be deemed to all intents and purposes to be subject to all the provisions therein contained relating to public highways in Gibraltar, and to the control and management, maintenance, repairs, paving, altering, lighting, draining, scavenging, and cleansing thereof, and to the traffic therein, thereon, or through the same, and also further subject to all the powers, authorities, duties, rules, and regulations granted to, vested in, or authorised to be exercised, or to be made by the Governor, or by the said Commissioners in like manner as if the said last-mentioned part of the said piece or parcel of land had been a public highway at the time when the said Sanitary Order in Council took effect and came into operation, and been thereby included therein, and thereby vested in the said Commissioners.

4. It shall be lawful for the Commissioners, and they are hereby required with all convenient speed to raise any sum not exceeding fifteen hundred dollars, under and by virtue of the Order in Council to authorize the Sanitary Commissioners in Gibraltar to raise money for public purposes, to be applied by them in and about the disbursement of their costs, charges, and expenses of preparing plans and books of reference, and otherwise relating to the said piece or parcel of land, and the purchase of part or parts thereof, and of the carrying this Order in Council into execution, and in payment of the purchase money hereby authorized.

5. If the Commissioners shall wilfully neglect or refuse to raise the capital hereby authorised, or so much thereof as may be necessary to enable them to carry this Order in Council into execution, or wilfully neglect and omit to pay or tender the purchase money to the said Henry Thornton, they and each and every of them shall be personally liable to pay the same to the said Henry Thornton, together with compensation for and his costs occasioned by their wilful default.

6. When and so soon as the Commissioners shall have raised a sufficient sum to enable them to pay the said purchase money, and to defray all their costs, charges, and expenses by them theretofore expended, paid, or incurred and authorised, to be

paid out of capital, they shall and are hereby required to tender and pay, and the said Henry Thornton is hereby required to accept and receive the sum of 1,044 dollars, in full payment and discharge of the purchase money for the said part of the said piece or parcel of ground delineated or drawn in the map or plan in the schedule to this Order in Council, marked A 2 thereon, and to give a receipt on parchment in duplicate to the Commissioners. Upon production whereof to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, he the said Registrar shall forthwith register one of such receipts, and shall indorse on the other thereof a certificate of such registration under his hand and the seal of the Court, together with the date thereof, and deliver the same so endorsed to the Commissioners; and if the said Henry Thornton shall die or shall refuse, or become incapable or otherwise neglect or omit to accept or to receive the same, it shall be lawful to the Commissioners to pay the amount, free of any charge, into the Supreme Court, and thereupon the Registrar of the Court shall, and is hereby required to sign such receipts on parchment, in duplicate, one of which he is hereby required to register and to deliver the other to the Commissioners, having first indorsed in like manner as aforesaid a certificate under his hand and the seal of the Court of such registration, together with the date thereof in either case; every such receipt so registered or so indorsed shall be conclusive evidence of the Title of the Commissioners, without further proof; and all Courts, Judges, Justices, and all persons whatsoever shall be required to take notice thereof.

7. And from and immediately after any such registration as aforesaid, all the right, title, and interest of Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, and of all and every person and persons claiming through or under Her or them, or otherwise howsoever, of, in, or to the said part of the said last-mentioned part of the said piece or parcel of land, shall be and become vested in the said Commissioners, and be thenceforth deemed and taken, to all intents and purposes, to be part of Governor's-street, and part of the public highway, there vested in the said Commissioners under and by virtue of the Sanitary Order in Council, Gibraltar, 1865, and shall be deemed, to all intents and purposes, to be subject to all the provisions therein contained relating to public highways in Gibraltar, and to the control and management, and the maintenance, repairs, paving, altering, lighting, draining, scavenging, and cleansing thereof, and to the traffic therein, thereon, or through the same, and also further subject to all the powers, authorities, duties, rules, and regulations granted to, vested in, or authorized to be exercised or to be made by the Governor or by the said Commissioners, in like manner as if the said last-mentioned part of the said piece or parcel of land had been a public highway at the time when the said Sanitary Order in Council took effect and came into operation, and been thereby included therein and thereby vested in the said Commissioners.

8. Provided always, and it is hereby expressly ordered, that nothing herein contained shall prejudice, derogate from, or affect the right, title, or interest of any person or persons whatsoever of, in, or to the said part of the said piece or parcel of land, as between him or them and the said Henry Thornton, or any right or remedy which he or they might, could, or would have or have had against the said Henry Thornton, either under and by virtue of this Order in Council, or if this Order in Council had not been made; and the said purchase money and all and every other sums

of money in any way relating to the said Henry Thornton, under and by virtue of this Order in Council, shall, as between such owners and the said Henry Thornton, be, and be deemed and taken to be, to all intents and purposes, money had and received by him for and to the use of the person or persons having a good and valid title at law to the land, and shall be subject to all the same uses and trusts affecting the said land, or to the like uses and trusts as nearly as may be conformable to the law.

9. One moiety of the capital and of the interest thereon shall be charged, and the costs, charges, and expenses of the Commissioners relating thereto shall be charged upon the premises, the owners and occupiers of which will be benefitted by reason of improved access thereto, or otherwise by the widening of Governor's-street, for which purpose the Sanitary Commissioners shall rate and assess to the payment of such moiety of the capital, and payment of the interest thereon, and their costs, charges, and expenses relating thereto; every person liable to be rated and assessed to the General Sanitary Purposes Rates in respect of any premises on either side of Governor's-street, or in the immediate neighbourhood thereof, which, by reason of improved access or otherwise, shall, in their opinion, be benefitted by the widening of Governor's-street, provided that it shall not be lawful to rate and assess to the repayment of such moiety, or to the payment of such interest on such moiety, or such costs, charges, and expenses any person in respect of the piece or parcel of land marked A 1 in the schedule to this Order in Council.

10. Every such rate shall be called a Governor's-street Improvement Rate, and, after fourteen days' notice at the least left on the premises so assessed, the Commissioners shall be authorized to levy and collect the sums so assessed in the same manner and with the same remedies; in case of default of payment, as other rates are by the said Order in Council leviable and recoverable, and with the same right and power of appeal against the amount of such assessment and against the liability to be assessed, reserved to the persons assessed as by the said Order in Council, is given to the party grieved by any General Sanitary Purposes Rate.

11. Every rate and assessment hereby authorized shall be made and assessed in the same manner and form as a General Sanitary Purposes Rate, the title of such rate excepted; and a declaration shall be made and signed at the foot thereof in like manner as is required to be signed at the foot of every General Sanitary Purposes Rate; and until and unless the same shall be so made, assessed, and signed, shall be of no force, effect, or virtue.

12. If any Commissioner shall sign any such declaration which shall be wilfully untrue, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanour, and shall be liable, on conviction thereof by or before any Court of Criminal Jurisdiction in Gibraltar, to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding two years, or, at the discretion of the Court, to forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding five hundred dollars.

13. Any person who shall remove from any premises liable to any such last-mentioned rate and assessment, after the making of any such rate or assessment hereby authorised, leaving any rate so assessed due and unpaid, or who shall remove any of his goods from such premises in order to avoid a distress thereon, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

14. The Commissioners shall pay and apply all and every the sums and sum of money to be by

them collected or levied and received by them for and on account of any such last-mentioned rate, in the first place to defray all costs, charges, and expenses by them paid or recovered in relation to such rate, and in the next place to pay such moiety of the capital and of the interest thereon, and the costs, charges and expenses of the Commissioners in relation thereto, and not otherwise.

15. Every penalty or forfeiture hereby imposed, or rate hereby authorized to be made, and which may become payable to the Sanitary Commissioners, may be recovered by summary proceedings in the same manner and with the same remedies in case of default of payment as penalties and forfeitures are by the Sanitary Order in Council, Gibraltar, 1865, recoverable, and with the same right of appeal as by the said Order in Council is given to a party grieved.

16. And the said Sanitary Order in Council, and a certain other Order in Council, made and passed on the day of the making and passing of this Order in Council, to authorize the Sanitary Commissioners of Gibraltar to raise money for public purposes, save and except so far as may be inconsistent with, or varied or altered by this Order in Council, are, and each of them is hereby ordered to be, and to be deemed and taken to be, to all intents and purposes, incorporated with, and to be construed and read together with the provisions herein contained, as one Order in Council.

17. The Schedule to this Order in Council annexed is, and is to be deemed and taken to be, part of this same Order.

18. And the Most Noble the Duke of Buckingham and Chandos, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Whereas we were pleased to issue a Warrant or Commission under Our Royal Sign Manual, dated the seventh day of October, 1854, directed to certain Commissioners therein named and constituting the Royal Commission of the Patriotic Fund) hereinafter referred to as Our Original Commission) :

And whereas Our Original Commission recited that amidst the glorious Successes which, through the Power of Almighty God, had attended Our Arms during the then present War, many Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines serving in Our Armies and Fleets had gallantly fallen in battle, or by other casualties, during the War ; and many who should thereafter be engaged in conflict or in further prosecution of hostilities might also nobly sacrifice their lives in Our Service while protecting the invaded liberties of Our Ally and repressing the lawless ambition of Our enemies.

And whereas Our Original Commission also recited that it had been represented to Us, that many of Our loving Subjects throughout Our Kingdom and Dominions, actuated by a just sense of the sacred rights of those who fall in their country's service, and in support of Our just cause of War, were anxiously desirous of testifying their loyalty and love to Us and to Our Throne, by a just and generous benevolence towards the Widows and Orphans of those of Our Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines who had been so killed, or who might thereafter die amidst the ravages and casualties of War, and also by their gifts and subscriptions to contribute a portion of those means with which Our Nation had been blessed towards the succouring, educating, and relieving those who, by the loss of their husbands and parents in battle, or by death on active service in the then present War, were unable to maintain or to support themselves :

And whereas Our Original Commission further recited that it was expedient that public measures should be taken, and that preparation should be made for the safe keeping and beneficial application of the several sums of money which might thenceforth and from time to time thereafter, during the continuance of that Our Royal Commission, be given, subscribed, or collected for all or any of the several purposes aforesaid : And also for the purpose of securing such prompt and authentic information as might be required to aid the just and faithful distribution of the said several sums of money when so received : And that it had also appeared to Us that, by issuing that Our Royal

Commisson, greater efficacy, power, and support might be given to the benevolent desires of Our loving Subjects; And also that the respective claims, merits, and necessities of individual claimants would be duly inquired into: And that by permitting assistance to be rendered by the Officers of Our Civil, Military, and Naval Services, We might prevent the wrong application, by misrepresentation or otherwise, of those contributions which Our loving Subjects might thereafter, during the continuance of that Our Royal Commission, for the several purposes aforesaid, generously and benevolently supply:

And whereas, by Our Original Commission, We did make known to Our Commissioners therein named, that We, having taken into Our consideration the premises, and being earnestly desirous, in lasting memory of those who had faithfully fallen in Our Service, to encourage the loyal and hearty benevolence of Our loving subjects, which might thereafter be directed towards the Widows and Orphans of the Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines of Our Forces who might then or thereafter be serving abroad in Our Armies and Fleets, or in services connected with Our then present hostilities, and for other the several purposes thereinbefore recited or mentioned, and reposing great trust and confidence in the fidelity, discretion, and integrity of Our Commissioners therein named, had authorized and appointed, and did by that Our Original Commission authorize and appoint, you the said Duke of Somerset; The said Duke of Wellington; The said Earl of Shaftesbury; The said Earl of Dalhousie; the said Earl of Hardwicke; the said Earl of Chichester; the said Earl Nelson; The said Earl Grey; The said Baron Fermoy; The said Baron Saint Leonards; The said Baron Lyveden; The said Baron Rokeby; The said James Lindsay; The said Sir John Somerset Pakington; The said Henry Thomas Lowry Corry; The said Sir John Fox Burgoyne; The said Sir Hew Dalrymple Ross; The said Lord Mayor of Our City of London; The said Thomas Baring; The said John Gellibrand Hubbard; and the said John Ball; together with certain other persons therein named, to make full and diligent inquiry into the best mode of aiding the loyalty and benevolence of Our loving subjects, and of ascertaining the best means by which the gifts, subscriptions, and contributions of Our loving subjects could be best applied according to the generous intentions of the donor thereof, and from time to time to apply the same as Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, should think fit, or direct, either for the immediate relief of such special objects of destitution as might come within the meaning and purpose of such benevolence, or for any of the purposes aforesaid, to increase, extend, or make additions to any of Our Royal or other Charitable Institutions already founded for similar purposes within Our United Kingdom. And further to apply or to order and direct the application of all such moneys in such manner as to Our said Commissioners, or to any three or more of them, should seem fit in the premises, so that they should in all things secure the most impartial and beneficial distribution of all such sums as might thereafter, and from time to time, be received under or by virtue of that Our Royal Commission.

And Whereas, by Our Original Commission, We did further give and grant to Our said Commissioners divers powers and authorities therein described, and did give divers directions for the better execution of the duties of Our said Commissioners.

And whereas, by Our Original Commission, We did command Our Paymaster-General for the time being to open and keep a separate account at the Bank of England, and to pay to the credit of such account, which (We did thereby direct), should be called and known by the name of THE PATRIOTIC FUND, all and every sum and sums of money which he might at any time thereafter receive under or by virtue of that Our Commission.

And whereas, by Our Original Commission, for the purpose (among others) of carrying into effect what Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, should thereafter direct to be done in respect of the said Subscriptions, donations, and collections, We did authorize Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, to nominate and appoint any three or more persons whomsoever, as to them should seem meet, to be an Executive Committee in the premises; and We thereby declared Our Pleasure to be that such Executive Committee should also be a Finance Committee, with power to select their own Chairman, and having the direction and control of such Orders and Regulations as might thereafter from time to time be made by Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, over the receipts and expenditure of the said several sums of money which from time to time during the continuance of such Our Commission, might be collected; and that, subject to such Orders and Regulations, the said Executive and Finance Committee, or any two or more of them, should and might order and direct the payment and disbursement of any sum or sums so to be received by Our Paymaster-General to the account of The Patriotic Fund; and We thereby declared it to be Our further Will and Pleasure that Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, should from time to time according to their discretion, fill up any such vacancies as might occur in such Executive and Finance Committee as occasion should require, and that the said Executive and Finance Committee, or any three of them, inclusive of their Chairman for the time being, if he should be then present, should from time to time and at all times report to them, the said Commissioners, as and when they might desire, all matters and things which they should or might have done in the premises.

And whereas, by Our Original Commission, We declared Our further Will and Pleasure to be that Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of them, when as so often as need or occasion should require, so long as Our Original Commission should continue in force, should report to Us in writing under their Hands and Seals respectively, all and every of the several proceedings of Our said Commissioners, had by virtue of Our Original Commission, together with such other matters, if any, as might be deserving of Our Royal Consideration touching or concerning the premises.

And whereas Our said Commissioners proceeded to execute the powers and to discharge the duties conferred and imposed on them by Our Original Commission.

And whereas an Act of Parliament has been passed called The Patriotic Fund Act, 1867.

And whereas by that Act it is recited to the effect (among other things) that the Executive Committee of Our said Commissioners had appropriated part of The Patriotic Fund for the Erection and Endowment of a Girls' School, known as The Royal Victoria Patriotic Asylum, and had appropriated other part of the Fund for the En-

dowment of a Boys' School, and had appropriated other parts of the Fund for the purposes described in the Schedule to that Act, and that the appropriations aforesaid had been adopted by Our said Commissioners, and had been from time to time approved by Us, or been specified in the Reports of Our said Commissioners made to Us, and laid before the Houses of Parliament.

And whereas the said Schedule to the said Act is in the words following (that is to say):

Appropriations of Patriotic Fund (except for Victoria Asylum and Boys' School).

1. The sum of two thousand five hundred pounds sterling invested in the purchase of two thousand seven hundred and forty-seven pounds five shillings and one penny New Three Pounds per Centum in the names of Lord Colchester and Lieutenant-Colonel James Lindsay, and of William Hillyar and Harry Lord Richards, and held under the trusts, declared by a Deed Poll of the ninth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, to secure in perpetuity, on the nomination of the Royal Commissioners, the admission of Thirteen Boys, Sons of Soldiers, Sailors, or Marines of Her Majesty's Service, into the Royal, Naval, and Military Free School at Devonport.
2. The sum of two thousand five hundred pounds sterling invested in the purchase of two thousand seven hundred and forty-seven pounds five shillings and one penny New Three Pounds per Centum in the names of the said Lord Colchester and Lieutenant-Colonel James Lindsay and the Reverend Joshua Woolley, LL.D., and Captain Andrew Rogers Savage, Royal Marine Artillery, and held under the trusts, declared by a Deed Poll of the eighteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, to secure in perpetuity, on the nomination of the Royal Commissioners, the admission of Eleven Boys, the Sons of Soldiers, Sailors, or Marines of Her Majesty's Service, into the Royal Seamen and Marines Orphan School, Portsea.
3. The sum of twenty-five thousand pounds paid to the Governors of Wellington College, upon an agreement confirmed by a bye-law of the said Governors of the twenty-seventh day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, to secure in perpetuity, on the nomination of the said Royal Commissioners, the admission of Eighteen Boys, Children of deceased Commissioned Officers in Her Majesty's Army, into the said College.
4. The sum of one thousand pounds paid to the Treasurer of the Cambridge Asylum at Kingston-on-Thames towards building, and two thousand pounds sterling invested in the purchase of two thousand one hundred and sixteen pounds eight shillings and one penny New Three Pounds per Centum in the names of the said Lord Colchester and Lieutenant-Colonel James Lindsay and James Liddell and George Tempest Rowland, and held under the trusts, declared by a Deed Poll of the third day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, to secure in perpetuity, on the nomination of the said Royal Commissioners, the admission of Five Women, Widows of Soldiers, into the Cambridge Asylum.
5. The sum of five thousand pounds sterling paid to the Treasurer of the Royal Naval Female School at St. Margaret's, Isleworth, for the general purposes of Institution, and held under an Indenture or Deed of Covenant of the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, to secure in perpetuity, on the nomination of the said Royal Commissioners, the admission of Five Pupils into the said Royal Naval Female School upon the terms and conditions mentioned in the said Indenture.
6. The sum of eight thousand pounds sterling paid to the Royal Naval School, New Cross, for the general purposes of the Institution, under the sanction of Parliament, to secure the admission in perpetuity, on the nomination of the said Royal Commissioners, of Seven Pupils, Sons of Naval or Marine Officers, upon the terms and conditions specified in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth Victoria, chapter one hundred and four (local and personal).

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further recited that The Patriotic Fund would be more than sufficient for the objects described in Our Original Commission, and that it was expedient that We, Our Heirs and Successors, should be empowered to give from time to time further directions respecting the application of The Patriotic Fund, subject to the appropriations aforesaid, and respecting the constitution and powers of the Body of Commissioners, and the conduct of the business relating to the Fund, and that provision should be made respecting the vesting and transmission of property held in trust for the purposes of the Fund.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was enacted among other things (in Section Five thereof) that it should be lawful for Us, Our Heirs, and Successors, from time to time, by Supplementary Commission under the Royal Sign Manual, directed to such persons as to Us, Our Heirs or Successors, should seem fit, to authorize and direct the Commissioners thereby constituted, to apply The Patriotic Fund and the income and accumulations thereof, or any part or parts thereof, subject to the appropriations aforesaid (in such manner as any such Commission should from time to time direct, or in the absence of such direction, or as far as such direction, if any, should not extend, as the Commissioners should think fit), to the purposes and in the order following:

First, in Relief of Widows, and Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of Children of Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines of Our Army and Navy who lost their Lives in Battle in the late War with Russia, or in consequence of Wounds received in or by or in consequence of other Casualties sustained in or Disease contracted in that War:

Secondly, in Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of Children or Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines, of Our Army and Navy who had lost or should thereafter lose their Lives in Battle in any other War, or in consequence of Wounds received in or by or in consequence of other Casualties sustained in or Disease contracted in any other War:

Thirdly, in Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of Children of other Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines of Our Army and Navy who had lost or should hereafter lose their Lives in the Service of the Crown,

or by or in consequence of Casualties sustained or disease contracted in the Service of the Crown.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further enacted among other things (in Section Six thereof) that any Supplementary Commission might authorize the Commissioners acting thereunder, for the better accomplishment of any purpose of the Commission, to increase, extend, or make additions to any Royal or other Charitable Institutions founded within the United Kingdom for any of the purposes for or towards which under the preceding section of the same Act (meaning the said Section Five thereof) the Commissioners had power to apply The Patriotic Fund, or the accumulations thereof, or of any part thereof.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further enacted among other things (in Section Eight thereof) that any Supplementary Commission might direct that the First Lord of the Admiralty, and the Secretary of State for War, and the Paymaster-General (respectively therein described) should be the Trustees of The Patriotic Fund, in trust to support the appropriations in such Commission specified, and subject thereto in trust for any purposes therein specified in conformity with the provisions of that Act.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further enacted, among other things (in Section Eighteen thereof) that any Supplementary Commission might authorize the Commissioners acting thereunder to employ a Secretary and Clerks at salaries, the same, with other proper expenses, to be paid out of The Patriotic Fund.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further enacted, among other things (in Section Twenty thereof) that all rights of nomination to Schools or Institutions possessed by the Commissioners acting under Our Original Commission, or by the Executive Committee of those Commissioners, and for the time being exercisable, and all Powers relative thereto, might be exercised by the Commissioners for the time being acting under any Supplementary Commission, or by the Executive Committee of those Commissioners, as any Supplementary Commission should direct.

And whereas, by the said Act, it was further enacted, among other things (in Section Twenty-one thereof), that any Supplementary Commission might direct that the Fund known as The Rodriguez Fund should be applied for the same or the like purposes as The Patriotic Fund, and the same should be applied accordingly.

And whereas We are minded to exercise the Powers vested in Us by the said Act.

And whereas some of the Commissioners appointed by Our Original Commission are dead.

Now know ye that, having taken into Our Royal consideration the premises, and reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, ability, and discretion, We, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in Us by The Patriotic Fund Act, 1867, vested, and of every other power in anywise enabling Us in this behalf, have authorized and appointed, and do by this Our Commission under Our Royal Sign Manual, authorize and appoint you, the said George William Frederick Charles, Duke of Cambridge; Edward Adolphus, Duke of Somerset; Arthur Richard, Duke of Wellington; Henry John, Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot; Anthony, Earl of Shaftesbury; Thomas, Earl of Lauderdale; Fox, Earl of Dalhousie; Charles Philip, Earl of Hardwicke; Henry Thomas, Earl of Chichester; Horatio, Earl Nelson; Henry, Earl Gray; George Frederick Samuel, Earl de Grey and Ripon; William Bernard, Baron Petre;

Henry, Baron Rokeby; Edward Burtenshaw, Baron Saint Leonards; Edmund Burke, Baron Fermoy; Frederic, Baron Chelmsford; Robert Vernon, Baron Lyveden; Sir John Somerset Pakington; James Lindsay; Henry Thomas Lowry Corry; William Ewart Gladstone; Benjamin Disraeli; Jonathan Peel; John Wilson Patten; William Ferneley Allen; Lord Mayor of Our city of London, or the Lord Mayor of Our said city for the time being; Sir James Yorke Scarlett; Sir John Emerich Edward Dalberg Acton; Sir John Fox Burgoyne; Sir Hew Dalrymple Ross; Sir Edward Lugard; Sir Richard James Dacres; Sir John William Gordon; Sir Peter Richards; Sir Anthony Blaxland Stransham; William Alexander Baillie Hamilton; Henry Eyre; John Henry Lefroy; Robert Alexander Shafto Adair; Thomas Baring; John Abel Smith; John Gellibrand Hubbard; and John Ball; to be Our Commissioners of The Patriotic Fund.

And we do hereby declare and direct that this Our Commission is Supplementary to Our Original Commission, and shall be deemed to be a Supplementary Commission within the meaning of the said Act accordingly.

And we do hereby authorize and direct you, Our Commissioners, from time to time as occasion requires, to exercise (subject to the provisions of this Our Supplementary Commission) all such of the powers and authorities by Our Original Commission conferred on Our Commissioners thereby appointed as for the time being remain fit to be and capable of being exercised, and to discharge (subject to the provisions of this Our Supplementary Commission) such of the duties by Our Original Commission imposed on Our said Commissioners as for the time being remain fit to be and capable of being discharged.

And we do hereby further authorize and direct you, Our Commissioners, to apply The Patriotic Fund, and the income and accumulations thereof, or any part or parts thereof (subject to the appropriations described in the Preamble of the said Act and in the Schedule to the same hereinbefore set forth), in such manner as you, or any three or more of you, from time to time think fit, to the purposes and in the order following:

First, in Relief of Widows, and Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of Children of Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines of Our Army and Navy who lost their Lives in Battle in the late War with Russia, or in consequence of Wounds received in or by or in consequence of other Casualties sustained in or Disease contracted in that War:

Secondly, in Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of Children of Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines of Our Army and Navy who have lost or hereafter lose their Lives in Battle in any other War, or in consequence of Wounds received in or by or in consequence of other Casualties sustained in or Disease contracted in any other War:

Thirdly, in Maintenance, Education, Training, and Advancement of children of other Soldiers, Seamen, and Marines of Our Army and Navy who have lost or hereafter lose their Lives in the Service of the Crown, or by or in consequence of Casualties sustained or Disease contracted in the Service of the Crown.

And We do hereby further authorize you, Our Commissioners, for the better accomplishment of any purpose of this Our Commission, to increase, extend, or make additions to any Royal or other Charitable Institutions founded within Our United

Kingdom for any of the purposes for or towards which you have, by virtue of this Our Commission, power to apply The Patriotic Fund, or the accumulations thereof, or any part thereof.

And We do hereby declare that nothing in this Our Commission shall prejudicially affect the claims of any person under any grant or arrangement heretofore made by the Commissioners acting under Our Original Commission.

And We do hereby direct that the First Lord of Our Admiralty (according to the definition in the said Act given, and subject and according to the provisions of the same Act), and Our Secretary of State for War (according to the definition in the same Act given), and Our Paymaster-General for the time being, shall be the Trustees of The Patriotic Fund, in trust, to support the appropriations described in the Preamble of the same Act and in the Schedule to the same hereinbefore set forth, and, subject thereto, in trust for the purposes of Our Original Commission and of this Our Commission.

And we do hereby further authorize you, Our Commissioners, to employ a Secretary and Clerks, at salaries, and do direct that the same, with other proper expenses, shall be paid out of The Patriotic Fund; and We do hereby require you, as soon as may be after the issuing of this Our Commission, and afterwards from time to time, as occasion may require, to prepare and submit for Our approval a Scheme for the establishment of a Secretary and Clerks for the purposes of this Our Commission, with the salaries proposed for such Secretary and Clerks; and We do hereby declare and direct that such scheme, when approved by us by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, shall be and constitute the establishment for the purposes of this Our Commission; and We do hereby direct that such part of the annual income of The Patriotic Fund as is from time to time necessary for the charges of such establishment shall be applied by you, Our Commissioners, accordingly.

And We do hereby further direct, that all rights of nomination to Schools or Institutions possessed by Our Commissioners acting under Our Original Commission, or by the Executive Committee of those Commissioners, and for the time being exercisable, and all powers relative thereto, may be exercised by the Executive Committee of you, Our Commissioners.

And We do hereby further direct, that the Fund known as The Rodriguez Fund shall be applied for the like Purposes as The Patriotic Fund.

And We do hereby declare, that We have revoked and determined, and do by this Our Commission revoke and determine, the following parts of Our Original Commission (that is to say):

First. So much thereof as relates to the appointment of Secretaries, and to the filling up of vacancies in the Offices of those Secretaries.

Secondly. That part thereof, whereby we did command Our Paymaster-General for the time being to open and keep a separate Account at the Bank of England, and did give directions concerning the Payments to be made to or from that Account.

And Thirdly. So much thereof as relates to the Audit of Accounts, Disbursements, and Payments.

And We do hereby in all other respects confirm Our Original Commission, and do hereby declare

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that the same is and shall remain in full force (subject to the provisions of this Our Supplementary Commission), and do hereby direct that the same shall be read and have effect with this Commission as one Commission; and that you, Our Commissioners, and all Our Civil, Military, and Naval Servants, and all Our Subjects, do govern yourselves and themselves accordingly.

Given at Our Court, at *Windsor*, this twenty-sixth day of *March*, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-first year of Our Reign.
