In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

NOTIFICATION OF BLOCKADE.

Foreign Office, April 24, 1868.

IT is hereby notified that the Right Honourable Lord Stanley, M.P., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Caracas a Despatch, inclosing an official copy of a Decree issued on the 9th March, 1868, by the Venezuelan Government, declaring the coast of the State of Nueva Barcelona, from the mouth of the River Uchire to Point Conoma, to be in a state of blockade.

The following is the official copy of the said Decree, with a translation thereof:—

MIGUEL GIL, General en Jefe, Primer Designado Encargado del Ejecutivo Nacional.

Habiendo tenido lugar en el Estado de Nueva Barcelona una sublevacion contra las instituciones políticas que se ha dado la Nacion, y tocando al Ejecutivo Nacional hacer uso de la fuerza y demas medidas legales para restablecer el orden constitucional:

Decreto:

ART. 1°. Se declara cerrada la costa del Estado de Barcelona desde la boca del rio Uchire hasta la punta Conoma.

ART. 2°. Se declara tambien en estado de bloqueo la misma estension de la costa.

ART. 3°. Si se acercase algun buque á cualquier punto de la costa mencionada, la fuerza bloqueadora le notificará la existencia del bloqueo, anotando en sus papeles de navegacion el dia y el lugar ó la altura en que lo haya encontrado y tambien la notificacion hecha. En caso de insistir el buque en su pretension de entrar no obstante el aviso, ó si vuelve á presentarse en dichos puntos, quedará sugeto á ser apresado y detenido para el juicio correspondiente.

ART. 4°. Para el apresamiento y detencion de las naves que traten de salir de la costa blockadeada no se necesitará la prévia notificacion prescrita en el artículo anterior. Pero si los buques que tratan de salir del puerto de Barcelona hubieren

entrado en él, ántes de formar el bloqueo, no se les impedirá la salida.

ART. 5°. Tambien serán apresados y detenidos los buques que conduzcan efectos de contrabando de guerra para la costa de Barcelona, ó para los sublevados; á ménos que su Capitan convenga en entregarlos al aprehensor y este pueda recibirlos á bordo sin dificultad.

ART. 6°. Los Comandantes de los buques bloqueadores procederán con los bajeles detenidos por violacion del bloqueo, ó por conduccion de géneros de contrabando, del modo que se previene en las ordenanzas de Corso de 1822, en lo que no se oponga á las disposiciones anteriores, debiendo traerlos presos al puerto de la Guaira, para que los juzgue la Alta Corte Federal.

ART. 7°. Este decreto se notificará á quienes corresponda; y el Ministro de Guerra y Marina cuidará de su publicacion y cumplimiento.

MIGUEL GIL, Commander-in-Chief, First Designate, having charge of the National Executive.

An insurrection having taken place in the State of "Nueva Barcelona" against the political institutions which the nation has adopted, and as it is incumbent on the National Executive to employ force and other legal measures for the re-establishment of constitutional order:

Decrees:

ART. 1. The coast of the State of Barcelona is declared to be closed from the mouth of the River Uchire to Point Conoma.

ART. 2. The same extent of coast is also declared to be in a state of blockade.

ART. 3. If any vessel should approach any part of the coast aforesaid, the blockading force will notify to it the existence of the blockade, noting down in the ships' papers the day and the place, or the latitude, when and where it was met with, and also the notification made to it. In case of the vessel persisting in the attempt to enter notwithstanding the information, or if it should return again to the said parts of the coast, it will be subject to be captured and detained for judgment accordingly.

ART. 4. For the capture and detention of ships attempting to leave the blockaded coast, the previous notification prescribed in the foregoing Article shall not be necessary. But if the vessels which wish to come out of the Port of Barcelona should have entered therein before the blockade was established, their departure shall not be hindered.

ART. 5. Vessels carrying articles, which are contraband of war, to the Coast of Barcelona, or to the insurgents, shall also be captured and detained, unless their captains should agree to deliver up the same article to the captor, and that he can receive them on board without difficulty.

ART. 6. With respect to vessels detained for attempting to violate the blockade, or for carrying contraband articles, those in command of the blockading vessels, shall proceed, in conformity with the Ordinances on Cruisers of 1822, in all that is not opposed to the preceding regulations,

bringing the said captured vessels to the Port of La Guaira to be adjudicated upon by the Supreme Federal Court.

ART. 7. This Decree shall be notified to all such whom it may concern; and the Minister of War and Marine shall see to its publication and execution.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 38.)—UNITED STATES—NEW YORK.

Alteration in Light and Fog Signal at East Beacon, Sandy Hook.

THE United States Government has given notice, that from the 31st day of March, 1868, the

following alteration would take place in the light and fog signal at the East Beacon, North point of Sandy Hook, entrance to New York Bay.

A *fixed* white light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected, and is on a line with the main light and the old East Beacon, and 284 yards nearer the north point of the Hook than the old beacon.

The light is elevated 33 feet above the high-water level of the sea, and in clear weather should be visible from a distance of nine miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The light tower surmounts the keeper's dwelling, and is white.

At the same time, a powerful fog signal (siren), worked by steam, will take the place of the present fog bell. A blast of *ten seconds* duration will be issued at intervals of *forty-five* seconds during foggy weather.

SOUTH CAROLINA.

Fixed Light on Combahee Bank.

Also, that from the 22nd day of February, 1868, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently erected on the east end of Combahee Banks, St. Helena Sound.

The light is a *fixed* white light, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of eleven miles.

The illuminating apparatus is of the fifth order.

The lighthouse is of wood, painted white, and built on screw piles, painted red.

In foggy weather, a fog bell will be sounded every *ten seconds*.

TEXAS.

Re-establishment of Light on Half Moon Reef.

Also that, from the 20th day of February, 1868, the light exhibited from the lighthouse on the southern extremity of Half Moon Reef, Matagorda Bay, would be re-established.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 34 feet above the high-water level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of six miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the sixth order.

The lighthouse is wooden, painted white, built on an iron pile foundation, painted black.
