The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to

be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THE Right Honourable the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Charleston, enclosing the following Military Orders, which have been issued with respect to the observance of Quarantine on the Coast of South Carolina during the ensuing summer season :—

HEAD QUARTERS SECOND MILITARY DISTRICT,
CHARLESTON, S.C., April 8, 1868.

[General Orders, No. 64.]

I. In order to protect the communities and the troops stationed with them against the importation of contagious or infectious diseases, it is necessary to establish an effective and uniform system of quarantine at the several ports in this district; and for that purpose the following regu-

lations are hereby established, to take effect on the first day of May proximo, and will continue in force until modified or revoked by proper authority.

II. All vessels coming directly or indirectly from any place where cholera, yellow fever, ship fever (so called), or any other infectious disease existed at the time of their departure, or which shall have touched at any such place, and proceeded thence to any port in this district, or on board which, during the voyage, any case of the above-mentioned diseases shall have occurred, shall be brought to, and shall await the visit of the inspecting Quarantine Officer at the point designated for that purpose, and shall be subject to such quarantine or other rules and regulations as the Quarantine Officer may prescribe.

III. It shall be the duty of the Quarantine Officer to board every vessel subject to quarantine or visitation, immediately on her arrival at the points or station designated, or as soon thereafter as practicable, to enquire as to the health of all persons on board, the condition of the vessel and cargo, to inspect the bill of health, manifest, log-book, &c., and to examine on oath the captain, crew, or passengers; and if he is satisfied that she has come from infected ports, or has any sickness on board, or finds the vessel in a filthy or unhealthy condition, he shall at once decide on the preliminary steps to be taken, give the necessary orders, and report at once, in writing, to the Medical Director for specific instructions as to his future action in the case. The Medical Director, on receiving the report of the Quarantine Officer, shall at once give him specific instructions as to the disposal of the vessel, her crew, passengers, and cargo.

IV. It shall be the duty of every pilot conducting a vessel into any port or harbour of the district, to bring her first to the station designated for examination by the Quarantine Officer, and to remain on board, without proceeding beyond such station, until the Quarantine Officer shall give him permission in writing to leave the vessel.

V. Every pilot neglecting or refusing to bring a vessel to the examining station, and afterwards to the quarantine station, if required by the Quarantine Officer to do so, shall be suspended from his office, and shall, on conviction, be punished as the military authorities may direct, subject to the approval of the Commanding General.

VI. Any captain or master of a steamer or sailing vessel passing the examining station without permission, or refusing to perform quarantine when ordered to do so, or by breaking quarantine after being at quarantine ground, or allowing any officer, passenger, or crew to leave his vessel without the permission of the Quarantine Officer, or permitting any unauthorized person to visit his vessel, or disobeying any order of the Quarantine Officer, on conviction thereof shall be punished by fine and imprisonment, or other sentence, as may be imposed by military authorities, subject to the approval of the Commanding General.

VII. Examining and quarantine stations.

1. CHARLESTON, S.C.

The quarantine ground or anchorage for infected vessels at Charleston, S.C., will be established in a suitable depth of water opposite or near to the White House Landing, in Stono Inlet. Quarantine hospital will be on Morris' Island. Storehouses for merchandise pronounced to be infected to be at Pawnee Landing.

Station for vessels detained for observation, to be one mile below Fort Sumter—not in the direct channel, but in a suitable depth of water, and as near midway distance from shore to shore as practicable.

2. GEORGETOWN, S.C.

Quarantine station, the station for hospital and storehouses for infected merchandise, to be on North Island.

The anchorage for infected vessels, and for vessels under observation, to be opposite the North Island Light House, as far from the main channel as practicable, and at least one mile apart.

3. HILTON HEAD, S.C.

Quarantine station for infected vessels, to be opposite Braddock's Point. The station for hospital and storehouses for infected merchandise will also be at Braddock's Point. The Medical Officer at this station will also enforce the quarantine laws upon vessels passing up Calibogue Sound.

Station for vessels under observation in Calibogue Sound, will be above Braddock's Point, two miles up the Sound.

The station for vessels under observation entering Port Royal Roads, will be near the inner lightship, towards St. Helena Island, which will also be the station for the Quarantine Officer.

* * * * *

X. Regulations to be observed on board of all vessels detained at quarantine:

1st. Universal cleanliness must be preserved on board.

2nd. The fore-castle, steerage, and cabin to be scrubbed, and then well sprinkled with chloride of lime, and other means of disinfection shall be used as may be directed by the Quarantine Officer.

3rd. All foul wearing apparel and bed clothes of the officers, passengers, and seamen, must be washed, aired, and disinfected.

4th. The bilgewater must be completely pumped out twice a-day at least, and water from along-side be put in the pump until the water so pumped out shall be clear and free from any offensive smell.

5th. Windsails must be constantly kept up in each hatchway, and trimmed to the wind, except when weather or discharge of cargo prevents.

6th. Commanders of vessels are accountable for all irregularities committed on board their respective vessels, and for the conduct of such of their people as they may send on shore by permission of the Quarantine Officer; and if any person shall leave a vessel in quarantine, or go beyond the limits assigned to such person by competent authority, a report thereof must be immediately made to the Quarantine Officer. Any person so offending shall, on conviction, suffer such punishment as a Military Commission may direct, subject to the approval of the Commanding General.

7th. All persons whatever, belonging to a vessel in Quarantine, are strictly prohibited from leaving the vessel, except with the written permission of the Quarantine Officer.

8th. All persons whatever, belonging to a vessel in Quarantine, are strictly forbidden to take on board any person who did not arrive in such vessel, or any person who has not a regular permit from the Quarantine Officer.

9th. All communication between vessels at Quarantine is expressly prohibited.

10th. No boat or craft is permitted to go along-side of a vessel at Quarantine for any purpose whatever, except the master thereof shall have a written permission from the Quarantine Officer.

11th. Provisions and other necessities, intended to be sent on board vessels at Quarantine, must follow the same rules and regulations which apply to other communications with the vessel.

12th. Colours must be worn at half-mast, and a light must be hoisted at night, so long as the vessel is detained at Quarantine.

13th. Any person who shall wilfully or knowingly violate, offend against, or disobey any of these orders, or any orders of the Quarantine Officer, shall, upon conviction thereof, be imprisoned for a period not exceeding twelve months, and be fined in a sum not exceeding two thousand dollars, or be subject to such other punishment as a Military Commission may direct, subject to the approval of the Commanding General, for each and every offence.

14th. All persons sent or taken to any or either of the Quarantine Hospitals, shall be charged two dollars per diem during their continuance there, for attendance and other accommodations; and if incapable of paying, the Captain, owner, or Consignee shall be responsible.

Alteration in Lights at entrance of Kherson Bay.

THE Russian Government has given notice, that the following alterations have been, and will be made in the lights at the entrance of Kherson Bay.

Removal of Kinburn Light Vessel.

The light vessel at Kinburn has been removed, and has been placed near the bank of Ajighiol, exhibiting the same *fixed* white light as before.

The former position of the light vessel at the extremity of Kinburn Spit has been marked by large *black* buoy.

Alteration in the Berezan Lights.

The upper wooden beacon lighthouse at Berezan has been replaced by a stone pyramidal lighthouse, exhibiting the same light as before.

The lower beacon lighthouse has been removed 100 yards nearer the sea, in the same line of direction from the upper beacon as before.

The upper light is now elevated 79 feet above the level of the sea, and the lower light 23 feet; they bear from each other N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and S.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., distant 682 yards.

Fixed Light at Souvoroski.

A light will be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the mound of Souvoroski (Potemkin Hill), as a guide to the entrance of Kherson Bay.

The light will be a *fixed* white light, visible from between the bearings N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. and N.E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E., or between the banks of Kinburn and Berezan Island. It will be elevated 148 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 18 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be catoptric or by reflectors.

The tower will be conical, and its position is in lat. 46° 37' 30" N., long. 31° 30' East of Greenwich.

Directions.—To enter Kherson Bay, steer for the Souvoroski Light until the two beacon lights of Berezan are in a line, when the course must be altered to keep them so.

Note.—Until the lighthouse at Souvoroski is completed, the leading lights at Ochakov will be maintained as a guide to enter and leave the bay.

MEDITERRANEAN.

Alteration in the Lights at Algiers.

The Harbour Master at Algiers has given notice, that to remedy the insufficiency of the Harbour lights at Algiers the following arrangements have been made:—

1. The red light on the North mole will be replaced by a *fixed red* catoptric or reflecting light, of the fourth order.
