TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Ladies, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with the Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulation, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that a letter from the Lady who is to make the presentation, stating it to be her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's Command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the

cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

While we regard the foul outrage with horror and indignation, we recognise with devout thank-

fulness the watchful care and protecting providence of the Almighty Father, who has graciously preserved for your Majesty and your Family the young life so dear and full of promise; and we earnestly pray that His Royal Highness,—speedily restored to health and strength,—may long be spared to comfort and sustain your Majesty, and by a noble and useful life to knit still closer the bonds which unite the Royal Family with a loyal and devoted People.

That in this, as in every other event which nearly touches your Majesty and your Family, you may be sustained by infinite love and sympathy, as you are encircled by the ever deepening affections of an appreciating People, is our earnest prayer.

REGULATIONS with respect to the Rates or Tolls on the Canal or Navigation between Reading, in the county of Berks, and Hanham Mills, in the county of Somerset, usually known by the names of the Navigation of the River Kennet, the Kennet and Avon Canal, and the Navigation of the River Avon, and herein-after included in the word "Canal."

WHEREAS by "The Great Western Railway Act, 1852, No. 1" 15 and 16 Vict., c. 140, section 25), it is enacted that if at any time complaint should be made to the Lords of the Committee of Her Majesty's Privy Council appointed for Trade and Foreign Plantations, that the amount of the rates or tolls receivable or claimable by the Great Western Railway Company by virtue of that Act or of the therein recited Acts for or in respect of the said canal (meaning by the word "canal" the whole of the Kennett and Avon Canal, the navi-

gation of the River Kennet, and the navigation of the River Avon, in the preamble to the said Act mentioned), or any part thereof, or of the several vessels, or articles, matters, or things, which should be navigated, carried, or conveyed in, upon, or along the same, or any part thereof, was such as, with reference to the rates or tolls taken and carriage charged upon the railway in that Act mentioned, to operate prejudicially to the persons using the said canal, it should be lawful for the Lords of the said Committee from time to time, when and as such complaints should be made, to examine and inquire, or to appoint some competent person to examine and inquire, into such complaints and the grounds thereof, and after such examination had to make regulations from time to time as the said Lords of the said Committee should think fit with respect to the amount of all or any of the rates or tolls which should be receivable or claimable by the said Railway Company for or in respect of the said canal or any part thereof, or of all or any vessels, or articles, matters, or things, which should be navigated or carried or conveyed thereon, and by such regulations to impose such conditions and restrictions with regard to the amount of all or any of such tolls or rates as the said Lords of the said Committee should think fit, having regard to the tolls levied on the said railway, and to the tolls which it should be lawful to levy on the said canal by virtue of that Act, or of the said therein recited Acts; and whereas complaints have been made to the Lords of the said Committee that the amount of the rates or tolls receivable or claimable by the said Railway Company, by virtue of "The Great Western Railway Act, 1852, No. 1," and the said therein recited Acts, for or in respect of the said canal and parts thereof, and of the several vessels, articles, matters, and things, which are navigated carried and conveyed in, upon, and along the same, and parts thereof, is such as, with reference to the rates or tolls taken and carriage charged upon the said railway, to operate prejudicially to the persons using the said canal; and whereas the Lords of the said Committee, when and as such complaints were made, have, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, appointed James Barstow, Esq., of the Inner Temple, Barrister-at-Law, being a competent person, to examine and inquire into the complaints and the grounds thereof; and whereas such examination has been duly had according to those provisions, and the said James Barstow has duly made his report; Now, therefore, the Lords of the said Committee, having considered the said report, and having regard to the tolls levied on the said railway, and to the tolls which it is lawful to levy on the said canal, by virtue of "The Great Western Railway Act, 1852, No. 1," or of the therein recited Acts, do hereby, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act enabling them in this behalf, make the following regulations which they think fit with respect to the amount of the rates or tolls which shall be received or claimable by the Great Western Railway Company for and in respect of the use of the said canal.

Regulation No. 1.

That on and after the 1st day of June next, the rates and tolls which shall be received and claimable by the said Railway Company, for and in respect of the said canal, or any part thereof, and of all vessels, articles, matters, and things, which shall be navigated or carried or conveyed thereon, shall be the same in amount as they were on the 30th day of June, 1852, and shall so continue until this Regulation shall be revoked by the Lords of the said Committee.

Regulation No. 2.

That prior to any application to the Lords of the said Committee to increase the amount of any of the said rates and tolls, two calendar months' notice of such intended application, with particulars of the desired increase, shall be given in three newspapers, one of which shall be published in the county of Berks, another in the county of Wilts, and another in the county of Somerset; and such notice shall state that any party claiming to be interested in the subject, and to be entitled to oppose the proposed increase, is thereby directed to give notice thereof, in writing, to the Lords of the said Committee, and the said Great Western Railway Company, and to deliver therewith a statement of any objection to such proposed increase.

Provided, nevertheless, that the preceding Regulations are not intended to apply to the tolls mentioned in Section 14 of the said Act.
