

fire, that some of his Troops might join with the Imperialists that are going to encamp near *Essecke*; his Electoral Highness has answered, That his Imperial Majesty may dispose of his Forces with the same Liberty as of his own: Whereupon Orders have been sent to 2000 Bavarians, that are quartered in *Hungary*, to march forthwith towards the *Drave*. The last Letters from *Sclavonia* gave an Account, That the Turks of *Gradiska*, and Neighbouring Garisons, understanding that General *Carrara* was forming a Camp near *Essecke*, had drawn together to the number of between 6 and 7000 fighting Men, with a Resolution to fall upon the Imperial Troops in their march, and to ravage our Frontiers: That of these a Body of 3500 advanced, on the 23d of the last month, towards *Zernick*, burning several Villages, and putting the Inhabitants to the Sword; which the Baron *d'Amansaga*, Governor of that place, being informed of, he immediately got on Horseback with his Cavalry and Cloats, and, taking with him a Detachment of Foot, went in search of the Enemy, whom he overtook in their retreat, and attack'd with that vigor and success, that, after an obstinate Fight for some time, the Spahi's abandoned the Janifaries and fled: Of the last later, above 500 were kill'd, and 150 taken Prisoners; among which were 3 Aga's, the Officer that commanded the Janifaries, and the Son of the Balla of *Gradiska*: After which, the Baron *d'Amansaga* returned to *Zernick*, and sent the Colours he had taken to General *Carrara*, with the other Marks of this little Victory. The other Party of the Furks advancing the day before towards *Poffega*, to waste the Country, the Baron *Truxes*, Lieutenant-Colonel of the Regiment of *Hollstein*, went out with part of the Garison; and, after some Skirmishes, put the Enemy to flight, pursuing them several Miles, and killing above 100, and taking several Prisoners.

Strasbourg, April 6. The Prince of *Nassau Dietz*, accompanied with several of the Canons of this Cathedral, returned hither some days ago, in order to the proceeding to the Election of a Coadjutor for this Bishoprick. The *Sieur de Vauban*, Ingenier-General of France, and the *Intendant de la Grange*, are still at *Landau*, to give the necessary Orders about the new Canal that is making there, in which Work 12 Battalions are constantly employed. The *Sieur de Moras* is lately arrived at the Court of the Elector Palatin, and, it's believed, his Commission chiefly relates to the Pretensions of the Dutchess of *Orleans*. The *Marquis de Louvois* is very suddenly expected in these parts.

Cologne, April 12. The Cardinal of *Eurtemberg* arrived here the 9th Instant, and, having assisted at the Meeting of the Chapter of this Cathedral, parted again for *Zons* and *Keyserwert*. They write from *Bonne*, that the Elector of *Cologne* is fallen ill again, his Fever being returned upon him.

Hague, April 20. The Elector of *Saxony* continues still at *Amsterdam*. An Envoy is arrived here from the Government of *Argiers*, who will in a day or two have Audience of the States: It is not yet known what his Business is. The 4 Men of War fitted out by the Admiralty of the *Maele* are ready to sail.

Brussels, April 16. On Monday last Don *Emanuel Colonna*, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Spain* to the States-General of the *United Provinces*, arrived here from the *Hague*, whither he intends to return again very suddenly. The last Advices from *Hungary* brought the News of the defeat of 4000 Turks, who, having assembled near *Gradiska* in *Sclavonia*, with a design to attack a Convoy of Provisions, which they had notice the Imperialists were sending towards *Essecke*, advanced, the 23d of the last Month, towards *Zernicke*; which the Governor of that place ha-
