### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command.

The Noblemen and Gentlemen, who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing

regulation that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that a letter from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, stating it to be his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at Levees, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

THIS day the Archbishop of Armagh, the Archbishop of Dublin, the Bishops of Meath, Ossory, Down and Connor, Killaloe, Cork, Kilmore, Limerick, Derry, and Tuam, accompanied by the Archbishop of Canterbury, the Archbishop of York, and the Bishops of London, Oxford, and Carlisle, waited upon Her Majesty with the following Address, which was handed to Her Majesty:

To Her Most Gracious Majesty the QUEEN.

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, the Archbishops and Bishops of the Irish Provinces of the United Church of England and

Ireland, beg leave to approach your Majesty with the expression of our profound reverence for your Majesty's office and person.

Having respect to the one and to the other, we have the strongest confidence that nothing which affects the interests and well-being of the Irish branch of our United Church can be other than of liveliest concern to your Majesty.

We beg leave to represent to your Majesty, that measures are now threatened which affect these so deeply, that we cannot believe we have exceeded our duty, or mingled in matters which are outside our province, when we have claimed the privilege of being permitted to lay before your Majesty some of the injurious consequences with which, in our judgment, such measures will be followed, and some of the injustices which they will inevitably involve.

It is now proposed for ever to alienate property which has, from time immemorial, been dedicated to sacred uses. We believe that there is no more precious arrangement than that by which some portion of a nation's wealth is, with the nation's sanction, and under its guardianship, separated off for ever from private possession and common or profane uses, and, to the end that it may be the more inviolable, solemnly set apart to the services of Almighty God,—the enjoyment of it being linked, not merely with the performance of the ordinary duties of a citizen, but with the obligation of setting forth that divine knowledge by which alone men are made capable of fulfilling their higher duties in this life, or brought into any meetness for another. Such a sacred fund exists in Ireland at present. When we see it in danger of being dissipated for ever, we must needs protest against such a step, in the name of that Church which we believe to be the rightful administrator of it, and in the interests of the nation which would thus throw away in a moment the cherished inheritance of centuries,—which, once gone, could never be recovered or replaced.

Nor are the losses with which we are threatened material only. We cannot but call to mind, with thankfulness, that in this Church of ours, as now constituted, your Majesty is, under Christ, in all cases ecclesiastical and civil, supreme. In the destruction of the national character of our Church, with which we are now threatened, in the severing of the ties which bind it to the State and the State to it, in the disappearance of the Royal Supremacy which thereupon must follow, an important safeguard of the Reformed Faith, and of many precious rights will be overthrown. Your Majesty will not merely be deprived of a bright jewel in your Crown, but will see very much of that influence and authority which now are ours, who render no divided allegiance, transferred to another Church which can never be truly national,—finding, as it does, its centre outside of the nation, and submitting to the jurisdiction, which it must recognise as paramount to any other, of a foreign Potentate and Prince.

And, in this view, we humbly submit to your Majesty that the enjoyment by our Church, under the Royal Supremacy, of the temporal emoluments and dignities attached to the Establishment, cannot fairly be deemed a grievance by those whose principles prevent them from fulfilling the conditions on which alone such emoluments and dignities can be enjoyed, consistently with the Constitution of these realms.

There are further mischiefs with which this measure appears to us to be fraught. It is pro-

posed as a healing measure. We believe that it will open new fountains of bitterness in this land, while it will close none of the old. It is proposed as a measure which will bind England and Ireland in closer union. So far from this, we fear that it will discourage those in this country, who, sincerely attached to the English connexion, have hitherto found it the surest pledge for the maintenance of their own liberties and rights, while it will not win back the loyalty of one amongst those who desire and labour for the dissolution of that connexion. Indeed, they who have spoken out most plainly, have candidly avowed that the subversion of our Establishment is principally desired by them as preliminary to other aims and remoter purposes, to which they expect that it will pave the way.

We beg leave to bring before your Majesty some of the injustices which will be inseparable from such a disendowment of our church as lately has been proposed. The pledge, indeed, is offered to us, that all vested interests shall be respected. It would be little if they were so; but we venture to affirm that in such a catastrophe, this, even with the most honourable intentions, would be impossible. In our own cases, and those of a few other of the clergy, it might be done. But, there are investments in just hope as well as in actual possession; and the injustice, which would be inflicted on multitudes of our brethren, would be extreme upon all those who at this time are reasonably looking forward to some modest reward of long and ill-requited labours in the past, but who would thus find themselves for ever cut off from this and from every expectation of it.

But there are other vested rights and interests besides those of the clergy. Our poorer Protestant brethren who have established themselves in every part of the country, and this in the faith of the maintenance of the present settlement of things, they too, have a vested right, for themselves and for their children, in that ministry of Christ's word and sacraments according to the order of our reformed Church which hitherto they have so freely enjoyed. And if we urge their case rather than that of the richer portion of our people, it is not because the rights and interests of the latter are less clearly involved, but only that sacrifices are possible on their part which may enable them in some sort to make good for themselves the loss they will have endured. We cannot, indeed, regard the spiritual condition to which many of the poorer members of our Church, thinly scattered in remote districts, and far from the aid of their richer brethren, will be reduced, without the deepest anxiety and alarm. The witness of our Church for Christ, in His offices, which no man may usurp, in His mediatorial dignity, with which no creature may interfere,—this, God helping, our Church shall maintain to the end, and it shall never cease in the land. But the difficulty of bringing home the means of grace to some portions of our people, if ever the parochial system as now existing should be abolished, will be almost impossible to overcome: and there is extreme danger that, in one way or another, many of those would be lost to us for ever. Some, deprived of the means of grace, would emigrate with their families; but, many must remain to whom this way of escape would not be open. Too poor to provide the services of a Clergyman for themselves, and of a class peculiarly needing the watchful care of one, the heads and some of the elder members of the families might continue steadfast in the faith in which they have been brought up, but they would be little able to

instruct and train their children, who would, almost inevitably, be absorbed in the masses of the followers of Rome, by whom they are surrounded. And, thus, over a wide extent of country, little by little, the light of the Reformation would be extinguished.

In this Address to your Majesty, we have confined ourselves to the evils to be apprehended by our own branch of the Church. But forming as we do an integral part of the United Church of England and Ireland, and being connected with our English brethren by common interests as well as by a common faith, we beg most respectfully to point out to your Majesty that the assault on our Establishment is avowedly, on the part of its most strenuous conductors, only the opening of a general attack on the Establishments in England and Scotland: and that, if successful against us, it will prove almost irresistible in the other cases. We would add, moreover, that we ourselves are satisfied that the parties now agitating for the overthrow of our branch of the United Church will never rest content until every vestige of a religious, or at least a Protestant, character is effaced from all the institutions of the State.

This much we have counted it our duty to the Church over which, in the providence of God, we, however unworthy, have been made overseers, to state to your Majesty. And we have spoken it the more confidently being fully assured of your Majesty's deep attachment to those principles which, in a happy hour, placed your Royal House on the throne of these realms; and not less assured that such testimonies of this attachment as may be in your Majesty's power to afford will never be wanting.

That in all the affairs of the Church and Kingdom committed by Almighty God to your Majesty's charge, your Majesty may be guided by the wisdom that is from above; and that all spiritual and temporal blessings may richly abound to your Majesty and your Royal House, we, your Majesty's most faithful and devoted servants, as in duty bound, shall ever pray.

We feel deeply grateful that it has pleased an over-ruling Providence to protect His Royal Highness's life, and spare your Majesty, your Royal Family, and the Empire, the affliction which would have attended the accomplishment of so wicked a deed.

We humbly offer to your Majesty our sympathy on your recent sorrow, and our congratulations on the preservation of His Royal Highness, and venture to express our hope that your Majesty may shortly welcome him restored to health and strength on his return to his native land.

The attempt recently made against the life of your Majesty's second Son, His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, by the agent of a

treasonable conspiracy which has unhappily manifested itself in some parts of your Majesty's dominions, is well calculated to warm and animate the sentiments of loyalty and affection with which your Majesty's Royal House is regarded by the vast majority of the population, both in the United Kingdom and the Colonies; while it has called forth the strongest feelings of indignation and horror at so foul and dastardly a crime.

Acknowledging with fervent gratitude the interposition of an over-ruling Providence which has signally frustrated the murderous design of the criminal, we desire to offer to your Majesty our heartfelt congratulations on the escape of His Royal Highness, and the expression of the deep and true joy with which we have read of his continued progress toward recovery.

AT the Court at *Windsor*, the 14th day of *May*, 1868.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the "Harbours and Passing Tolls, &c., Act, 1861," (24th and 25th Victoria, cap. 47, sections 17, 18), it is enacted as follows, viz.: any body corporate or person having power to levy shipping dues may, with the consent of Her Majesty in Council, by deed, transfer, upon such terms as they, or he, think fit, all or any portion of the shipping dues leviable by them, or him, to any authority entrusted with the duty of constructing, maintaining, or improving any public harbour within which such dues, or any portion thereof, may be levied, and the transferees of such dues shall be possessed of all the rights and privileges in respect of such dues of which the transferrors were possessed previously to such transfer, and shall apply the said dues to shipping purposes within the said harbour, previously to making any such transfer as aforesaid, the parties proposing to make the same, hereinafter called the transferrors, shall give notice of the terms on which it is proposed to be made, by publishing such terms twice, at least, in some local newspaper or newspapers, or by issuing advertisements, naming a time and place at which a copy of the proposed terms may be inspected, and it shall be lawful for any persons or body of persons interested in the matter, to lay before them in writing, such objections or observations with reference thereto as they think expedient; and it shall be the duty of the transferrors, and of the said harbour authority, to take the same into consideration, and to make such modifications in, or additions to, the said terms (if any) as they may think fit to adopt; and it shall likewise be their duty in applying for the consent of Her Majesty in Council to forward all such objections and observations, with their answer thereto, for the consideration of Her Majesty in Council:

And whereas by "The Greenock Port and Harbours Act, 1866," it was enacted, that the Provost, the four Bailies, the Treasurer, and the whole other Councillors of Greenock, and their successors, and nine other persons, ship owners of the port of Greenock, duly qualified and elected as therein mentioned, should be the Trustees of the port and harbours of Greenock, and shall be a body corporate under the name and style of the "Trustees of the Port and Harbours of Greenock," with perpetual succession and a common seal, and with power to sue and be sued, and to purchase, take, hold, and dispose of lands and other property for the purposes of the Act, and have all the powers and privileges of a body corporate:

And whereas by virtue of a feu contract, dated the thirteenth and sixteenth days of May, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-two, the Magistrates and Town Council of the burgh of Greenock are entitled to levy anchorage, shore, bay, and ring dues, and dues on coals, and vivres payable by all kinds of ships or vessels coming into the harbour of Greenock:

And whereas the said Magistrates and Town Council of the burgh of Greenock have agreed to transfer the said anchorage, shore, bay, and ring dues, and dues on coals and vivres to the said Trustees of the port and harbour of Greenock, to be applied by such Trustees for the purpose of the said port and harbour of Greenock:

And whereas the said Magistrates and Town Council of the burgh of Greenock have given notice of the terms on which the said transfer is to be made, by issuing advertisements, naming a time and place at which a copy of the proposed terms might be inspected, and also by publishing such advertisement in the Greenock Herald of the second and fourth October, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the Greenock Advertiser, the Greenock Telegraph, and the Greenock Evening News of the twenty-eighth September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven:

And whereas the said Magistrates and Town Council have received no objections or observations having reference to the said proposed transfer:

And whereas the terms on which the said transfer is to be made are contained in the deed by which it is proposed to effect the transfer, a copy of which is appended to this Order:

And whereas the said Magistrates and Town Council have applied to Her Majesty for her consent to the said transfer, and it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that such transfer is desirable.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, does consent to the said proposed transfer upon the terms contained in the said deed, a copy of which is hereto annexed.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. From and after the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, notwithstanding anything in The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, or in The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order (Scotland) of September, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, or in any other Order of the Privy Council, whether general or relating to any particular port or place, cattle, the produce of Spain or Portugal, or of Normandy or Brittany, may be landed at any port in Great Britain, along the coast from the North Foreland, westwards, to the Land's End, and thence, northwards, to the Mùll of Cantyre, at places approved by, and in conformity with the regulations of, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, and on the following conditions:—

First. That the cattle so imported have been embarked at a port of Spain or Portugal, or of Normandy or Brittany:

Secondly. That the vessel in which the cattle are imported has not, within three months next before the time of her taking them on board, had on board any cattle the produce of any country or province other than Spain, Portugal, Normandy, or Brittany:

Thirdly. That the vessel has not, since taking on board the cattle so imported, entered a port of any country or province other than Spain, Portugal, Normandy, or Brittany:

Fourthly. That the cattle so imported have not, while on board the vessel, been in contact with cattle the produce of any country or province other than Spain, Portugal, Normandy or Brittany:

(which conditions are hereafter in this Order referred to as the conditions of this Order).

2. Cattle shall not be landed under this Order unless and until—

(1.) The owner or charterer of the vessel in which they are imported, or his agent in Great Britain, has entered into a bond to Her Majesty the Queen, in a sum not ex-

ceeding one thousand pounds, with or without a surety or sureties, to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, conditioned for the observance of the conditions of this Order, in relation to cattle to be landed under this Order from the vessel: and

(2.) The master, or other person having the charge or command of the vessel, has, on each occasion of importation of cattle in the vessel, satisfied the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, or their proper officer, by declaration made and signed, or otherwise, that all the cattle then imported in the vessel are the produce of Spain, Portugal, Normandy, or Brittany, and that the conditions of this Order have been observed in relation to them.

3. Until cattle landed from a vessel under this Order have been examined by an Inspector appointed or approved by the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs, they shall not be moved from the place of landing, or be allowed to come in contact with any other Cattle.

4. If the Inspector certifies that all the cattle at any time landed from a vessel under this Order are free from contagious disease, they shall thereupon cease to be deemed foreign cattle, within the meaning of any Order of Council under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts.

5. If the Inspector certifies with respect to all or any of the cattle at any time landed from a vessel under this Order, that they are affected with any contagious disease, all the cattle then imported in that vessel shall be dealt with in such manner as the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs direct.

6. Nothing in this Order applies to cattle landed in a part of a port defined by Order of Council under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, as a place where foreign cattle may be landed.

7. The provisions of this Order respecting cattle extend to sheep, goats, and swine, brought in the same vessel with cattle.

8. Words in this Order have the same meaning as in the said Consolidated Cattle Plague Orders.

9. This Order shall continue in force until the end of the month of July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and no longer.
