WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Helen with the rectory of Saint Nicholas, Abingdon, annexed, in the county of Berks, and in the diocese of Oxford, and to his successors Incumbents of the same benefice, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and fifty-eight pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the fifteenth day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the said yearly sum or stipend or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said benefice in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of "The Stanhope and Wolsingham Rectories Act, 1858," and of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent for the time being of the rectory of Saint Andrew with Saint Anne, Auckland, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, one yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and to be receivable half-yearly on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that the annual sum or stipend so granted by us to the Incumbent of the said rectory of Saint Andrew with Saint Anne, Auckland, shall be paid only upon the production to us, on or after the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of the said diocese of Durham, that an assistant curate duly licensed by such Bishop has been employed within the parish of Saint Andrew and Saint Anne, Auckland aforesaid, during the half year then ended, and is in receipt of a salary after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum; provided also, that such yearly sum or stipend shall be and be held to be in lieu of and in substitution for a yearly sum of ninety pounds at present payable by us towards the support of a Sunday Evening Lectureship in the chapel of Saint Anne, Auckland; and provided also, that

such yearly sum or stipend of one hundred and twenty pounds shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the said rectory of Saint Andrew with Saint Anne, Auckland.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, having received a benefaction of six hundred pounds sterling, in favour of the perpetual curacy of Badwell Ash, in the county of Suffolk, and in the diocese of Ely, in consideration whereof we have agreed to pay to the Incumbent of the same perpetual curacy, and to his successors, a yearly sum of twenty pounds, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, grant to the Incumbent of the said perpetual curacy of Badwell Ash, and to his successors, to meet such benefaction, one other yearly sum or stipend of twenty pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the day of the publication of these presents in the London Gazette, and to be receivable half-yearly, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient to produce the yearly sum or stipend so payable out of our common fund as lastly herein mentioned, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said perpetual curacy, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of a benefaction, consisting of two hundred and fifty pounds sterling, which has been paid to us in favour of the rectory of Bittadon, in the county of Devon, and in the diocese of Exeter, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, grant and appropriate out of our common fund to the said rectory of Bittadon, to meet such benefaction, one other capital sum of two hundred and fifty pounds sterling, to be applicable towards defraying the cost of providing a parsonage or house of residence for the said rectory, according to plans and a specification to be approved by us, such capital sum, or the balance thereof unapplied to such purpose, to remain in the meantime in our hands at interest after the rate of three pounds per centum per annum, and such interest to be paid to the Incumbent for the time being of the said rectory of Bittadon.
