## May it piefle Yout Majefty!

VV$E$ bope the latenefs of thris Addrefs will not be attributed to want of Loyalty in us, fince it comes with the fryt oppritunity the Body of the O manty could be prevailed on, baving bitherto been idetained from Paying its Duty by an over-ruling Party among us. We therefores; though late; yet with united Affections, wome to offer the Tribute of our hrimble acknotbledgrients to Tour Sacred Majefty for Totry Gracious Declaration, and Irdulgent Diftribution of Tour Difpencing Porter, and witls Fearts fuill of Foy Congritititate the Eruitulungs of Totry Roval Confort, which, as "is the Hope and Expectation of all Loyal Souts, to may it frua frate the great ends of the Factions, by the bappy Pro duftion of a Prince of Wales. And ubenever Yout Majefty foall in rour Princely Wifdom think fit to call a Parliament, it Jall be our Study and Care to promote the Election of fuch Members as will by their Concurrence in Aboljbing the Penal Latvs and Tefts, perfati the great WFork of Peace $\delta 0$ Gracioufly and Aulpiciondy undertaken by Your Majefty. "And that Your Reigntmy be long and Happy over us, are the Defires and Pragers of Your moft Loyal and Dutiful Subjects.

Leghorne, March.24- Our Great Dule continues as yet at Pifa, from whence it's belieyed he will now very quickly return to Florence The Prince of Tulfany ara rived the 20 th of this Month at Bolughiat The Mafter of a Veffel arrived in this Port from Cagiatri in Sardf nia, reports, That 2 Dutch Merchant Ship's call'd the St. Mark and the Humility, being Jately leparated by ill Weather from their Convoy, were met not far from that Inand by 2 Ships of Argiers, commanded by young Canary and Buffon a Dutct Renegado, gsainf whon they defended themielves feverat hours, bit mult at laft have been taken; being very mach difabled, and hat ving loft a great mapy Men had not the Night and a frelh Gale of Wind parted them ; But the Dutch efpying the next Morning a Sail making towards them, which they believed to be one of the Algerines, with Whom thiey fought the Day before, and finding themfelves in no Condition to make any longer Refiltance, they thought it moft advifeable to run a-hore, which they afterwards toe late repented of, when they perceived the Ship they had thus avoided was a French Man of War that was cruiting againftrie ATgetimes.
Venice, Afril 3. We have Advice by a fmall Veflel which arrived here this Week from Dalmatia, That the Proveditor General Cornare was going to Caflenow to give directions about the new fortifeations that are making there, and that afier his return from thence be intended to put himtelf at the Head of the Troope that in the mean time were drawing together in order to the Execution of fome confiderabie Defign. That the Turks of the Garifon of Caftenovo, who upon the Sorrender of that place retired to Vallona, finding Provifions very fcarce, with other inconveniencies which they were like to fufter by their fay there, had put themfelves into four light Gallies, with a Refolution to foin with the Corlairs of Dulcigno, and to go and feek their Fortune in the Gulph; And that the Praveditor General having Notice thereof, had caufed feveral Galliots to be armed out to looh after them. That the Morlacks, abtited by the Perations continued their Exciurfons with good Sacces, bringing for the molt prit back with them good fore of Cattle, and a great many Slaves. That the People of the Province of tiraeguning, called by the Italians the Dutchy of Sarth 3pado daily put themfelves in gieat numbers under the fophing of the Requbich, This Country betwat Delmatia, Eofine and the guarter of Moxy negnt being about 90 miles loig and $3 \circ$ broaid, and ti Inhatited by about yoeoo. The Recople of Alfanify who are in intuber about 120900 Souk, among whoin there of yon few Tutks feem likewife rery mich inclined te tarem of the Of
toman Yoke; This Province is 1 yo mites in length, extendifin from Antionati to la Vallona; and hayit in it teveral confiderable Towns, of which Antivarie, Dule cigno, Duratity ath ta Wollona are fituated near the Sea. The laft Week feveral Companies of new raifed Men, athong which were fome of Suffers arrived at the Lido, Where there are now likewife 1500 men of the Troops of Woofembuttel, who will be tranfiported with the firft Convoy that goes from hence to the Morea. The Couits Galeazito Bof fil: of Bexgamo, who was lately convited by Outlawry of the Affafination committed during the Carnival on the Performo Oountzacaria Sutm do, is by fentence of the Great Council degrated of his Yobility , and condermned to be Beheaded, and a ReWard of zooo Dricits is offered to zny Peffon that fhall Teize thim withith the Territofities of the Republicks,
Vienna, April 8. The lift Lefters from Tranfitoayhia faid all things were very quiet on that fide That General Caraffa was drawing forme Troops together with which he intended to march the 26 thi of the fat month to attack abs twas believed the Fortreff of Lifpa; the taking whereff will geteatly facilitate che paftage of Provifions which may : Be fent frodichany $\mathrm{S}^{2}-$ biania for the ute of the Tmperisl Army daring the Campagrie. Thit it was refolved to teave thisSunamer a ftrong Gatifon in Hermanifitit, and fome ocher place to the number of 7 or 8000 men, to feeure that Country againht the Incurfions of the Enemy.
