NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY KIDSGROVE, IN THE COUNTY OF STAFFORD.

WHEREAS the Local Government Act, 1858, was duly adopted on the 30th day of April, 1868, by the ecclesiastical district or district parish of Kidsgrove, in the county of Stafford, and notice of such adoption has been duly given, in writing to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, as required by such Act. And whereas it has been duly certified to me that a copy of such notice has been duly advertised, and that copies have also been affixed to the principal doors of each church and chapel in such ecclesiastical district or district parish to which notices are usually affixed; and the period fixed by the said Act for appeal has now expired, and no such appeal has been made:

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF ACT BY THE TOWNSHIP OF FILEY, IN THE COUNTY OF YORK.
