**T**HE following Addresses of congratulation to the Queen, in reference to the atrocious attempt upon the life of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for presentation, have accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Stockport, in the several counties of Chester and Lancaster, in Council assembled.

*Humbly Sheweth,*

That your loyal subjects have learnt with alternate feelings of distress, of gratitude, of hope, and of execration, that a most diabolical attempt has been made in your Majesty's Australian Colonies to assassinate a dear Son of your Royal House, the Duke of Edinburgh;

Distress, for the affliction which such an attempt must have caused to your maternal feelings, and for the pain to which His Royal Highness has been subjected;

Gratitude to Almighty Providence for the failure of the attempt, and for His Royal Highness's most providential escape;

Hope, that His Royal Highness may not feel any lasting inconvenience from his severe and cruel wound; and

Execration, against the base individual and his baser confederates (if any) who, to promote their political ends, could dare to assault the innocent Youth—to assail, through the heart of his Parent, the political institutions of their mother country.

Your loyal subjects find no language strong enough to express their conjoint feelings, but conclude with a prayer to Almighty God that your Majesty may long continue to reign over a free, loyal, and united people; and that you and your Family may, under the protection of an All-wise Providence, continue to that people the inestimable

advantages of your Majesty's most kind, most beneficent, and most paternal sway.

And your Majesty's most loyal subjects will ever pray, &c.

**T**HE Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious

Diseases (Animals) Acts, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and under and in pursuance of The Consolidated Cattle Plague Order of August, 1867, do hereby define the part of the Port of Liverpool, in the County of Lancaster, within which foreign cattle may be landed as follows :—

All that space in the borough of Liverpool, bounded on the western side by the River Mersey, and on all other sides by a line commencing on the eastern bank of the said river at the south-western extremity of the northern pier head of the Sandon Basin, and running eastward along the northern boundary of the water of the Sandon Basin and of the Sandon Dock to the north-eastern corner of the Sandon Dock, thence along a straight fence due east to the western fence of the Regent-road, thence northward along the last-mentioned fence to the line of the northern side of Sandhills-lane, thence eastward along the northern side of Sandhills-lane to the South Eastern side of the Dock Branch of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, thence in a south-westerly direction, along the south-eastern boundary of the said branch railway, to the western side of Great Howard-street, thence westward along the southern side of the branch railway, across Fulton-street, to the eastern side of the High Level Railway, near the Wellington Dock, thence in a south-westerly direction, straight across the High Level Railway, to the south-eastern corner of the sheds on the south side of the Wellington Dock, thence westward in a straight line along the southern side of the said sheds, and by a continuation of the same straight line to the River Mersey, all which space is coloured green on the plan of part of Liverpool deposited at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the borough of Liverpool ;

And do hereby prescribe as follows :—

1. All foreign cattle, landed within the said defined part of the port shall be slaughtered within that defined part, within ten days after the landing thereof, exclusive of the day of landing.

2. Cattle other than foreign cattle within the said defined part shall not be removed therefrom alive.

Whereas an humble address has been presented to Us by the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, the Commissioners of Shires and Burghs in Parliament assembled, praying that We would be pleased to issue a Commission to enquire into the present state of Military Education in Our dominions, and more especially into the training of candidates for commissions in the army, and into the constitution, system of education, and discipline of the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich, and of the Royal Military College at Sandhurst, as well as into the rules and regulations under which candidates are admitted into those Colleges.

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your zeal, ability, and discretion, have authorized and appointed, and by these presents do authorize and appoint, you, the said George Frederick Samuel, Earl de Grey and Ripon, Eustace Brownlow Henry Gascoigne Cecil (commonly called Lord Eustace Cecil), William Lennox Lascelles, Lord de Ros, Thomas George Lord Northbrook, Sir Charles Russell, Sir Duncan Alexander Cameron, Henry Montagu Butler, William Charles Lake, John Henry Lefroy, Edmund Haythorne, Charles Cornwallis Chesney, or any three or more of you, to be Our Commissioners for making the enquiry aforesaid. And for the better effecting the purposes of this Our Commission, We do by these presents give and grant to you, or to any three or more of you, full power and authority to call before you such persons as you may deem necessary, and to obtain information from them upon the subject of your inquiry, and of every matter connected therewith, and also to call for, and have access to, and examine all such official books, documents, papers, and records as may appear to you, or to any three or more of you, likely to be of use in affording you the fullest information.

And We do hereby require and command you, or any three or more of you, to report to Us, under your hands and seals, with all convenient speed, your opinion on the premises, and any recommendations you may have to make as to alterations in the system of Military Education, and in the constitution, discipline, procedure, and regulation of Our Royal Military Academy, and of Our Royal Military College.

And We will and command, and by these presents, ordain, that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And for your assistance in the due execution of this Our Commission, We have made choice of Our trusty and well-beloved John Wallace Hozier, Esquire, Lieutenant in Our Army, to be Secretary to this Our Commission, and to attend you, whose services and assistance, as well as the services and assistance of such clerks and other persons as may appear to you to be necessary, We require you to use from time to time, as occasion shall require.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, this twenty-third day of *June*, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the thirty-second year of Our Reign.

## SOLDIERS' BALANCES UNCLAIMED.

IN pursuance of the "Regimental Debts Act, 1863," notice is hereby given, that Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the War Department has available, for distribution amongst the next of kin, the sum of money set opposite to the name of each of the deceased soldiers named in the list which is published with this notice in the "London Gazette," and the "Army List," and is also to be seen at the Quarters of the several Staff Officers for the Recruiting and Pension Service throughout the United Kingdom.

Applications from persons supposing themselves entitled as next of kin should be addressed by letter to "The Under-Secretary of State, War Office, London, S.W.," and marked outside "Soldier's Effects."

No application can be attended to which does not state the dates and places of the soldier's birth, enlistment, and death, and the name of his regiment; his regimental number should also be stated if known.

Should these particulars furnished by the applicant not agree with the facts recorded on the War Office documents relating to the deceased soldier, the applicant will be so informed; but should they agree therewith, then within three calendar months the Secretary of State will furnish the applicant with the usual requirements needed for the proof of the alleged relationship.

The application must be authenticated by the signature of the applicant, and his name should be affixed in the presence of the clergyman, or one of the churchwardens of the parish, or a Justice of the Peace; the applicant's address, with the name of the post town, must also be clearly stated. No personal application can receive attention.

Further lists will from time to time be published, and therefore, it will facilitate the applicants' inquiries to give the number and date of the notice in which the deceased soldier's name appeared.—Dated this 26th day of June, 1868.
