IN THE MATTER OF THE FACTORY ACTS  
EXTENSION ACT, 1867.

WHEREAS due proof has been made to the satisfaction of me the undersigned, Gathorne

Hardy, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, that the customs of the Trades carried on in the Factories specified in the Schedule hereto, require that the children, young persons, and women, working in such Factories, should be employed between the hours hereinafter mentioned; Now I, the said Gathorne Hardy, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the 12th Article of the Schedule annexed to the Factory Acts Extension Act, 1867, do by this my order give permission to the occupiers of the said Factories to employ the children, young persons, and women; working in such Factories, between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening, or between the hours of eight o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening; instead of between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening, subject to the conditions in the said Act contained.

## EXPLANATIONS.

## I.—NAVIGATION DUES LEVIED AT SULINA IN 1867.

These dues are levied by the European Commission, by virtue of Article 16 of the Treaty of Paris of the 30th March, 1856, to cover the expenditure devoted to the improvement of the Mouths of the Danube.

The collection is effected on the basis of the Tariff joined to the Public Act signed at Galatz on the 2nd November, 1865. It includes as well the dues imposed on the navigation for the local pilotage, and for the keeping up of the light-houses which mark the Danube Mouths.

In 1867, the gross produce of the dues levied at Sulina amounted to the sum of 878,798 francs 37½ centimes. It is composed of the following items:—

## II. DEBT OF THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION.

The debt is composed of two items:

1. The amount of the 10 per cent. Bonds issued by the Commission, and repayable at a fixed date.
2. The amount due to Turkey for advances made by her to the Commission until the year 1863, the date at which this amount is to be paid off not having yet been decided.

1.

The 10 per cent. Bonds amount to 111,100 ducats, and comprise—

1. The balance of the issue of 1866, 24,550 ducats, which will be paid off in 1868, and
2. 86,550 ducats realized on the issue of the 25th April, 1867. Of this latter sum 21,000 ducats will be paid off on the 30th June, 1868, and the balance in 1871 and 1872, according as the sums fall due.

2.

The debt to Turkey amounts to 320,969 ducats, 26 piastres, 12 paras.

Various sums have to be deducted from this amount, of which the principal item is the salary of the Staff of the General Inspection of Navigation, which the Commission pays for the account of the Ottoman Government.

The credit of Turkey in account current with the Commission on the 31st December, 1867, was 317,811 ducats, 27 piastres, 18 paras.

## SCALE OF MEDICINES AND MEDICAL STORES FOR MERCHANT SHIPS.

AND WHEREAS the Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers vested in them by the above-recited Act, did issue and cause to be published in the London Gazette of the 13th December, 1867, a scale of medicines and medical stores, applicable to different ships and voyages;

AND WHEREAS it has been made to appear to them that certain alterations are necessary therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the said recited Act, hereby order and direct that the following Scale of Medicines and Medical Stores shall be substituted for the said Scale published in the London Gazette of the 13th December, 1867 aforesaid, and that this order shall be issued and published in the London Gazette.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 60.)—AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.

*Alteration in the position of Yellow Patch Light, Moreton Bay.*

THE Portmaster of Queensland has given notice, in consequence of the changes that have taken place in the Middle Channel, at the entrance of Moreton Bay, that on and after the 16th day of April, 1868, the Lower or Yellow Patch light would be exhibited to the northward of its former position.

The light is a *fixed* white light, at an elevation of 49 feet above high water, and visible in clear weather, when bearing from S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. round by east to E. by N., at a distance of ten miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fifth order.

The tower is hexagonal, 43 feet high, white, and stands W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N. from Cape Moreton lighthouse, and 30 yards from high-water mark.

Also, at the same date, that the Comboyuro light will be obscured between the *red* light outside the east banks and the white light inside the Inner Middle Channel buoy.

*Directions.*—After rounding Cape Moreton, bring the lighthouse on that Cape, Yellow Patch lighthouse, and the roadway on the slope of Lighthouse Hill, in line bearing E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S.; keep these marks on until the Inner Middle Channel buoy is passed, and the Ship Patch comes open westward of Cowan Cowan Point; then proceed toward Yule Road. The eastern buoy of the Middle Channel is red, and also those on the north side of the Channel, whilst the buoy on the Knoll is black.

At night, after rounding North Point and sighting Comboyuro Point *red* light, steer for it until Cape Moreton and Yellow Patch lights are in line; then steer about W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  N., keeping the latter lights in line until Comboyuro *red* light is obscured and the white light seen bearing S.S.E.; when steer south, making due allowance for the tide, until Cowan Cowan light is open, and proceed up the Bay as before. The Cowan Cowan light leads clear of the western edge of the Venus Bank.

These directions will lead over the East Bank, and to the northward of the Knoll, in not less than three fathoms at low water.

*Note.*—A *red* buoy is placed a short distance eastward of the Lucifer light vessel, to mark the position of that vessel in case of her breaking adrift; and similar buoys are placed near most of the light vessels on this coast.

### North Riding of Yorkshire.

#### FINAL ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF HIGHWAY DISTRICTS.

AT the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace of our Lady the Queen, holden for the North Riding of the County of York at Northallerton, in the said Riding, on Tuesday in the first week after the twenty-fourth day of June, to wit, the thirtieth day of June, in the thirty-second year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria the First, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, before John Richard Westgarth Hildyard, Esquire (Chairman); The Right Honourable Charles John, Lord

Teignmouth; Sir George William Denys, Baronet; and others, their Fellows, Justices of our said Lady the Queen assigned to keep the Peace of our said Lady the Queen in the said Riding, and also to hear and determine divers Felonies, Trespasses, and other Misdemeanors committed within the Riding aforesaid.

Whereas at the Court of General Quarter Sessions for this Riding, holden on the seventh day of April last, a Provisional Order was made in the words following, that is to say:—

Whereas at the General Quarter Sessions of the Peace holden at Northallerton aforesaid, in and for the said Riding, on the fifteenth day of October last a Final Order for dividing the said Riding into sixteen Highway Districts under the provisions of the Highway Acts, was made in manner and to the effect therein set forth.

And whereas notice in writing was given to the Clerk of the Peace of this Riding, under the hands of five of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace of this Riding, that at this General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, it would be proposed to make the several alterations in the said Final Order, and in the Highway Districts therein named, which are hereinafter set forth.

And whereas the said Clerk of the Peace added the said notice to that required by law to be given, of the holding of these Sessions, and posted in a prepaid letter, the said notice to the churchwardens and overseers, of all the townships in the said Riding affected by such proposed alterations.

And whereas it appears to this Court expedient that such proposed alterations should forthwith be made:

Now, therefore, it is ordered by this Court that the said several alterations shall be made in the said Final Order, and in the Highway Districts therein named which are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

#### In No. 2.—*The Birdforth Highway District:*

That the several townships of Sinderby and Sowerby shall be added to the said district, and that for each of the same townships shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Birdforth Highway District.

That the township of Morton shall be subtracted therefrom.

That Ampleforth shall be subtracted therefrom.

#### In No. 3.—*The Bulmer East Highway District:*

That the township of Crambe shall be subtracted therefrom.

#### In No. 4.—*The Bulmer West Highway District:*

That the township of Scackleton shall be subtracted therefrom.

#### In No. 5.—*The Greta Bridge Highway District:*

That the township of Barforth shall be added to the said district, and that for the same township shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Greta Bridge Highway District.

#### In No. 6.—*The Richmond Highway District:*

That the township of Barforth shall be subtracted from the said district.

That the township of Grinton shall be added to the said district, and that for the same township shall be elected one waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the Richmond Highway District.

#### In No. 7.—*The Hang East Highway District:*

That the township of Rand shall be separated from Crakehall Great and Little, and that for the

township of Rand one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the Hang East Highway District.

**In No. 8.—The Leyburn Highway District :**

That the townships of Hauxwell East and West shall be separated, and that for each of the said two townships of East Hauxwell and West Hauxwell one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the Leyburn Highway District.

That the several townships of Hutton Hang and Stainton shall be added to the said Leyburn Highway District, and that for each of the same two townships one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Leyburn Highway District.

That the township of Grinton shall be subtracted from the said Leyburn Highway District.

**In No. 12.—The Malton Highway District :**

That the several townships of Brawby, Crambe, Hildenley, and Scackleton shall be added thereto, and that for each of the same four several townships one waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Malton Highway District.

**In No. 13.—The Pickering Lythe East Highway District :**

That Langdale End (not being a township maintaining its own poor, but a hamlet in the township of Wykeham), shall be included in the said township of Wykeham ; and that for the said last-mentioned township, including Langdale End therein, shall be elected only one Waywarden as a member of the Highway Board of the said Pickering Lythe East Highway District.

**In No. 15.—The Ryedale Highway District :**

That the several townships of Snilesworth and Morton shall be added thereto, and that for each of the same two townships one Waywarden shall be elected as a member of the Highway Board of the said Ryedale Highway District.

That the township of Brawby shall be subtracted therefrom.

In the Schedule of the said Final Order, "Ormesby" shall be subtracted from the First Column, and "Ormesby" and "Upsall" from the Second Column.

And it is further ordered—That the confirmation or otherwise of this Provisional Order shall be taken into consideration at the next Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, for this Riding, to be holden on the 30th day of June next.

And the said Provisional Order having now been taken into consideration by this Court, and it appearing expedient that the same should be confirmed, subject to the variation hereinafter mentioned :—

Now, therefore, it is ordered by this Court—That the said Provisional Order shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed, subject to the variation that the township of Barforth therein named shall not be added to the Greta Bridge Highway District, and shall not be subtracted from the Richmond Highway District.

And it is further ordered—That this Order shall take effect from the 31st day of December next.
