THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to make provision in the case of boroughs ceasing to return members to serve in Parliament, respecting rights of election which have been vested in persons entitled to vote for such members.

An Act to amend the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, by abolishing the rate imposed by the said Act on all occupiers of premises within the extended municipal boundaries of the city of Edinburgh.

An Act for extending the provisions of the Thames embankment and Metropolis Improvement (Loans) Act, 1864, and for amending the powers of the Metropolitan Board of Works in relation to loans under that Act.

An Act for facilitating the acquisition and enjoyment of sites for buildings for religious, educa-

tional, literary, scientific, and other charitable purposes.

An Act to amend "The Consecration of Churchyards Act, 1867."

An Act for the improvement of the township and district of New Kilmainham, in the barony of Upper Cross and county of Dublin.

An Act for altering the streets in communication with the embankment on the north side of the Thames for giving effect to an arrangement with the South Eastern Railway Company with respect to the pier at Hungerford, and to an arrangement with the Metropolitan District Railway Company, and for amending some of the provisions of the Acts relating to the embankment on the south side of the Thames; and for other purposes.

An Act for supplying with water Ruthin and places adjacent, in the county of Denbigh.
