

Ellingham, in the parish of Ellingham, in the county of Norfolk, Esquire, eldest son and heir of William Colegrave (formerly William Manby), late of Cann Hall and Little Ellingham aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, Her Royal licence and authority that he and his issue may, in compliance with a proviso contained in the last will and testament of William Colegrave, sometime of Cann Hall aforesaid, Esquire, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Colegrave only instead of that of Manby, and that he and they may bear the arms of Colegrave; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's said College of Arms.

The Queen has been pleased to grant unto Thomas Weeding Baggallay, of Upper Tooting, in the county of Surrey, Esquire, the eldest son of John Baggallay, of the same place, Esquire, and Emma his wife, Her Royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of Thomas Weeding, late of Mecklenburgh-square, in the county of Middlesex, and of Malden, in the said county of Surrey, Esquire, deceased, take and thenceforth use the surname of Weeding only:

And to command that the said Royal concession and declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none effect.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords authorized by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by Her Majesty, for declaring Her Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to make provision in the case of boroughs ceasing to return members to serve in Parliament, respecting rights of election which have been vested in persons entitled to vote for such members.

An Act to amend the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her Majesty, chapter fifty, by abolishing the rate imposed by the said Act on all occupiers of premises within the extended municipal boundaries of the city of Edinburgh.

An Act for extending the provisions of the Thames embankment and Metropolis Improvement (Loans) Act, 1864, and for amending the powers of the Metropolitan Board of Works in relation to loans under that Act.

An Act for facilitating the acquisition and enjoyment of sites for buildings for religious, educa-

tional, literary, scientific, and other charitable purposes.

An Act to amend "The Consecration of Churchyards Act, 1867."

An Act to carry into effect a convention between Her Majesty and the Emperor of the French concerning the fisheries in the seas adjoining the British Islands and France, and to amend the laws relating to British sea fisheries.

An Act to amend the Act for punishing idle and disorderly persons, and rogues and vagabonds, so far as relates to the use of instruments for gaming.

An Act to render judgments or decreets obtained in certain Courts in England, Scotland, and Ireland respectively effectual in any other part of the United Kingdom.

An Act to amend the law relating to fairs in England and Wales.

An Act to amend the representation of the people in Ireland.

An Act to provide for the collection by means of stamps of fees payable in the supreme and inferior courts of Law in Scotland, and in the Offices belonging thereto; and for other purposes relative thereto.

An Act to settle and describe the limits of certain boroughs and the divisions of certain counties in England and Wales, in so far as respects the election of members to serve in Parliament.

An Act for the amendment of the representation of the people in Scotland.

An Act to amend the Act twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth Victoria, chapter sixty-six, for the safe keeping of petroleum.

An Act to amend the Acts for the administration of prisons in Scotland, in so far as regards the county of Lanark; and for other purposes.

An Act to make provision for the appointment of Members of the Legislative Council of New Zealand, and to remove doubts in respect of past appointments.

An Act to authorize the inclosure of certain lands, in pursuance of a special report of the Inclosure Commissioners for England and Wales.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order under "The Drainage Act, 1861."

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under "The Local Government Act, 1858," relating to the districts of Southampton, Bradford, Whitechurch and Dodington, Royton, Kendal, and Sunderland.

An Act to confirm a certain Provisional Order under "The Local Government Act, 1858," relating to the district of Tormoham (Devonshire).

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders under "The Local Government Act, 1858," relating to the districts of Malvern, Cowpen, Bristol, Sheffield, Margate, Bognor, and Otley; and for other purposes relative to certain districts under the said Act.

An Act to amend "The Metropolis Gas Act, 1860," and to make further provision for regulating the supply of gas to the city of London; and for other purposes connected therewith.

An Act to continue in force an Act of the second year of King George the Second, chapter nineteen, for the better regulation of the oyster fishery in the River Medway.

An Act to enable the Local Board of Health in and for the district of the borough of Reading to acquire the undertaking of the Reading Waterworks Company; and for other purposes.

An Act for authorizing the Morley Gas Company to raise further moneys; and for other purposes.
