AT the Annual Meeting of the North-Western Association of Baptist Churches, held at the Baptist Chapel, Waterbarn, Stacksteads, near Manchester, on Thursday, July 2nd, 1868, it was unanimously resolved :—

“ That this Association desires to express its deep sympathy with Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen, in the recent diabolical attempt on the life of her beloved son, His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, and its heartfelt thanksgivings to Almighty God for the merciful preservation of His Royal Highness from the hand of the assassin, and for his safe return to this country.

**T**HE Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Guatemala, a Decree of the President

of Honduras, of which the following is a translation :—

(Translation).

The President of the Republic of Honduras to the Inhabitants.

**KNOW** all that the Supreme Congress of the Republic, desirous of encouraging immigration to Roatan, and promoting the progress of the same Island, which is the most important one in the Bay :—

Decrees—

**ART. 1.** The Port of Coxim Hall in Roatan is declared free ; and this port shall for the future be called the Port of Medina.

**ART. 2.** Vessels, both native and foreign, that anchor in the said port, shall pay no other duty than the following :—Ships that do not measure more than 100 tons one dollar ; those which are more than 100, but do not exceed 200, two dollars ; and those which have more than 200, three dollars.

**ART. 3.** In the same port the entrance and exit of merchandize of every kind shall not occasion any impost, but merchandize consumed in the place shall pay a very moderate one for the support of the local Government, in conformity with the order that will be issued by the Supreme Executive Power, after having first consulted the local authorities of the Island.

Given in Comayagua, in the Sessions Hall of Congress, &c., &c.,  
Wherefore be it carried into effect.

The percussion caps, upon their entry into French territory, must be accompanied by an “*acquittà-caution*,” the certificate of discharge for which will be provided by the Municipal Authorities at the place of abode of the person to whom they are addressed.

(NEW ARRANGEMENT.)

Art. 2.—The differential dues established by the law of the 15th June, 1861, upon grain and flour imported in foreign ships, are and remain suppressed.

ARRANGEMENT RELATIVE TO THE COLONIES.—SAINT LOUIS (SENEGAL), AND ISLAND OF GORÉE.

Art. 3.—Merchandise of every description, and from every quarter, can be imported under any flag into Saint Louis (Senegal), and into the Island of Gorée. All differential duties upon the flag have been abolished.

Produce taken on board in the harbours of Saint Louis and of Gorée, can be exported in any direction and under any flag.

Produce thus taken on board foreign vessels is subject, on its importation into France, to a differential duty upon the flag of 20 francs per ton of the freight.

## FRENCH GUIANA.

Art. 4.—The harbour of Cayenne is opened to all ships, French or foreign. Merchandise and articles of every description and from every quarter, will have to pay, upon their importation into Cayenne in foreign ships, besides the customs duty, a differential tax upon the flag regulated as follows, per ton of freight:—

Produce coming from European countries, Non-European countries situated upon the Mediterranean, and countries situated upon the Atlantic Ocean, comprising	
Cape Town and its territory....	10 frs.
Coming from elsewhere ...	20 frs.

The produce and manufactures of Cayenne as well as those which have been imported thither, can be exported under any flag and in any direction.

Notwithstanding, when the transport has been effected under a foreign flag, a tax will be levied, per ton of freight:—

Upon produce imported into France, Algeria, Martinique, and Guadeloupe ...	10 frs.
Upon produce imported into the Island of Reunion ...	20 frs.
