THE following Address of congratulation to the Queen, in reference to the atrocious attempt upon the life of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, having been transmitted to the Right Honourable Gathorne Hardy, Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, for presentation, has accordingly been presented by him to Her Majesty, who has been pleased to receive the same very graciously:—

To Her Most Gracious Majesty the QUEEN. —

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, your Majesty's loyal subjects, the Graduates of the University of London, in convocation assembled, desire to express to your Majesty our regret that the rejoicings on the first visit of one of your Majesty's Family to the Australian Colonies should have been disturbed by a crime so atrocious as the attempt on the life of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh, and to congratulate your Majesty that his Royal Highness escaped the peril to which he was exposed, we rejoice that the result of this unhappy event has been that the feeling of loyalty to your Majesty's Person and your Majesty's Family, which is one of the principal links uniting the Colonies to the mother country, has been strengthened; and that your Majesty will feel that your own anxiety and His Royal Highness's sufferings are in some measure compensated by the good that has in this case sprung from evil.

This expression of our feelings, we are glad to know, will reach your Majesty, when it will be associated rather with His Royal Highness's safe return, than with dangers and anxieties that have happily passed away.
