

the following translation of a Decree of the Royal Swedish Government, prohibiting the importation of certain domestic animals from particular countries into Norway; viz.:—

We, Charles, by the grace of God, King of Norway and Sweden, the Goths and Vandals maketh known:—

In virtue of the Law established in consequence of the noxious and contagious epidemic among domestic cattle, of the 27th February, 1866, § 8, it is determined hereby that this import prohibition shall supersede the placard of the 13th January last.

1. It shall be prohibited to import from the Austrian ports, and all Russian ports, with the exception of those of the Arctic Ocean, as well harbours in the White Sea as along the coast of Finland:—

a. Horned cattle (large cattle), sheep, goats, and other ruminating animals, as well as pigs.

b. Raw parts of these animals, such as raw skins and hides (dried and salted included), unprepared hair, bristles, wool, horn, hoofs, and bone, unsalted or unprepared meat and pork, and unmelted tallow.

c. Forage; such as grass, hay, and straw.

d. Cowhouse implements that have been used.

2. It shall also be prohibited from German ports in North or East Sea, as well as from Great Britain, Ireland, Holland, and Belgium, live horned cattle, sheep, and goats.

Hereafter all concerned must conform.
