LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1868.

GILDERSOME (TOWNSHIP).—ORDER DECLARING THE VOTE OF ADOPTION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1858, BY GILDERSOME (TOWNSHIP, W.R. YORKSHIRE), INVALID.

WHEREAS a petition has been duly presented, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1858, to me, as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, such petition being signed by owners and ratepayers resident within the boundaries of the township of Gildersome, in the West Riding of the county of York, appealing against the vote by which the said Act was adopted, on the 22nd day of July, 1868, on the ground that such adoption was not valid: And whereas I have considered the matter in question: Now, therefore, I do hereby, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the said Local Government Act, declare the said vote of adoption to be invalid, on the ground that certain of the votes on the subject of such adoption were irregularly sent and delivered, as set forth in such appeal, and not in accordance with the provisions of the Act; and such vote of adoption is hereby declared invalid accordingly.

(No. 75).—FRANCE—NORTH COAST.

Fixed Lights at Carentan.

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of August, 1868, the following lights would be exhibited as a guide through the channel of Carentan.

1. LOWER LIGHT, on the Sea Bank, is a *fixed red* light, elevated 16 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The light is placed on a wooden scaffold, 13 feet high, close to the original bank of Brevand, in lat. 42° 20' 39" N., long. 1° 11' 18" West from Greenwich.

2. UPPER LIGHT, at Brevand, is a *fixed white* light, elevated 49 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The light is exhibited from a wooden scaffold, 38 feet high, placed above the hamlet of the port, and bears S.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 940 yards from the lower light.

Alteration of Position of Light at Caudebec.

Also, that from the 1st day of August, 1868, the following alteration in the position of the light at Caudebec, in the river Scinc, would take place, viz.:

The light, which is one mile above the port of Caudebec, would be moved further up on the

same bank of the river, to the entrance of the valley of Caudebec.

The light is a *fixed* white light, elevated 20 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 6 miles.

The tower is 22 feet high, and is in lat. 49° 31' 16" N., long 0° 45' 9" East from Greenwich.

Light at Portrieux.

Also, that the light at the entrance of Portrieux, Baie de Saint Brieuc, which was exhibited from a wooden scaffold, is now exhibited from a small tower at the head of the jetty.

The light is a *fixed red* light (as before), elevated 34 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 7 miles.

The tower is white, 33 feet high; position, lat. 48° 38' 50" N., long. 2° 49' 31" W.

WEST COAST.

Fixed Red Light at Saint Jean De Luz.

Also, that from the 15th day of August, 1868, a light will be exhibited from a lamp-post at the extremity of the jetty of Ciboure, at the mouth of the Nivelle, St. Jean de Luz Bay.

The light is a *fixed red* light, elevated 18 feet above high water, and can be seen one mile.

Position, lat. 43° 23' 17" N., long. 2° 0' 20" West from Greenwich.

(No. 76.)—MEDITERRANEAN—ALGERIA.

Revolving Light on Cape Falcon.

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 15th day of August, 1868, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently constructed on Cape Falcon, Algeria, North Coast of Africa.

The light is a *revolving* white light, showing its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 340 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 25 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the first order.

The position of the tower, as given, is in lat. 35° 46' 53" N., long. 0° 46' 49" West, from Greenwich.

Alteration in Mers el Kebir Light.

Also, that from the same date, the revolving light now exhibited at Mers el Kebir will be replaced by a *fixed* white light, which in clear weather should be seen 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses, of the fourth order.

Fixed Light in Nemours Bay.

Also, that from the 1st of August, 1868, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse recently constructed on the point, west of Nemours Bay, Algeria.

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 305 feet above the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 8 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses.

The position of the tower, as given, is in lat. 35° 6' 57" N., long. 1° 50' 43" West, from Greenwich.

From the same date the light now exhibited East of Nemours Bay, will be discontinued.

BLACK SEA.

Beacons and Lights at Poti.

The Russian Government has given notice, that two beacons (each formed of two poles with a white rectangular top), have been placed to mark the channel of the bar at the entrance of the south branch of the River Rion.

At night a *fixed red* light is exhibited from the outer beacon, elevated 10 feet above the level of the sea, and a *fixed* white light from the inner beacon, elevated 17 feet above the sea.

The depth of water in the channel is 6½ feet.

Flashing Light on les Roches Douvres.

THE French Government has given notice, that about the end of the year 1868, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse now building on the Plateau des Roches Douvres, North Coast of France.

The light will be a *flashing* white light, elevated 60 feet above the high water level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 25 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses.

The tower is iron, painted white, and its position is in lat. 49° 6' 28" N., long. 2° 48' 54" West from Greenwich.

Beacon on Astan Rock.

The lower part, to a little above high water spring tides, is of masonry, above the masonry the the beacon is 7 feet high.

Sunken Rocks in Quiberon Bay.

1st. Roche de la Souris. This rock has 25 feet on it at low water with 33 to 36 feet around. It lies S.S.W. 2¼ miles from Kerbeann point, and is near the anchorage for vessels in the bay.

- 2nd. Roche Karek-Pellan has two feet water on it at low water; it lies 600 yards S.E. from the Roche de la Souris.
- 3rd. Basse Révision. This rock is nearly awash at low water, and from Les Beufs Rock bears West distant 580 yards.
- 4th. La Roche Kercoriédo is a small rock 720 yards S.S.W. from Petit Mount.
