(No. 82.)—BALTIC SEA ENTRANCES—GREAT BELT.

*Alteration in Sprögo Light.*

THE Danish Government has given notice, that from the 1st day of September, 1868, a new light will take the place of the temporary one now exhibited on Sprögo Island.

The light will be a *revolving* white light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every *two minutes*; it is elevated 134 feet above the level of the sea, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors of the third order.

The tower, which is on the highest part of the island, is round, 43 feet high, painted yellow and red in horizontal bands; the keeper's dwelling is attached on the southern side, and the whole is built of brick.

The position is as before, viz., lat. 55° 19' 51" N., long. 10° 58' 25" East from Greenwich.

(No. 83.)—FRANCE—WEST COAST.

*Fixed Light at Entrance of Adour River.*

THE French Government has given notice, that from the 15th day of August, 1868, the light at the entrance of the Adour River would be removed to the signal tower recently constructed close to the south jetty. (The old tower is 330 yards to the east of the signal tower.)

The light is a *fixed* white light when the passage is considered practicable, and a *fixed red* light when the state of the sea will not permit vessels to enter by night. The light is elevated 56 feet above high water, and 45 feet above the jetty, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of seven miles.

When the white light is shown and the distance practicable, two *green* lights will be exhibited, which, kept in line, will lead in the direction of the channel between the jetties.

The position of the tower, as given, is in lat. 43° 31' 46" N., long. 1° 31' 23" West of Greenwich.

*New Lights at Brest.*

Also, that from the 15th day of September, 1868, the following lights will be exhibited at the entrance of Port Napoleon, Brest:—

Two *fixed red* lights will be exhibited from towers on the jetties at the western entrance of the Port; the light on the south jetty is elevated 33 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of seven miles. From the light tower a fog bell will be sounded in foggy weather.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The towers are iron, painted white, and are in lat 48° 22½' N., long. 4° 29¼' West of Greenwich.

*Flashing Light on Pointe des Poulains, Belle Ile.*

Also, that from the 15th day of September, a light will be exhibited from a lighthouse recently

constructed on Pointe des Poulains, North point of Belle Ile.

The light is a *flashing* white light, showing the light and eclipse alternately for five seconds, elevated 112 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of fourteen miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the third order.

The tower is built of stone, painted white, and 47 feet high. Position, lat. 47° 23' 20" N., long. 3° 15' 12" West of Greenwich.

This light, when in line with that of Belle Ile (which revolves every minute), leads about three-quarters of a mile to the eastward of the Plateau des Birvideaux.
