**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third and fourth years of the reign of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled "An Act for the appointment of convenient places for the holding of assizes in England and Wales," it was declared and enacted that His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Most Honourable Privy Council, should have power from time to time to order and direct at what place or places in any county in England or Wales the assizes and sessions under the commissions of gaol delivery and other commissions for the dispatch of civil and criminal business shall be holden:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, doth hereby, under and in pursuance of the said Act, order and direct that the Assizes and Sessions under the Commissions of Gaol Delivery and other Commissions for the dispatch of civil and criminal business which shall be holden in and for the county of Berks next after the date of this Order, shall be held at Reading, in the said county, and not at Abingdon or at any other place within the said county.

And the Right Honourable the Lord Chancellor of Great Britain is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of

Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council, a representation, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church called Christ-church, situate at Appleton-le-Moors, in the parish of Lastingham, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church called Christ-church, situate at Appleton-le-Moors as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honorable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Lastingham, which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church called Christ-church, situate at Appleton-le-Moors as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Christ-church, Appleton-le-Moors.'

"And, with the like consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Appleton-le-Moors, being:—

"All that part of the parish of Lastingham, in the county of York, and in the diocese of York, which is comprised within, and is co-extensive with, the main portion of the township of Appleton-le-Moors, and within and with the contiguous territory constituting that portion of Spaunton Moor which is called Appleton Common, the whole of which said part of the parish of Lastingham aforesaid is bounded on the north by the township of Spaunton, in the same parish; on the east by the parish of Middleton, in the county

nd diocese aforesaid; on the south by the parish of Sinnington, in the said county and diocese; and on the west partly by the parish of Kirby Moorside, in the same county and diocese, and partly by an imaginary line, commencing at a boundary stone, inscribed 'A. le M. Ch. Ch. D. C. 1868, No. 1,' and placed upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Kirby Moorside from the parish of Lastingham aforesaid, on the southern side of Green-lane, at its north-eastern end, and extending thence in a direction nearly due north-eastward, and in a straight line for a distance of fourteen chains (crossing Cater Beck) to a boundary stone, inscribed 'A. le M. Ch. Ch. D. C. 1868, No. 2,' and placed at the western angle of the close numbered 127 upon the Tithe Commutation Map of the said township of Spaunton, and upon the map hereunto annexed upon the boundary of the said township of Spaunton, which forms the northern boundary of the herein described part of the parish of Lastingham as aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the sixth day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-seven; of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared, and now humbly lay before your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes out of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, in the county of Durham, and in the diocese of Durham, and out of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, in the same county and diocese.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, and of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, which are herein after mentioned and described (such portions not at present containing within their limits any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of divine worship), should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein-mentioned Acts, or of some of them, and we have, in respect of such hereditaments and premises, agreed to make and pay, out of the common fund created by the firstly herein-mentioned Act, to the incumbent of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-mentioned Act, and to his successors, a grant of two hundred pounds per annum, and also a further grant of one hundred pounds per annum so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district, and shall have been approved by us, and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district.

"And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be made by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our common seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of the said diocese of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that all that portion of the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, and also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, and which are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, become and be constituted a separate district, for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Darlington.'

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Paul, Darlington, being:—

"All that portion of the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, in the county of Durham and in the diocese of Durham, wherein the present incumbent of such parish or parochial chapelry now possesses the exclusive cure of souls, and also all that contiguous portion of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, in the said county and diocese, which are comprised within, and are bounded by an imaginary line, commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish or parochial chapelry from the said

new parish, at Northgate Bridge, where the turnpike road leading from Darlington to Durham crosses Cocker Beck, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said beck to its junction with the River Skerne, which forms the boundary dividing the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, from the new parish of Saint John, Darlington, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and extending thence generally north-eastward along the last-described boundary (thereby following the course of the River Skerne aforesaid) to the junction of the same boundary with the boundary dividing the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, from the parish of Haughton-le-Skerne, in the county and diocese aforesaid; and extending thence north-westward along the last-described boundary (leaving the said River Skerne) to the boundary dividing the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, from the parish of Haughton-le-Skerne aforesaid; and extending thence, first north-eastward, then north-westward, and then south-westward, along the last-described boundary, as far as a point in the middle of the line of the Stockton and Darlington Railway; and extending thence, southward, for a distance of thirty-two chains, or thereabouts, along the middle of the said line of railway, to a point in the centre of the bridge, which carries the same line of railway over Honey-pot-lane; and extending thence, south-westward, along the middle of said lane, to its junction, with Bell-lane, at a point opposite to the northern end of the line of fences which divides the two closes numbered respectively 346 and 347, upon the tithe commutation map of the township of Cockerton, in the said parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington, and upon the map hereunto annexed, from the two closes numbered respectively 344 and 343, upon the same maps; and extending thence, southward to and along the middle of the said line of fences, for a distance of fourteen chains, or thereabouts, to the southern end of the said line of fences, at Cocker Beck aforesaid; and extending thence, generally eastward, for a distance of a mile or thereabouts, along the middle of the same beck, to the first-described point, at Northgate Bridge aforesaid, upon the boundary dividing the said new parish of the Holy Trinity, Darlington, from the parish or parochial chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Darlington aforesaid, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas a draft of the said scheme has, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the parish or parochial chapelry and of the new parish, out of which it is intended that the district therein recommended to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Durham.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-nine; of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her Majesty, chapter eighty-four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of March, in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, in the words and figures following; that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen; of the Act of the fourth and fifth years of your Majesty, chapter thirty-nine; of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of your Majesty, chapter eighty-four; and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before your Majesty, in Council, the following scheme for making better provision for the cure of souls, in the new parish of Crakehall, in the county of York, and in the diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas the said new parish of Crakehall is situate within the limits of the ancient parish of Bedale, in the said county of York and diocese of Ripon, and is in the patronage of the rector for the time being of the said parish of Bedale.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said new parish of Crakehall is ill-endowed, and that it is desirable that some additional provision for the cure of souls within the limits of the said new parish, should be made in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the rectory of the said parish of Bedale, is richly endowed and is in the alternate patronage of Henry, Baron Beaumont, an infant, and of Henry Monson de la Poer Beresford Peirse, Esquire, also an infant.

"And whereas Isabella Anne, Baroness Beaumont, Widow, and Robert Higginson Borrowes, of Giltown, in the county of Kildare, in Ireland, Esquire, the guardians acting on behalf of the said Henry Baron Beaumont and Henrietta Anne Theodosia Beresford Peirse, Widow, and the Reverend John George Beresford, Clerk, the guardians acting on behalf of the said Henry Monson de la Poer Beresford Peirse, Esquire, have expressed to us a desire that the arrangements for augmenting the income of the said new parish out of the revenues of the said rectory of Bedale, which are hereinafter recommended and proposed by us to your Majesty in Council, should be effected, and that in order to meet the requirements on that behalf which are contained in the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act, the right of presentation to the said new parish of Crakehall should be transferred to the patrons of the said rectory of Bedale, to the intent that the said rectory and new parish may be in the same patronage.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises, situate within the said new parish of Crakehall, have become vested in us under and

subject to the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts.

"And whereas the arrangements hereinafter recommended and proposed by us have been entered into upon the understanding that we would undertake and agree to pay out of the common fund, created by the hereinbefore firstly mentioned Act to the perpetual curate or incumbent for the time being of the said new parish of Crakehall until the next avoidance of the said rectory of Bedale, an annual sum or stipend of one hundred and ninety-eight pounds.

"And whereas such annual sum or stipend will, as soon as conveniently may be after the ratification of this scheme, be granted and secured by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal, and to be published in the London Gazette, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of your Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven.

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend Robert, Bishop of the said diocese of Ripon, and of the said Isabella Anne, Baroness Beaumont, and of the said Robert Higginson Borrowes, acting on behalf of the said Henry, Baron Beaumont, and also with the consent of the said Henrietta Anne Theodosia Beresford Peirse and of the Reverend John George Beresford, acting on behalf of the said Henry Monson de la Poer Beresford Peirse, of the same Reverend John George Beresford, as rector of the said parish of Bedale, and as such, patron of the said new parish of Crakehall, and of the Reverend Thomas Milville Raven, Clerk, the perpetual curate or incumbent of the said new parish of Crakehall (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this scheme), we humbly recommend and propose, that upon and from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such Order, the whole right of patronage of the said new parish of Crakehall, and of the nomination of the perpetual curate or incumbent thereof, and to the church thereof, shall be transferred to and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be alternately exercised by, the said Henry, Baron Beaumont, and the said Henry Monson de la Poer Beresford Peirse, and their respective heirs and assigns, for ever, in a manner and order similar to that in which the patronage of the said rectory of Bedale is now exercisable by them.

"And we further recommend and propose, that upon and from the avoidance of the said rectory of Bedale which may happen next after the date of any Order of your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, the tithes or rent-charges in lieu of tithes which are particularly described in the schedule hereunto annexed, and which now form part of the endowments of the said rectory of Bedale, shall be transferred to and become absolutely vested in the perpetual curate or incumbent of the said new parish of Crakehall and his successors perpetual curates of the said new parish, in lieu of and in full substitution for and discharge of the annual sum or stipend of one hundred pounds now payable to the perpetual curacy of the said new parish out of the rectorial revenues of the said parish of Bedale.

"And we further recommend and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

Brighton, Insurance Agent; John Torr, of Carlett Park, Eastham, Cotton Broker; Christopher Bushell, of Hinderton, near Neston, Wine Merchant; Carruthers Charles Johnstone, of Higher Bebbington Hall, Merchant (all in the said county of Chester); and the incumbent for the time being of the perpetual curacy of the said district chapelry of Saint Mary, Kirkdale, as such incumbent, in whom, as trustees, it is provided that such right of presentation and appointment as last aforesaid should be vested under and according to the provisions of a certain deed or articles of agreement, bearing date the thirteenth day of May of the present year, made or expressed to be made in pursuance of the before mentioned Act of the eighth and ninth years of your Majesty, chapter seventy, in which said deed or articles of agreement are contained provisions for appointing as occasion may from time to time require a trustee or trustees in the room of the said Charles Groves, John Torr, Christopher Bushell, and Carruthers Charles Johnstone, or either of them.

"And, with the like consent of the said Charles John, Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol (testified as aforesaid), we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at such church, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns, and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us, the said Commissioners, to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.
